USS GRAVELY nears the end of its regularly scheduled deployment with proud memories of having supported multiple operations with Allies and partners in the Baltic region.

Since entering the Baltic Sea in April, USS GRAVELY was attached to CTF 61/2. KEARSARGE Amphibious Ready Group (KSGARG). While assigned to CTF 61/2, USS GRAVELY played a pivotal role in defense of the force during Exercise Hedgehog 22 (HH22). HH22, also known as "Siil", Estonian for Hedgehog, is an Estonia national exercise aimed at evaluating and controlling the mobilization of Estonian Defense Forces (EDF) Reserve units. The exercise was designed to train battalion level and smaller command and control of amphibious operations. These types of exercise are fundamental to enhance Allied interoperability in the Baltic region with a focus on defensive maneuvers.

After the conclusion of HH22, **GRAVELY** entered Helsinki, Finland with USS GUNSTON HALL. While in port, USS GRAVELY, along with USS GUNSTON HALL, hosted a distinguished visitor event for the American Ambassador to Finland and a Congressional Delegation (CODEL) alongside Finnish military leadership. The **GRAVELY** Wardroom was also invited to "the world's largest Sauna" with members of the Finnish, German, and French navies. "Being able to be a part of the relationship building aspect of this port visit is something I will never forget," says Ensign Abbott. Abbott added, "I was able to learn so much about our European counterparts and gain an insight into how their Navy plays a crucial role in strategic defense."

After leaving Helsinki, Finland, **GRAVELY** was once again tapped to host a distinguished visitor event in Gdynia, Poland. Sailors aboard **GRAVELY** had the honor of hosting the US Ambassador to Poland, Ambassador Mark Brzezinski, and many high-ranking Polish military members while also showcasing the world's finest warship. "This event was amazing.

Report from Tom Hassell, Liaison Vaughan F. Dize, Assistant Liaison

Greetings from USCGC NORTHLAND! Since our last update, Northland has been on guard in the Eastern Pacific Ocean, conducting counterdrug operations in support of Joint Interagency Task Force South (JIATF-S) and USCG District 11. In addition to our permanently assigned crewmembers, the ship currently has a special detachment on board from USCG Tactical Law Enforcement Team South (TACLET) who possess specialized skills to assist in counternarcotics patrols and interdictions. In conjunction with our shipmates from HITRON and TACLET, NORTHLAND successfully interdicted a drug smuggling vessel containing nearly 1,800 kg of illegal narcotics.

Drug interdiction may be the primary mission of **NORTHLAND's** current deployment, however this patrol has provided the ship and crew several opportunities for once in a lifetime experiences. We ended our last letter with the indication that the ship had steamed across the Equator and into the Southern Hemisphere. Shortly after "crossing the line," **NORTHLAND** arrived in San Cristobal, Galapagos, Ecuador to conduct an Exercise Contingent to Operations (ECTO) with the Ecuadorian Navy and Coast Guard. This was a first for NORTHLAND, and only the second time that a USCG vessel has been allowed to anchor in the vicinity of the Galapagos. The event was an important step in strengthening US-Ecuador strategic relations, and was attended by the US Consul General to Ecuador, as well as the President of the Galapagos province. The ECTO included a joint patrol with the LAE Isla San Cristobal (LG-30) patrol boat, joint small boat tactics and training, tours of NORTHLAND and the Isla San Cristobal, a joint leadership lunch, and a discussion on tactics and procedures for combatting illegal narcotics smuggling and illegal, unreported, and unregulated fishing in the Galapagos region.

The event culminated with a friendly tug-of-war and soccer match between the Ecuadorian Navy members and crewmembers from **NORTHLAND**. We are proud to report that **NORTH-LAND** was victorious in tug-of-war (unfortunately, the official score card from the soccer match was misplaced...). After the events, **NORTH-LAND** crewmembers explored the island, swam with sea lions and sea turtles, and enjoyed authentic Galapagos cuisine. The joint operation was a tremendous opportunity to build international cooperative relationships, share knowledge and best practices, and of course have a little fun.

Following the ECTO, NORTHLAND set sail and returned to our normal patrol operations. While maintaining a presence in known drug trafficking regions, the crew formally welcomed our 30 pollywog shipmates into the Realm of Neptunus Rex. Following in the footsteps of naval tradition, NORTHLAND's Shellback Ceremony consisted of maritime history, skits, and team building exercises. We are proud to report that all NORTHLAND sailors are now Honorable Shellbacks. As we near the end of our patrol, the crew is excited to return home to family and loved ones to share sea stories and experiences from a successful deployment. Until then, NORTHLAND will continue the hunt for targets of interest and deter illicit activity in the maritime realm. As always, thank you for the support! Fair winds and following seas!
