As far as I know everyone seems to be doing ok. Thank god.



Spring Cruise

Even though the sun forgot to show up, 17 baby birds, a Mustang and a GTO showed for the Spring Cruise. Starting from Delizia's we traveled the back roads (and Rte 23) for a leisurely 40 mile cruise to Space Farms in Beemerville (for those who have never heard of Space Farms, it is not a farm full of space ships - it is a zoo and museum owned by a family named "Space") We were greeted by the granddaughter (3rd generation) of the founder. Inside, Mr. Space (2nd generation) told me the farm was started in 1927 and that the 4th generation is now involved in the business.

In addition to the various animals (bears, buffalo, deer, llamas, lions, tigers, jaguars, birds, monkeys etc. the farm has several museum buildings. One houses automobiles dating back to the early 1900's. Another area was filled with horse drawn carriages (including a buckboard once owned and used by Teddy Roosevelt). There are numerous bicycles and antique motorbikes. Other buildings held antique tractors, antique toys (including a tiny carousel that didn't look big enough for actual use, but it was noted that children used to be smaller. It was also noted that George Washington's first job, as a young boy, was transporting these carousels from town to town.

After a couple of hours of enjoying the animals and antiques, we hit the road for lunch. Back in the cars and another 10 miles later we were at the Lamp Post Inn in Vernon. Sal, the owner arranged a wonderful buffet for us. Dessert was a warm apple crisp topped with ice cream and whipped cream. (As we were "researching" the restaurant, Charlie and I ate there a couple of times and I can recommend the shrimp stuffed chicken and fillet mignon with the cheese chive sauce.)

Each couple was given a butterfly candleholder and lottery ticket. Diane Szura was the luckiest and won \$50.
