



Religious Education Connection

The RCIA--The Rite of Acceptance

Today, we celebrate the Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens (Rite of Acceptance). This is the first of the Rites of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), and the first public ritual. It is a time of a change of identity. The inquirers are no longer simply, inquirers, but now they are officially welcomed by the Church as disciples of the household of faith, catechumens, seeking to become full members of the Catholic Church through Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. This is also the first time we publicly welcome those candidates, who are already one with us in baptism through another faith tradition, but who are seeking to become full members of the Catholic Church through all invited to express their requests and are given welcome and encouragement, especially by their Sponsors and by the whole assembly.

Then the Sponsors offer their catechumen or candidate a Bible. Many catechumens and candidates already have Bibles. This is not the passing on of a book, which may or may not have already been read, but it is the embrace of a way of life patterned on the Good News. It is, also, another sign from their Sponsors that they are not taking this journey alone. Their Sponsors walk with them, just as we can walk together with our Sponsors.

Then the catechumens and candidates are literally marked with the cross of Christ on their foreheads and senses.

Lastly, the entire assembly is asked to pray for the catechumens and candidates, and to continue to pray for them throughout the year as they journey together, along with the rest of us, to the Easter Vigil, when they will become full members and we can all join, as one voice, in the Alleluias of the Resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ, and all meet at the one table of Christ's Sacrificial Meal.






