

By Laws Of The Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc.

ARTICLE VII

Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers in the saving grace of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ who have accepted Him as their personal Savior. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. The common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows.

Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Creation and Formation.

Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation. Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Savior, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.

Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body, A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by the speaking in other languages.

Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Washing of Feet.

Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers.

Do not condone divorce and remarriage, Matt. 19:8-9.

Destruction of the Wicked.

Conditional Immortality.

Rapture of the Man Child Class.

Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly.

A ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These doctrines shall be adhered to in the teaching of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teaching approved by the Board from time to time if they are not in consistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

Greetings from the Superintendent

We are planning to host a Sunday School Workshop for the entire movement on November 13, an all day affair with guest speakers. We are planning to train student VBS teams to work in our churches and student Youth Camp teams to help in our Youth Camps this coming summer. We are expecting God to supply all our needs according to his riches in glory. We are expecting God to provide us wisdom in dealing with His people, wisdom to manage His money, and wisdom to lead His school. Won't you please stand with me for the future of our school. Pray for us on a daily basis. We need each other to accomplish the task that has been laid at our feet with the resources provided us by our loving Father.

Church, Behave Thyself

II Timothy 3:15-"..that you mayest know how you oughtest to behave in the house of God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth."

(I had a wonderful opportunity to share this lesson at 1992 camp meeting in Laverne, Okla and the Lord has so burdened me with it that I would like to go into further detail.)

It seems there are BEHAVIOR PROB-LEMS in the Church-the 'called out' assembly of people that profess to be the Family of God. This writer (and the reader also) has observed people that have acted with conduct unbecoming to a Christian. (Who knows, 'they' might have been you and I!). The Bible has much to say concerning behavior. Often we think of children when speaking of behavior problems. But, then again, sometimes we act like little, undisciplined children. Christians are to be child like in faith, not childish.

Now sometimes we get very critical towards the ungodly actions and wrongful attitudes of those without the Lord, without the Church. We, as Christians should get a 'righteous indignation' toward sin, but be very careful about condemning the sinner. Unfortunately we seem to get very lenient concerning our wrongful actions and attitudes; ready to 'justify' our way of doing things. How can we as Christians expect to impact humanity and help society with it's problems if we can't overcome our own problems? To try to help others burdened and bound when we are weighted down with sin that so easily besets us, is useless.

A verse that has made a great impact on this writer is in Phil. 1:27 "Only let your conversation be as it becometh the Gospel of Christ." Also, "But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night; in the which the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up. Seeing then that all these things shall be dissolved, WHAT MANNER OF PERSON OUGHT YE TO BE ...? II Peter 3:10-11. If Matthew 12:35 is right "A good man out of the good treasure of the heart bringeth forth good things: and an evil man out of the evil treasure bringeth forth evil things," and Matthew 15"19 is right "For out of the heart proceed evil thoughts, murders adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, blasphemies:", then wouldn't one's outward actions be an extension of the inward attitudes? It's a shame when people can behave nicely outwardly, yet inwardly be full of bitterness, stubborness, etc. in the heart?

So, if there are these problems in the church, there are answers in His word concerning how we

SHOULD NOW LIVE. Titus 3:11 "For the grace of God that bringeth salvation, hath appeared to all men, TEACHING US that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteous ly, and godly IN THIS WORLD".

From the mountainous sermon in Matt. 5-7, Christ opened his mouth and TAUGHT them of the characteristics of those that belong to God. He taught them of the principles that all those that desire to follow Him must put into practice in their lives. If the entirety of the principles of this sermon on the mount were practically applied in the Christians life, it would result in great strength and closeness to God. He also taught them that each promise is preceeded by a requirement; for us not to expect much from God if we are not willing to do what He asks us to.

Continuing, let us consider the first few verses of the fifth chapter, considering the Beattitudes or attitudes that ought to be; not just a mental attitude, rather a heart felt knowledge. As Jesus began explaining who are the Blessed-Happy, those who would obtain spiritual prosperity- and why, the people would begin to listen intently. It's no secret today people are looking for true happiness often in the wrong places. When they don't find it. it's no wonder that many people become depressed, confused, and even suicidal. There are other verses in the Bible concerning who are Blessed: Psalm 1:1, 32:1, 40:4,41:1, 65:4, 89:15, 112:1, Isa. 32:20, Matt. 11:28, 12:37, 20:29, Jas. 1:12, Rev. 13:14, 19:9, 22:7.

Now, Christ spoke to His disciples-those that followed Him and to those who still strive to follow Him.

Blessed are the poor in spirit. Christ, of course, was not speaking of material poverty. He was speaking of having conscious need, realizing ones Spiritual poorness. In effect Happy are those people that realize and will acknowledge before God their spiritual weakness. This is where it all begins. Isa. 57:15 "For thus saith the high and lofty one that inhabiteth eternity, whose name in Holy; I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble, and to revive the heart of the contrite ones." In your service for God will you be willing to admit there are areas that need improvement? "Well, I'm satisfied with my life the way it is," you might say. Perhaps you are but the question is "Is God satisfied?' Church let us beware lest we become more like the Laodicean church than we already are. Their boast was "I have need of nothing". Without God, we are nothing of any lasting benefit but when God's people

shall humble themselves and pray and turn from their wicked way, then He will bear and heal our land. (II Chron. 7:14) The poor in spirit are Blessed because theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven. "What a day that will be when my Jesus I shall see, just to look upon His face the One who saved me by his grace. When he takes me by the hand and he leads me through the promised land, What a day, glorious day that will be." The kingdom-a realm or domain of power-will be ruled by the King of Kings. Rev. 1:6 "And Hath made us kings and priests unto God and his Father; to him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen." We shall reign with him as our king, and we as a holy nation. Let us strive to become poor that we may become rich.

No Need to Hurry from "Moments For you"

Robert Chester Beydler was born August 24, 1916 near Jerico Springs, Missouri. He was the eldest of six children of Martin and Rosa Morse Beydler. He departed this life from a heart attack on May 12, 1992 at the age of 75 years, 8 months and 17 days.

The years of his youth where spent on the farm with his parents and later went to work for his uncle in Wyoming where he took care of the sheep.

He spent two years in the Civil Conservation Corps in the Big Horn Mountains and from there he joined the United States Marine Corps and was stationed at the Ammunitation Depot where he was serving when Pearl Harbor was bombed; but they missed the Depot when they stopped the rail road truck just outside the fence.

Though he served in different places in the south west Pacific during his six years in service his home base remained at Pearl Harbor. He was at Guam on his way to Japan when the war ended, was discharged from the Marine Corps in November, 1945.

Robert and Dora Spencer were married June 2, 1946 at Wichita, Kansas and worked in Revival Meetings for several months and helped in a youth camp in Nebraska during that time.

They arrived in Honolulu December 31, 1947 to do Mission Work in some of the housing areas and to preach in the Federal Prison.

During this six years they adopted two

children. Carol Ann, 8 years and Richard Wayne, 10 months old.

After working in the area across from Pearl Harbor, a Sunday School was started there by starting with eight children, but the last Sunday there, 83 were in attendance.

After six years on Oahu Island of Hawaii, they returned to the States, (Hawaii was not yet a state) and pastored a while near Ringgold, Nebraska at a church which had grown from a Sunday School started many years earlier.

From there they went to Riverton and Hudson, Wyoming but eventually it became closer to their work among the Indians of the Shoshoni and Arapahoe tribes on the Wind River Reservation in moving to Hudson. They started and pastored the Community Apostolic Faith Church there, but after ten years felt their work there was finished, so moved to Missouri where Robert pastored a country church for a while near Poynor, Missouri.

The next Pastorate was at Ralls, Texas, where he pastored for 6 years. Dora's mother had become bed fast and required so much time, Robert worked at the University at Canyon and helped with smaller tasks in the Faith Chapel at the Out Reach there. They were there four years, then went to Amarillo. Dora's Mother passed away soon after and they went to work in the Apostolic Faith Bible College. There Robert served as Dean of Men for four years, then answered the call to pastor at Enid, Oklahoma, where Dora had a heart attack followed by a stroke. Robert could not care for her and do justice to pastoring also, so he retired from pastoring and they went to their home in Amarillo, Texas.

Robert helped in the local church there and taught the Adult Sunday School Class while caring for his wife.

He leaves to mourn his death, his two children, Carol Ann and her husband, Steve DuBry, with their five children, Steve, Tine, Warren, ReNee', and Chad; one son, Richard and his wife, Judy with their two children, Heather and Marc, plus many relatives and friends.

"All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness." II Tim. 3:16.

"For the prophecy came not in old time by the will of Man; but holy men of God spake as they were moved by the Holy Ghost." II Pet. 1:21.

Having been raised in a Christian home where Jesus Christ was made real to me through the godly example of my parents, I find no difficulty in believing and accepting the authenticity of the Scriptures.

It was in the year 1900 that the Rev. Charles F. Parham opened a Bible School in Topeka, Kan., in what was known as the "old Stone Mansion." A number of missionaries and Christians from various denominations, who were desirous to learn more about the supernatural power of God, were among the student body.

After an in-depth study of the Scriptures, the group agreed that the physical evidence of having received the Holy Spirit, was the phenomenon known as "speaking in tongues" as the Holy Spirit gives the utterance.

On New Year's Eve 1901, as the expectant crowd awaited the entrance of the new century, God did not disappoint the seekers. He kept his promise as recorded in Acts 2:38, 39: "Repent and be baptized, every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost. For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call."

Among those who received was a woman who spoke in the Chinese language for three days, also being able to write in the language. This was the beginning of a new era for the entire Christian world.

Before I was born, my father had received the experience of the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit with the accompanying sign, a God given language which he had never learned. Much of my early training was through the ministry of the teacher and prophet, the Rev. Charles F. Parham. I observed many miracles, signs and wonders, done in the name of Jesus. Jesus Christ, the same yesterday, and today, and forever." Heb. 13:8.

While attending a tent meeting on Signal Hill in Long beach, as a 14-year-old boy, I proceeded to start the car. As I gripped the crank, it kicked back, breaking both bones in my right arm. With excruciating pain, I rushed back into the tent. The elders offered prayer in my behalf. While I was praying in the spirit, both bones were set and completely and immediately healed. A Dr. Frenfrock, a medical doctor who saw my arm broken, verified my healing.

I would like to proclaim to every reader that "Jesus is alive." Without a doubt He is the son of God. He is at the right hand of God today. His love and compassion is extended to everyone who will receive him. The hurting, troubled, sick, afflicted or addicted, can find deliverance in Jesus Christ, who through his death and resurrection, has made it possible.

Our wonderful nation was founded on Biblical July, August, September principles. We are a nation under God. In God we trust. Our nation has been a strong, safe wonderful place to live and to raise our children. Let us keep it that way by strong leadership and godly standards of morality.

Others with school going children need money for fees and books. We would request our friends to consider these these needs and help.





Christiantity vs. New Age

Who is "Lord Maitreya"? Can you claim he's the antichrist? Would you say he's an ordinary man demonically possessed?

We do know he's alive . . . living somewhere . . . eating, sleeping, studying world conditions in order to appear at JUST THE RIGHT TIME! The ad spoken of in our last article gives us a little information on this man.

He claims to be a World Teacher for all humanity. Since July of 1977 he's been emerging as a spokesman for a group or community in a well-known country. He has extraordinary spiritual power (not from God). His location/identity is known to only a few. He will soon announce his identity and communicate to all humanity through a worldwide radio/TV program. He plans to build a new world.

Maitreya is supposed to be the 5th reincarnation of Buddha. But in order to appeal to Christians, they say he is Christ. To the Moslems they say Iman Mahdi; are told he's Krishna.

The ads in the Reader's Digest giving The Great Invocation were placed by Lucis Trust (formerly Lucifer Trust0. The Plan that is referred to in the Invocation states: "Let Light and Love and Power restore The Plan on Earth."

This plan calls for the installation of a New World"Messiah," the implementation of a new world government and new world religion under Maitreya.

Some of the political, social and economic goals are; universal credit card system; a world food authority which would control the world's food supply; a universal tax; a universal draft. They also intend to seek and find ALL people who believe the Bible and worship God. These will be forced to accept Maitreya or be exterminated. Since New Agers believe in reincarnation, they feel this helps these people to return and accept Maitreya.

New Agers claim this man to be the Master of Wisdom of whom Jesus and such other spiritual leaders as Mohammed, Brahma, etc. are disciples. Benjamin Creme says that while progress will be slow, the World needs and world resources will be reassessed and redistributed and the single global religion put in power.

The Club of Rome is another very prominent New Age organization which has drawn up blueprints for a new world order. In order for this to occur . . . for a world

takeover by the antichrist or Lord Maitreya ... people had to become open ... their channels needs to be opened to "religious experiences", so LSD was put into circulation. Those who tripped out on this often had encounters with the demon world. This often led to demon possession.

David Spangler, another New Age leader, state that there will be a vast planetary initiation, a mass initiation of people into the New Age. At that time they plan to give a mark or number during the ceremony. There is extensive usage of the numerals 666 within the Movement. New Agers consider 666 to be a sacred number. They feel by using these numbers frequently, they are sending signals to outer space to superior intelligences to come and bring a new advanced civilization.

But this WON'T happen until God says it's time. Scripture tells us that "even the very ELECT" would be deceived if possible. The New Agers are taking this very seriously.

"And he doeth great wonders, so that he maketh fire come down from heaven on earth in the sight of men. And deceiveth them that dwell on the earth by the means of those miracles which he had power to do in the sight of the beast;"

This Movement has laser beam projectors installed for use on top of the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, Episcopal, in New York City. These projectors are capable of being bounce onto telecommunication satellites. As the lasers bounce from the satellite back to earth, the light rays can be bent in such a manner as to appear that flames are coming from the sky.

With other technology they will be able to make it appear as if the image were speaking. From our own experiences almost daily we speak to computers that sound human.

According to the leaders of this group, they claim they have people in every city and institution in the world; in the UN, prominent scientific, legal and medical circles and even at the congressional and cabinet levels of the US government.

In the research that Constance Cumbey did, she found supposedly Christian books calling for a New World Order with an accompanying global food redistribution program . . . sided by "computers". One Baptist writer even told readers that Christians must champion this New World Order even if it meant imprisonment. Other books either openly advocated Eastern religions or stated that Christians had much in common with their essentials. These included New Age "Buzz" words as holistic, Spaceship Earth, Global Village, Celebration/celebrative, transformation, crowded

planet, paradigm, right brain/left brain/whole brain, matrix, linear thinking, dualistic, mechanistic, global thread, new vision, initiation, interdependent, etc.

"Let no man deceive you by any means; for THAT DAY SHALL NOT COME, except there come a falling away (apostasy) first, and that man of sin be revealed, the son of perdition." II Thess. 2:1-3.

"Who is a liar but he that denieth that Jesus is the Christ? He is antichrist that denieth the Father and The Son." I John 2:22.

"And every spirit that confesseth not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is not of God: and this is that spirit of antichrist, whereof ye have heard that it should come; and even now already is it in the world," I John 4:3.

Now we find in many "Christian" books signs of this apostasy . . . even in Fundamentalist publications besides the widespread infestation of mainline Protestant and Roman Catholic publications. Some of these state that we could worship God and call Him by names such as Buddha, Tao, Shiva, or other titles, But read this:

"I am the Lord: That is my name: and my glory will I not give to another, neither my praise to graven images." Isa. 42:8.

"Ye cannot drink the cup of the Lord, and the cup of devils: ye cannot be partakers of the Lord's table, and of the table of devils". I Cor. 10:21.

Marilyn Ferguson in THE AQUARIAN CONSPIR-ACY state that radical change is upon all of us. A leaderless but powerful network is working to bring about radical change in the US. These members have broken with certain key elements of Western thought (orthodox religion). Mystical experiences and experiential religion will be the new order of the time. Ferguson realizes that some religious groups see this as a threat to Judeo-Christian tradition.

Some of this change is brought about by staff workshops in human development for large corporations and companies. Some people on California were wise enough that they rebelled against attending such when given by a phone company. Some companies demand attendance or job loss. These are also being given in schools, armed services, etc.

Thou hast given a banner to them that fear Thee Psalms 60:4



Then what is your banner, and what are you doing with it? For if you are among them that fear God, He has given you a banner that it may be displayed.
