

Let's Talk Trash:

Some of you may be new to our neighborhood and not realize how our trash pickup works. So here's quick recap for everyone.

Our trash pickup is through VF Waste and the homeowner's association pays to have Back Door Trash Pickup twice a week - on Monday and Thursday mornings. Back Door Pickup means that you do not have to place your trash cans out by the sidewalk, instead the trash guys will come on to your property to pick up your trash. They will not go into your garage or inside of a structure, but if your trash cans are behind a wall that's easily accessible to them, or on the side of your house, or by your back door then they will pick up your trash where those containers are.

Thursday is heavy trash day. If you have grass clippings or other big debris, those will need to be put curbside for Thursday trash pickup. If your lawns are cut any day but Wednesday or Sunday, please ask your lawn folks to place the grass clippings next to your trash cans and NOT on the curb. We don't want clippings and other trash left curbside for multiple days in a row.

We also have a recycling pickup bright and early every Wednesday morning. The association will supply residents with recycle bins at no charge. If you need a bin, please email couvilla@ciramail.com and they will contact VF Waste and have a bin dropped off at your home.

We want our neighborhood to always look well cared for. So please do your best to keep unsightly trash out of sight until the night before of the day of trash pickup. If you ever have any questions about what VF Waste will or won't pick up, please call 713-787-9790.

CALL BEFORE YOU DIG!

Building a deck? Planting a tree? 811 is the new number you should call before you begin any digging project.

A federally-mandated national "Call Before You Dig" number, 811 was created to help protect you from unintentionally hitting underground utility lines while working on digging projects. People digging often make risky assumptions about whether or not they should get their utility lines marked due to concerns about project delays, costs and previous calls about other projects. These assumptions can be life-threatening.

Make a call for every digging job – even small projects like planting trees or shrubs. If you hit an underground utility line while digging, you can harm yourself or those around you, disrupt service to an entire neighborhood and potentially be responsible for fines and repair costs.

A recent study revealed that nearly half of homeowners who plan to dig this year won't call 811 to learn the approximate locations of buried gas, electric, communications, water and sewer lines before digging, putting their safety and the safety of others at risk. According to data collected by CGA, when an individual makes a call to 811 before digging, damage occurs less than 1 percent of the time. So, before you dig, call 811. Spring Is Near!

Spring will be soon upon us. Here are some tips to help your landscape recover from the winter.

• Fertilize: The application of a good fertilizer that incorporates weed control for St. Augustine lawns, sometime around the last week of February or during the month of March, will help promote growth and control those springtime weeds.

• **Mulch:** A fresh application of mulch for the plant beds and tree wells helps to beautify your yard and the community as a whole.

• **Prune:** Pruning of the trees in your front yard can be performed at any time of the year. Pruning should occur from the bottom of the canopy that the tree forms.

• **Irrigate:** Sprinkler systems should have a complete check-up to make sure your system is working properly and not wasting water by over-watering or watering the street. Consult a Licensed Professional for this type of service.
