(children were) was Deacon Caleb Wakefield of Reading.  
Grandfather was Timothy Wakefield who fought British at  
Concord. John + Nancy buried St. Johnsbury, Vt.

MARY TEMPLE b. 1856, Carlisle, Ma.; m. W. Fay - Elyria, Ohio - son, Ralph

JOHN b. 1858, Carlisle, Ma. Lived only to 11 mos. old

CLARISSA DOOLITTLE b. 1859, Salem, N.H. never married, teacher,  
missionary in Smyrna, Turkey

JOHN b. 1862, Wilmington, Me., named for brother who died

OPHELIA GOSS b. 1864, Wilton, Maine; m. Wm. Fay brother of Willis  
Elyria, Ohio

HENRY ZELOTES b. 1870, adopted by Mr. Durand, Chicago  
(not listed in Genealogy as he was adopted)

NOTES: Rev. John Lawrence, our Great-grandfather who wrote the genealogy,  
graduated from Phillips Academy, Andover in 1833/ Dartmouth College in  
1836 and Andover Theological in 1840. He taught in Plymouth, N.H., Westfield  
& Springfield, Mass. Was installed in Carlisle, Ma. in 1853, went to Salem, N.H.  
in 1859 and Wilton, Me. in 1863. Nancy, his wife, died shortly after the  
birth of her 8th child, Henry, from pneumonia. The children had to go to  
live with relatives & so were divided from family life together, Henry was  
adopted & Caleb lived with Uncle Horace Wakefield, which was not a happy  
experience. However he attended Leicester Academy which he lived next to.  
At age 28, Caleb joined his sister in Smyrna, <sup>Turkey</sup> where he met Helen, his wife.
