NOTES: Rev. John Lawrence, our Great-Grandfather who wrote the geneology, graduated from Phillips Academy, Anabver in 1833/ Dartmouth College in 1836 and Andover Theological in 1840. He taught in Plymouth, N.H., Westfield & Springfield, Mass. Was installed and Carlisle, Ma. in 1853, went to Salem, N.H. in 1859 and Wilton, Me.in 1863. Nancy, his wife, died shortly after the birth of her 8th child, Henry, from pneumonia. The children had to go to live with relatives & so were divided from family life together, Henry was adopted & Caleb lived with Uncle Horace Wakefield, which was not a happy experience. However he attended Leicester Academy which he lived next to.

At age 28, Caleb joined his sister in Smyrna, where he met Helen, his wife.
