One million vs. one million

When I sent out the reminder for the March meeting I asked the question about when was the millionth Mustang built. My reason for asking is a question that a friend, who is a dyed in the wool Corvette lover, asked me about when the millionth Mustang was built.

After I sent out the email reminder I did some research and found that the 1,000,000 Mustang was built on March 2, 1966 and given to Stanley Tucker in exchange for Mustang 100,001 which for a long time thought to be the first Mustang. Here is a link to the story.

Another interesting thing I discovered was that Ford built an "Anniversary Gold Mustang" to celebrate the milestone. It is thought that less than 50 were built and all coupes identically equipped with C code 289's, style steel wheels, and "Pony Interior". They were all San Jose built on March 29, 1966. The reason, how many still exist, and how they were distributed remain a mystery. It is believed that one example was sent to each DSO.

On the other hand, the 1,000,000 Corvette was built on July 2, 1992 and was donated to the Corvette museum.

Quite a stark comparison indeed. The New Class Creating Pony Car did in 2 years what it took the "Iconic" Corvette 39 years to do.

### Melting Miles Autobahn Style

Neil and I have two sons, Kyle and Greg. Greg is an active duty Army officer stationed in Grafenwoehr, Germany. Greg is newly married to Liz (also an active duty Army officer), and they have to live in separate cities for quite a while. Greg wrote a poignant essay for a Germany Mustang magazine about one of his lonely trips back to his apartment after a weekend with Liz.

A little Schoon Mustang Roush history: Greg and Liz have 2 Mustang Roush's. They have a blue 2012 Mustang Roush, Stage 3, Phase 3 which makes the Germany autobahn super fun. Ford gave Greg a warranty exclusion to allow a German Ford Dealership to take off the US required governor, so 200+ mph has become routine. Greg and Liz were also one of 13 winners of the 2015 Mustang Roush Warrior Edition raffle, and they now also own a black Mustang Roush, Stage 3. Only US Military stationed in Europe were eligible for the Warrior Edition Roush raffle.

Greg wrote this essay after he drove to his apartment from Liz's home in his blue Roush.

"I was feeling pretty down this afternoon when I left Liz to go home. Living 2-3 hours away from your spouse isn't fun. After making the trip for almost 2 years now, it was getting routine. However, something happened on the autobahn today that had never happened since I've arrived in Germany in 2013. As soon as I got on the A6 autobahn, a brand new cherry red Ferrari started to follow me. I didn't notice right away because I was still in a somber mood. As soon as I saw that he wanted to see what I "had", I was temporarily in bliss. He pulled up next to me and gestured to me as if to ask "want to have some fun?" No response gesture was needed from me as the Ferrari driver heard my super-charged Roush engine roar to life as I downshifted from 6th to 4th and he saw my grin. The Roush lurched forward as if one pony was saying to the other, "You had to ask?" We were near no autobahn speed limit signs and so, it was on! Off we went, an American Mustang running full tilt right next to an exotic Italian Stallion, and keeping pace. We had fun for what seemed like forever but was really only 10 miles or so where finally he pulled into an off ramp.
