Grace & Peace from the Pastor's Desk

My first in person Northwestern Pennsylvania Synod Assembly took place at Thiel College in Greenville, PA on June 10, 2022.

Anita Byrne and I sat together, and she introduced me to many people at the Assembly. Being post-pandemic we were limited to one church representative, and Anita won! I'm sure Joe would have liked to be there as well. Thank you Anita for your presence representing Immanuel.

Opening worship included a message from Bishop Lozano in which we learned he detests brussels sprouts! We then moved into legislation which first included taking a poll of retired and active clergy because legislation was passed by the Synod that restricts the vote of retired clergy, stating retired clergy can only vote if there is a 40/60 clergy/lay representation. It was determined there was enough lay representation that the retired clergy had a vote. Following this there was a block vote on constitutional updates involving changing the language to concur with the conference language rather than the cluster that was eliminated last year.

It was noted that \$42,000.00 of mission grants were received in our Synod and that 50% of our Synod donations go to ELCA.

Then Pastor Brenda Miller spoke about a relationship formed between two foreign exchange students who met at Lutherlyn when they were teenagers. One of the men was from Germany and the other from the Ukraine. They continued to stay in touch, and when the war broke out the Ukrainian man sent his family and his sister's family to live with the German man who had purchased a home with the intent of making a B&B, however that hadn't panned out, so he made it into apartments for the Ukrainians. The man who stayed behind in Ukraine is a neurosurgeon who cannot leave Ukraine yet. All this came about because they met at Lutherlyn and kept in touch.

Next the bylaw change regarding Holy Communion at Assembly was voted upon and approved so that it now reads "Normally Holy Communion will be celebrated at each regular Assembly." This was because an online Assembly was held last year and the constitution was broken due to not being able to celebrate Holy Communion.

The budget was discussed and accepted at \$779,461.00 for 2023. Rev. King was re-elected as Synod treasurer and Rev. Fischer was re-elected as Synod secretary.

It was announced that 100% of ELCA students at United Lutheran Seminary are tuition free.

Three memorials were introduced, and all were approved. One was on Gun Violence, one to reconsider the statement of purpose for the ELCA and take a re-look at the structure since it has been 35 years since it's inception. A committee is to report to the 2025 Churchwide Assembly. The third was on Greenhouse Gas to reduce emissions by 50% before 2030. All these will go to Churchwide Assembly for consideration.

Bishop Lozano then spoke about what it means to be a Synod together. An emphasis will be made on making disciples and Synod Council will become a test Synod. Pastor Jacobson and Pastor Dyson are collaborating on a Team Model for leadership development in order to be the church in the new generation. Communication, healthy conflict and a cell concept of spiritual growth will be developed.

Prior to closing, churches and rostered leaders were celebrated for their years of service, with the Revs. Martin Roth and John K Ludwig being honored with a plaque for 50 years of service.

I enjoyed my first in-person Lutheran Assembly and I am looking forward to next year.



You can make a difference every day...

The food we choose to eat has an impact on climate. According to the David Suzuki Foundation livestock production uses 30% of the planet's land surface and is responsible for nearly 20% of greenhouse gases like methane.

When planning meals, shopping or ordering in a restaurant, consider:

- How low on the food chain is this?
- How much energy goes in to producing it?
- Is it grown organically?
- How far did it travel to get to the store/table?

Steps you can take include:

- **Plan ahead** do some research and find yummy recipes before you go shopping.
- Eat meat-free meals.
- Choose veggie restaurants and meatless menu alternatives.
- Check out vegetarian websites.
- Buy organic and local whenever possible.
 - Vote with your fork organic food is better for the climate. Organic meat, poultry, eggs and dairy come from animals that aren't fed antibiotics or growth hormones. Organic farms promote genetic biodiversity, create less water pollution and soil damage, and result in fewer poisonings of farm workers, and less harm to wildlife.
- Read labels.
- Tell the produce manager at your grocery store what you want and why.
- **Don't waste food** nearly half of all food produced worldwide is wasted after production, discarded in processing, transport, supermarkets and kitchens. When people throw food out, all the resources to grow, ship, package and produce it are wasted, too, including massive amounts of water.
- **Grow your own -**turn your yard or even the smallest of spaces like a balcony or patio into a food garden.

Earth Friendly Celebrations

Here are some ideas for "greening-up" your next get together:

- Substitute throw-away plastic table covers with bedding sheets (lots of great designs) or butcher/craft paper (furnish crayons or makers for guests to decorate)
- Use paper lanterns (that can be collapsed to use again) instead of balloons
- ♥ Choose party favors wisely:
