32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time Sunday 12 November 2023 (Year A) Do Not Be Afraid I Am With You.

One saying that recurs time and again in the Scriptures is, **"Do not be Afraid"**. Jesus repeatedly tells His disciples, "Fear not". This is often accompanied by His insistence that His followers need to be alert and ready for the 'coming of the Son of man' which might be unexpected. These two approaches are not contradictory but compliment each other as they did for Jesus who had total trust in God through all events of His mission.

At the end of his gospel expounding the teaching of Jesus, Matthew presents three parables which have to do with the 'end of time'. We hear each one in turn over these last weeks of the Church's year, culminating in the parable of the sheep and the goats on the feast of Christ the king. It is this parable that gives us insight into what Jesus meant by reminding us to be alert at all times for His entry into our lives.

Today's story is the familiar one of ten bridesmaids, five wise and five deemed foolish; foolish because they had not come prepared for the long wait that eventuated before they were to accompany the bridegroom's ceremonial journey to his bride's house where her father would officially 'hand her over' to the husband. Such was the age old custom in biblical times. Before the groom appears however, five of the bridesmaid's lamps soon burn out and they have no oil to relight them. Should the wise share their oil and all have a shorter burst of light but risk total burn-out before they are able to complete their task of lighting the way for the groom? Or do they keep their oil so there is some light for the whole journey? Our instinct might be to question how could the wise not share the oil they have prudently bought? But would this have truly been 'wise?" Like all parables of Jesus there is always a bit of a twist and an unexpected conclusion. In this case wisdom is about being fully prepared for the unpredictable. It has nothing to do with self-obsession. True wisdom is about being able to discern the broader picture and the deeper impact of actions and judgements upon ourselves in relation to the Other. Biblical wisdom brings the seeker out of him or herself towards truth which can be found in God. The point of the parable for us would be that we must strive to be wise – that is, ready for the sudden and sometimes unforeseen demands of our Christian living. Christ reveals Himself to us in ways and times we do not expect.

Commenting on today's parable, Sr Patricia Stevenson RSJ concludes: "The most important point of the story is watchfulness, and that implies wisdom. So where is our focus? On some unknown future? Or are we busy now, doing our best to bring about the partnership of God and our community for the good of all."

Earlier in the year, Matthew's account of the Ascension ends with these reassuring words of Jesus: "Go and make disciples of all the nations.... and know that I am with

you always; yes, to the end of time." At any time, Christ might come to us in the guise of a homeless person, sitting outside the lotto agency; or in the finally expressed silent pain of a person abused in childhood; in the fearful tears of a lost child, in the repeated story of a bedridden aged relative; through the image of an asylum seeker living in fear of tomorrow. For these and all we encounter may we be lamps of welcome, hope and peace for the fearful, the abandoned and suffering in our world.

Collection after all weekend Masses


