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LITERACY ACCESS FUND LAUNCHES GRANTS PROCESS WITH INITIAL AWARD TO YORK COUNTY LIBRARIES

CHESTER, PA, March 2, 2018 - Literacy Access Fund, a 501(c)(3), public charity, announces its first grant award of \$10,000 to York County Libraries in York, Pennsylvania. Literacy Access Fund secures funding from corporate, foundation, and individual partners in order to provide financial support to underfunded public libraries through a competitive granting process. The goal of the organization is to help libraries provide equal access to quality resources for young learners, regardless of economic factors.

This award will help fund the inclusion of digital technology into the library's preschool traveling story time program. "The overarching goal of our preschool story time is to build literacy skills in young children," according to Robert Lambert, President of York County Libraries. "By adding a digital component, participants will have access to fun, interactive technology that will provide immediate positive reinforcement. These learning activities will help bolster concepts and skills learning throughout our 13 public libraries."

Deborah B. Sorgi, Ed.D., Chair, Director & President of Literacy Access Fund, echoed Mr. Lambert's remarks. "Literacy Access Fund is pleased to financially support the York County Libraries' preschool story time program expansion. Mr. Lambert's keen assessment of integrating technology into early learning will help young children read, write, and succeed in school and in life." Dr. Sorgi also noted, "This is the first of many grants that will help deserving public libraries impact and inspire the leaders of tomorrow, today."
