

...that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that John 17:21 NRSV vou have sent me.

Recently, the Christian Education Team asked me to look into the Christian education program at St. John's. The team asked that I examine how the program is currently operating and if there may be areas needing attention. One area the team is concerned about is the Faith and Family Sundays that take place once a month after church during the summer.

During my candidacy weekend, a Faith and Family gathering took place. There were games, snacks and a Bible lesson. Everyone had fun! When I was asked by the Christian education team to look into Faith and Family Sundays, I immediately thought of Messy Church.

What is Messy Church?

Messy Church began in 2004 in England when founder Lucy Moore wanted to address how few children were attending worship. She began by experimenting with some all-ages activities. The concept was a huge success, and Messy Church was born. Messy Church has been in the United States since 2014. Messy Church USA is currently a nonprofit organization.

Why use the word "messy?" The Messy Church name comes from Pete Ward's book Liquid Church where he describes faith families as fluid, as opposed to walled structures with insiders and outsiders. He says, "The boundaries have started to become more fuzzy and less well defined."

Messy Church is geared toward the interaction of ALL people of ALL ages and backgrounds, churched or un-churched. It especially emphasizes reaching individuals and families who wouldn't attend otherwise — whether they are busy with sports on Sundays or are uncomfortable with traditional worship. Messy Church isn't a craft club or a children's program — or any type of "program" for that matter. It is actual church... though it looks different from most worship services.

Messy Church is a regular opportunity for intergenerational worship, learning and fellowship. The purpose is to explore God's love in a welcoming, accessible way through fun, faith and food. It is church for everyone. It is a circle of all ages meeting together to engage in who God is in a way that works for them.

Five core values are at the heart of Messy Church.

Christ Centered: The goal of every gathering is to share the gospel.

Intergenerational: Everyone meets together, without the "age silos" common at most churches. People learn with one another and from one another, leading to a deeper and lasting faith.

Celebration: This doesn't necessarily mean jumping up and down, though that sometimes happens. Celebration involves sharing the abundant life Jesus offers, as well as, the ups and downs of our messy lives.

Creativity: Worshipers use all five senses to experience and explore God's Word.

Hospitality: Some type of meal is always involved so people can enjoy conversation around tables.

Messy Church uses a once-a-month format, usually lasting approximately two hours. A gathering includes a welcoming activity based on a Scripture theme and then four or five games, crafts, science experiments and/or hands-on experiences. Instead of being expected to sit quietly and listen, everyone interacts with the lesson through their senses.

I feel there are three important takeaways of Messy Church:

Adapt to Change: Do not be afraid of change. Messy Church is a new way of delivering God's Word without changing God's Word. It is a way of changing with the times and bringing new energy to the way church is conducted.

Be Community Minded: This is a good way to expand St. John's ministry outside the walls of our brick and mortar structure, as well as, to engage and learn more about our neighbors and the people within our congregation.

Dine together: I will admit that preparing a meal is work; however, it is a powerful pull as family meals together are rarer than they used to be. When we gather around the table for a meal together, relationships are built. At the table, we can truly show how everyone is welcome.

Messy Church can be summed up as a way for people of all ages and backgrounds to get know Jesus, and ALL are welcome no matter who they are or where they are on life's journey. Messy Church is a place of extravagant welcome, acceptance and unconditional love.

So let's all join together in Messy Church as we, ALL of St. John's, gather around the table to worship Christ!



Electronic Giving

You do not need a Realm account to use either of these options. (sorry if that last part sounds canned – it is! But the folks at Realm tell us it needs to be there). If you have a REALM account, you can give directly through your account. Otherwise, we are grateful for those who use envelopes or who contribute directly.



Narcan Emergency Overdose Kits

St. John's has been invited to participate in an initiative funded by the Ohio Department of Health and sponsored locally by ProMedica Health to combat opioid overdose deaths in our area. This project aims to provide free Narcan emergency overdose kits to those in need. In 2022, opioid overdoses claimed over 47,000 lives nationwide, and Ohio, unfortunately, ranks fourth in the country for opioid overdose deaths. Jim Hubbard is the coordinator for this regional initiative. Consistory discussed this and agreed to participate.

How the program works:

Boxes with 2 doses of nasal Narcan and other supplies are placed in locations that can be easily accessed. Jim Hubbard will visit St. John's on May 22 to talk more with leaders and to determine the best location for these supplies. We expect that the box will be placed outside in a sheltered area so it is accessible when the building is not occupied.

The box will be locked but has a break away plastic front to get to the medication that anyone can use. There are directions on the side of the box and there is a QR code on the front that, when the members of our church see it, they can scan it, and it will take them to a training video.

There is no liability for any aspect of Narcan, even if it is in the building and someone cannot get to it. Narcan falls under Good Samaritan laws that protect anyone that uses it, stores it, or needs it.

The grant can also provide Narcan take-home kits that can be distributed. When people receive kits, there are demographic questions that are asked. The only personal questions, which people can choose not to answer, are whether they have taken drugs in the last year, if they have overdosed or witnessed an overdose, and if this is the first kit they have received.

Police and EMS have Narcan or, if they don't have enough supplies in our area, the grant can provide them with supplies. We learned at Consistory that some companies supply workers who are out in the community with Narcan as well so they can respond, if needed, to an emergency.

Jim Hubbard will be here for worship on June 9 to talk briefly about this program and to answer questions from the congregation. Please plan to attend or, if you know you will not be here that day and you have questions, please call Pastor Jeff or the church office and we will ask the questions on your behalf.
