## Great Notes From Our Point Leaders:

★ We are the 1st Sustainment BDE; we are composed of different kinds of jobs mostly to sustain our troops in the battlefield; we are the movers, logistics, admin and transportation. We have different locations with teams that report the safe and the best logistical support from transporting personnel, equipment, and food for our troops. In your generous hearts the following items are mostly requested by our lower rank soldiers: razors, shaving gel, shampoo, conditioner, toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorants, air fresheners, lotion, mouth-wash, bodywash, cotton buds, shower sponge, nail clippers, hand sanitizers, lip balm, female accessories, hand wash, after shave, perfume, baby wipes, batteries size AAA and AA, small flashlights, wall hooks, white or black crew socks, small towels (tan or brown.) — *R Cruz*

★ Hello and Good Day to all, Thank you for all the support!!! We appreciate it more than we can express. We are an integrated/joint unit of over 100 Air Advisors working on and off secured locations (outside the wire) in Afghanistan. We work daily, shoulder to shoulder with them in attempts to help the Afghans build a sustainable Air Force. This has been one of my most rewarding positions and units because we are fully integrated with Soldiers, Sailors, Airmen, Marines & Civilians. We also have coalition partners from Germany, Sweden, Czech, Romania, Australia, and Great Britain. Any letters/packages sent will be shared with the entire team. We also share certain items with our Afghan counterparts to show them what people and products from America are like.... We do have a PX/BX but it is very, very limited. We live in hardened billets with 1-3 per room and eat at a dining facility/chow hall. We do have cooking facilities available to us if we want to cook or have something to cook. We cannot leave the post/base for any reason other than to advise Afghans & meet with them (so that means no shopping). — *P Dorsch*

★ Hello, Thank you taking your time to know a little about our unit and assisting us with sending a bit of home to bring up our morale. We eat, sleep and work in one building and have a separate gym across.... We do not have access to a nearby military base. Our drive is 45 min and once a week. We mainly lack personal hygiene items. Female toiletries (pads, hand lotion, lip balm). Male toiletries (razors, shaving cream, lotion, lip balm). Females love doing arts and crafts, and do holiday decorations for the barracks to bring up morale and remind them of our culture. We try to do birthday decorations each month. We enjoy playing soccer, football, and volleyball. We have karaoke nights and movies nights once a week as well. Thank you for your support/interest about us and looking forward to hearing from you. — *R Lopez*

★ First off let me say THANK YOU for the care packages I received today. As you have been doing this for as long as you have you must know (or I hope that you know) how much pleasure and sense of peace it brings to Soldiers like myself who are deployed away from home and loved ones. The care that you and the people who put these packages together are a GOD send. The items inside of the packages are just a bonus to just getting something from back home from loved ones and people who truly care about the sacrifices that Soldiers make, to hopefully make the World a better place for all. I would love to be a "point person" for as long as I can while I am here. I will also have the Soldier that takes my place get in contact with you as well so hopefully they can do the same. We only have a small unit here with a small amount of civilians working with us. Anything that we do not need at the time the package arrives we bring to the Red Cross, USO and MWR so that any number of about 9000 Soldiers here can enjoy the generosity of what is sent. Please thank everyone who was/is involved in putting these wonderful packages together. Especially Keith Jermyn. He also enjoys taking care of other Soldiers. I look forward to working with you and the church to keep this process as successful as possible. GOD BLESS. — *W Smith*
