We need t

understand that the way of spreading the Gospel does not change. What worked in days past will work now. What brings people to Christ, and the obedience they must give to Him, has not changed. I hope to share this morning pointers on evangelism learned from years of failures and successes.

Defending the Existence of God The Hatton Half:

One defense is giving scriptural support for the existence of God. The first piece of evidence proposed is found at Romans 1. The context of these statements is justification. Paul begins by describing the vile actions of the patriarchs under the patriarchal system. Paul states that the invisible things from God in the creation of the world are manifested very clearly (Rom. 1:20). The patriarchs were without excuse because God revealed Himself to them in this manner. The patriarchs were also guilty both of changing God's truth into a lie and worshipping the creation more than the Creator Himself (Rom. 1:25). God told Moses and all with him that He was a jealous God (Exo. 20:5). God should be the object of our worship, not the things He created.

Another passage for our consideration comes from David. He states on no uncertain terms that "the heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament sheweth his handiwork" (Psa. 19:1). If one even desires to observe the complexity within the galaxy in which we reside, one can infer that it did not happen by chance. There could be no explosion to bring this into existence, for explosions only produce disorder as a result. There are intricacies in our galaxy which cannot be ignored, such as formations of stars that have been named time and time again, such as the big and Little Dipper and others like them. The proof for God's existence is all over the place if one honestly searches for the evidence.

If you are coming back for the first time, or visiting with us, then note that there are TWO morning services and that an evening Bible Study and Wednesday night Bible Study are live-streamed on our YouTube channel. You are welcome at our worship services, just keep in mind the precautions that have been put in place.
