DESCRIPTION: High performance George Birnie designed short hunting bow. Marblewood riser. Bow has no delamination; no cracks; limbs are straight. Overlays and tips are in great condition. No drilled holes; No chips, dings or cracks. No crazing. A few minor scratches and nicks here and there. Decal is in fair condition. The only flaw in this bow is the stress lines in the limbs. Most are thin superficial lines (can't feel any separation with your finger nail and don't extend past the fade-outs). However, the stress line on the lower face limb can be felt and does extend into the working area of the limb. I put the bow on my "rack" and left it at full draw for 24 hours to see if it would fail or the stress lines extend. (If often do this to check weak lamination or stress lines extending into the working area of the limb—if the old glues are weak or the stress lines fatal, the bow will generally come apart. This has happened to a few of my bows during testing). This bow passed my rack test, and I have shot it several times without failure. However, some people would consider this bow a wall hanger. Priced accordingly. The Spoiler cost \$74 back in 1975, which amounts to \$384 in 2020 inflation-adjusted dollars.
