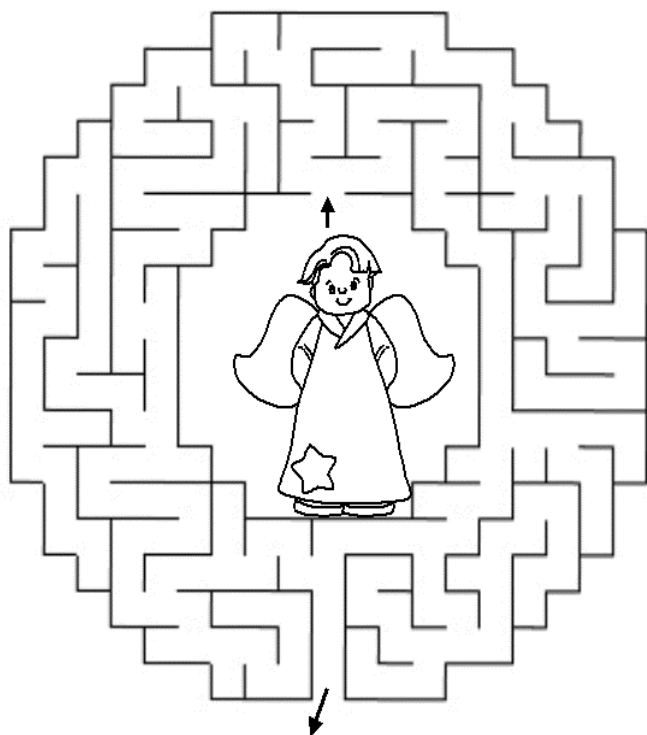

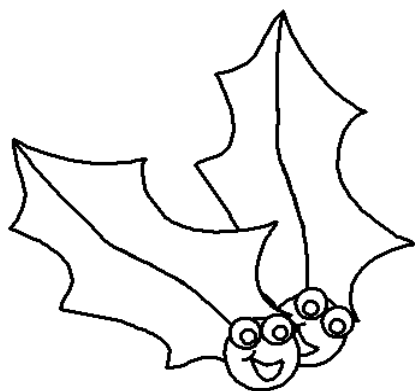

Community Shelter **Christmas Gift Bags**

Dear Friends of Immanuel,

Thank you so much for contributing so generously in filling Christmas bags for the adults spending the holidays at Community Shelter Services. The emergency shelter is located on West 17th Street in Little Italy, across the street from Holy Trinity Lutheran Church. CSS is committed to ensuring that those in need have a place to sleep and food eat. Those who knock on its doors usually come with only the clothes they are wearing. They are provided with food, shelter, and support services that lead to stability. I have been on the CSS board for 6 years, so I have seen first-hand how invaluable this ministry is.

Thanks to your cash donations of \$255, your contributions of many specific items, and seed money from Thrivent Financial of \$250, we were able to deliver 41 brightly-colored bags for Christmas Day. Each bag contained simple items that men and women who are homeless often do not have. The bags were filled with warm scarves, hats, ear muffs, and socks, in addition to hand warmers, hand cream, lip balm, wash cloths, razors, pens, memo pads, pocket calendars, bus passes, and bags of cocoa, candy, and your homemade cookies. In each bag we put a Christmas card from the congregation with a Psalm 23 bookmark. We were also able to give festive tablecloths, napkins, cups, and plates for the residents' Christmas dinner. We were also able to give 10 \$5 McDonald's gifts cards to the 2 families with children who are currently living at the emergency shelter.

Many thanks to Denise Arnold, who sewed 44 warm fleece scarves for the bags; Anita Byrne, who signed each Christmas card with a special note; Mary Hauser, who organized the gift list for items needed; and those who helped assemble the bags—Judy and Tom Stewart, Penny Malony, Stan Holsopple, Mary Masters, Char Feiler, and Vicar Cowey.

Twice a year, any member of Thrivent Financial is able to lead an “action team” around a cause you care about. Thrivent provides the seed money and a kit to make it easy.

Thanks to all of you who helped in any way to share the love and presence of the Christ Child with those who are so often overlooked. Through you, Christ’s light shines in the darkness. You made Christmas a little brighter for 41 of our brothers and sisters in Christ.

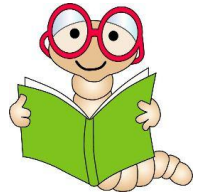
