child, Rowan, is now an official student at NDSU and is set up in her dorm. Rowan has been studying the maps of the area and can find the way to my sisters, our house, Target, and Community Presbyterian Church, so you will likely get to meet Rowan.

There is a devotional, d365, that I receive each day. This week the author is Bronwyn Clark Skov, writing about "Blessing of the Lunch Tables." How appropriate to provide blessings for students that are going back to school! It reminds me that we all need to add the students, teachers, administrators, and parents to our prayers. Each school system has a little different approach to getting the kids set up this year in ways they can best learn. As with adults, they all thrive with different approaches, so the administrators and teachers have a huge challenge, as do the parents. The d365 today started with a prayer for them all: "Let me be a friend to those who have few friends, let me find a friend when I feel lonely, let me walk away from danger to safety, and help me Lord, to walk in the light and love of Jesus." Skov also included a verse from Colossians 3:13 CEB; "Be tolerant with each other and, if someone has a complaint against anyone, forgive each oth-

Let us all remember the wisdom of the words from Colossians. As we continue to make our way as a congregation, there will be times some may continue thinking we are too slow or too fast in our decisions and movements. As a Ses-

A new I-Wave C air purifier will be installed in the church. This is a selfcleaning, bi-polar generator for actively treating a building's air quality.

MISSION FOCUS

The mission focus for September and October is PATH. PATH ND is a private nonprofit child and family ser-



vices agency that began operations in North Dakota in 1994.

For more than 15 years, PATH has provided evidenced-based services and supports to children and families in North Dakota: Case Management, Assessments, Treatment planning and coordination, Relief care, Parent-toparent mentoring, 24-hour availability, and Crisis planning intervention, Emergency beds, Community-based resource planning, Family reunification, and Specialized adoption.

The agency is licensed as a child placing agency by the North Dakota Department of Human Services and Idaho Department of Health and Welfare. All PATH programs are accredited by the Council on Accreditation for Services to Children and Families (COA).

PATH ND offers a continuum of in-home and community-based services to help kids and families throughout North Dakota and Idaho. Programming includes Treatment Foster Care (TFC); Family Family-Based Support and Services (FS); Transition and Assessment Program (TAP); Family & Individual Resolution-Focused Services & Treatment (FIRST); Independent Living; Adults Adoptina Special Kids; High-Fidelity Wraparound; Community-Assisted Recovery Environment (CARE); Supervised Alternative Family Environment (SAFE); Case Aide and Parent Support (CAPS); Long-Term Adoption: Foster Care; Guardianship; Continuing Education and Job Training (CEJT); Foster Care; Spe-cial Needs Foster Care; Assessment; and Shelter Care; and Counseling.




