
#### **Pierce Ferry Road-Part Two**

This is all about history, but how far back do we want to go? Before there was a town called Dolan Springs, there was a road that ran from HWY 93 to Pearce Ferry, on the Colorado River. But before HWY 93, and before Pearce Ferry, the miners and ranchers used the pass past the Dolan Springs to get to the nameless crossing we now know as Pearce Ferry. Before them were the Spanish, who mined for gold all over this corner of the world. They left traces of their presence in diggings that were old when the miners of the 1860's came into the area. And of course there were the Hualapai Indians, who used the area during the summer months, collecting food from the oaks in the canyons, and the fruit of the prickly pear, and the root of the agave plants.


But we are concerned with the history of Pearce Ferry Road. When I was deciding what topic to focus on, I asked fellow history buff Cheryl G. what she suggested. She recommended doing this history of Pearce Ferry Road. That sounded easy enough, but as I began to research the history of the area I realized that the subject was far too huge to fit into one edition of the paper. So this will be separated into two parts, finishing up on the last week of September. But I'll give you a spoiler....the road does indeed eventually get paved!

I have included the historical information from Part One, for anyone who may have missed the July 5th Friday edition.


So, at first there was nothing here except some corrals, an old ranch building, and the water flowing from the mountain, called Dolan Springs. I've found no solid information about who Dolan was. Someone said he might even have been a Mr Doolan. The map to the right seems to spell it Dolans Spring. It was just a place to pass between the end of the Cerbat Range and the beginning of the White Hills. In the 1880's the land belonged to the Bonelli family, and there are old wagon roads that wind all through the area, connecting springs, ranch homes, corrals, and the river.







Harrison Pearce was a Mormon who was involved in the Mountain Meadow Murders of a wagon train of settlers....way too big a story to get into now. As a punishment for the part he played, and because there was a need for it. in 1876 he was sent to run a ferry where the the Mormon Church was trying to get as many Mormons as possible settled into the Phoenix area, and were pretty successful for a while. But they had a rule, that you could only be married in a Temple, and the only Temple was in Utah. So Pearce Ferry Rd went from an old trail to a real road at that point. Harrison Pearce was there until 1883, when he sold the ferry to Thomas Steen, who ran it off and on until the Hoover Dam was built, and it was easier to cross the river there. Pearce(In time the

spelling was changed to Pierce) Ferry Road made a convenient place to reach the easternmost parts of Lake Mead as it filled up. At that point a man only known as Pop Emery (because that's how his sons Murl and Horace referred to him) opened a kind of concession stand there, on a dock in the lake. He sold snacks, worms, and camping gear. He lasted until '40 or '41. There were big plans for the bay area there where the road reached the river, or lake, but as the waters rushed into the lake all the silt dropped into the river bottom, and the bay silted up so fast that all plans were abandoned. So Pierce Ferry Road lost its value to any of the people interested in big money plans.

In 1911, as Congress was deciding on the boundaries of the proposed future State of Arizona, which was to be separated from the Territory of New Mexico, Sharlot Hall made a trip up into the Arizona Strip to raise awareness of its value. She went up via Lee's Ferry, and returned through Pearce Ferry, passing and stopping at the Dolan Springs. Does she look like someone vou know?



When the Hoover Dam began to create Lake Mead real estate investors quickly realized the potential for development. Many different subdivisions sprung up. In 1958 Tom White was sent here to help the Lake Mohave Ranchos get on their feet. In those days Pierce Ferry was just a rutted old road that the County graded every once in a while. In 1960 the Meadview subdivision began, adding traffic to the road. In 1965 construction began on South Cove Boat Ramp, which created even more traffic. In 1976 the first issues of the Joshua Journal were published, and Ed DeLong did a fantastic job of creating a record of the trials and tribulations of getting Pearce Ferry paved. I will be letting him do the talking from here on out.





## IMPORTANT PIERCE FERRY ROAD MEETING 2 P.M. SATURDAY, SEPT. 15 **ARIZONA DEPT. OF TRANSPORTATION MEMBER** E. J. "CHARLIE" McCARTHY WILL DISCUSS SOLUTIONS TO POTHOLE DILEMNA H

2:00 p.m. Saturday, September 15th, E.J. "Charlie" McCarthy will be at the Meadview Civic Center Auditorium to explain the current status of Pierce Ferry Road project.

McCarthy is the member of the Arizona Dept. of Transportation (ADOT) who represents Yavapai, Coconino and Mohave County. ADOT is the state agency that distributes and allocates funds for coun-ty, state and federal road construction projects.

McCarthy, as a member of ADOT, was instrumental in obtaining the original \$365,000 for reconstructai in obtaining the original source in reconstruc-tion of the Pierce Ferry Road. The monies were made available to Mohave County for the specific purpose of being used on the deteriorated road. However, Joshua Journal readers may remember the story about how Mohave County administrators "loaned" the funding monies to Yuma County. Residents were told the reason for loaning the

monies to Yuma County was that certain Rights-of-Way could not be obtained in accordance with state and federal requirements. The explanation for the and federal requirements. The explanation for the "LOAN" has never been accepted by the local residents as a satisfactory solution to solving the disgraceful condition of the historic road to Lake Mead, and a large portion of Mohave County's boasted 1,000 miles of shoreline. The Joshua Journal has obtained factual informa-tion regarding the "RIGHTS OF WAY EXCUSES" that appear to be contrary to the reasons Mohave County could not re-construct and provide a first-class

County could not re-construct and provide a first-class road through Dolan Springs to Meadview to join the

McCarthy will be accompanied by ADOT officials who will assist McCarthy at the September alternoon will assist McCarthy at the thy told the JJ, "Oct. 1979 is the beginning of the Fiscal Year - If the people who travel the Pierce Ferry Road are interested in obtaining ADOT Funding for the road, we (ADOT) want to hear their viev

McCarthy said, "I will be in Meadview on Sept. 15th at 2 p.m. - I will stay until midnight, if necessary, to answer questions and to hear the residents' requests hopefully, someone will feed us!"

McCarthy, it should be noted, was also the man who responded to the request of local residents regarding the dangerous turnoff at U.S. Hwy. 93 and Pierce Ferry Road. Within 30 days from the date the request was presented to the ADOT member, construction to widen the turnoff began as the result of McCarthy's directive.

The widening of U.S. Hwy. 93 to a 4-lane highway from Kingman to Las Vegas is another project credited to E.J. McCarthy. Construction is scheduled to begin in 1980!

At an informal meeting between Ed DeLong, publisher of the Joshua Journal, and E.J. McCarthy, DeLong asked McCarthy for suggestions to solve the Pot Hole Road problem. McCarthy responded by telling DeLong he would be willing to speak to the residents of the affected communities on that par-

ticular subject.

"I would be willing to go to bat again to obtain ADOT funding for the Pierce Ferry Road construc-tion project." McCarthy said, "but in the final ministrators to use the money for its intended purpose!

Jim Devlin, a Meadview property owner and a Civil Engineer in Kingman, told the JJ, "If anyone can help us with the Pierce Ferry Road problem it is "Charlie" McCarthy!"... The important thing to remember is to have an extra-large turnout at the Sept. 15 meeting to hear what "Charlie" McCarthy suggests as the best course of action.

Devlin was Kingman City Engineer during McCarthy's 7-year term as Kingman's second mayor after the city incorporated. McCarthy is the owner of Mc-Carthy Motors in Kingman (Ford-Mercury-Lincoln dealer).

Car pools of residents coming from Dolan Springs and Lake Mead City for the September meeting are expected to increase the attendance to a number sufficient to impress the ADOT representative of the serious concern the three communities share regarding the fate of the Pierce Ferry Road.

Everyone is urged to make a special effort to attend the Saturday afternoon meeting. It may very well be the most revealing presentation of the facts you always wanted to know

## Road Weary Walker Receives Applause

Jack Walker, Mohave County Road Dept. Motor Grader Operator for the area, received a round of applause from the people in attendance at a recent Lake Mohave Ranchos Community Council meeting. Jack's monumental task includes grading Lake Mohave Ranchos 500 miles of road where residents have built homes or have homes under construction.

Jack and his wife Ginette are owners of Lake Mead City's "Frenchie's Trading Post." Jack told the Joshua Journal, "People used to call both Ginette and me 'Frenchie', but I'm Dutch and Irish with a little bit of everything else thrown in for better or worse." Jack added, "Guess who's really 'Frenchie'?"

Jack will be seen this month on a brand-new Mohave Co. Road Dept. Caterpillar, model 130B Motor Patrol with an articulating blade (it bends in the middle). The machine with its 135 horse power turbo engine will hopefully enable Jack to speed up the impossible task of being on 3 different roads at the same time, located 14 miles apart.

The question the Joshua Journal asks is "Would anyone like to sign a petition to have Jack work 36 hours a day -- 9 days a week?"

## "ROAD CONSTRUCTION AHEAD" -- PAVING STARTS!

The photo in the upper right shows an Ol' tanker truck filling the Mohave County oil spreader.

The bottom right photo illustrates the method of mixing the oil with the aggregate. Southern Californians, familiar with the Mohave Desert, would call the mixture a "Desert Mix." It is used on many county roads in San Bernardino and Los Angeles counties. After the material is properly mixed, it will be spread across the roadbed with Bill Covey at the hydraulic controls of the motor grader. The spread will then be rolled and compacted to a 3-inch thickness.



The battle to get Peiece Ferry Rd raged from 1977 through 1979. In the '80's there is no more mention of the Pot Hole Epidemic. Mr DeLong had many other irons in the fire to report on.

If ole Ed were around today he'd be taking up the battle of the HWY 93 and Pierce Ferry intersection, where so many lives are devastated or lost every month. Perhaps one day we will lose one of our own, as we very nearly have at least once. Then we may all get together and go march on City Hall, and demand a 'flyover' lane, or whatever it is going to take to put an end to that carnage.






