As I mentioned earlier, many are excited about the arrival of Advent. This is a Christian season of preparation for the Nativity of Christ at Christmas. If you did not already know, the name was adopted from the Latin word *adventus* meaning "coming; arrival", translating of the Greek word *parousia*. In the New Testament, this is the term used for the Second Coming of Christ. Thus, the season of Advent in the Christian calendar anticipates the "coming of Christ" from three different perspectives: the physical nativity in Bethlehem, the reception of Christ in the heart of the believer, and the eschatological Second Coming. Practices associated with Advent include Advent calendars, lighting an Advent wreath, praying an Advent daily devotional, erecting a Christmas tree, or other ways of preparing for Christmas, such as setting up Christmas decorations, a custom that is sometimes done liturgically through a hanging of the Green's Ceremony which indicates the beginning of Advent. No matter how you prepare your home for this season, let us not forget the reason for the season. As we all know it is our Lord Christ Jesus. Let this beginning of Advent be a time not only to represent our faith but to love as He did. Let this time be in preparation for each of us to express why Jesus is the answer and hope to this world and our community.

From our whole family to you and yours, we would like to pray that each one of you have a wonderful Advent season and a very safe and Merry Christmas!!!



Showing Up

And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever — John 14:16

Jesus used the word Helper four times in one discussion with His disciples to describe the nature and work of the Holy Spirit (John





When Jesus spoke to His men about the Helper, He knew the disciples would soon meet with great distress, trials, difficulties, and persecutions. They would need all the assistance that the Helper could offer to stay loyal, faithful, and productive in the midst of the great changes and challenges in their lives. On the flip side, filled with the Spirit's mighty presence and power, they would become agents of that same help, comfort, and encouragement, producing healing and hope in the lives of others. The disciples would accomplish this by showing up and speaking up in the lives of the people they would encounter.

This is the same mission the Holy Spirit seeks to carry forward in every disciple. Our little family Christmas tradition is a good reminder to me that while big opportunities to help others rarely come, the small ones surround me daily. In baseball, they call it winning by "small ball," which is the strategy of steadily advancing base runners versus relying on the big home-run hitters.

Jesus knew how important it was to show up in our lives after his physical departure, so he provided his Helper the Holy Spirit to help us be involved with others.
