The cascade was installed at St. Mary's church in Barnsley Town Centre and falls from the tower window to pool on the floor below, a stunning display of over 12 metres. It is hoped that this is just the start of an annual and growing display which will encourage people to visit and take a moment of quiet contemplation to remember.





PORTER VALLEY GROUP AFTERNOON TEA

The Porter Valley group of Sheffield WIs met for their annual October event held at the beautiful Dorothy Fox Centre in the Botanical Gardens. Over 75 members across the 6 groups attended the afternoon tea which was also joined by Chair of SYF Dorothy Meekins and WI Adviser Sian Holmes.

The afternoon started with a welcome glass of Prosecco and time for the ladies to meet other WI members from local groups.

Over the last 6 months members of all the groups have been busily knitting 'Trauma Teddies'. They are used by Children's Services to engage with and help children who have been in difficult and challenging situations. We knitted about 280 teddies and invited a representative from the Children Services Safeguarding and South Yorkshire Police Safeguarding Teams to come and give an overview about how they use these resources in their work. They were both delighted with the donations and the teddies will be distributed across South Yorkshire. The Sheffield Ambulance and Fire Service, St Luke's and the Sheffield Women's Refuge are also taking some of the teddies. Catherine Vincent from Greystones WI also highly entertained us with an improvised 'tale' about knitted teddies from a teddies perspective!!

We were raising funds for St Luke's Hospice in memory of ex- Bents Green President Julie Colleyshaw. Julie died in August of this year and was remembered at the meeting by her WI. Afternoon tea including beautiful homemade cakes from the participating groups and a quiz and raffle concluded a very enjoyable afternoon.

Over the past year I have shared ideas that can help us all reduce our impact on the environment. As you read this, you will probably be starting to think about preparations for Christmas (or you may be very organized and have everything done already!) so in this last article in the series, I'll offer some suggestions for having an environmentally-friendly Christmas.

Cut back on festive food waste

This fits very well with the WI's on-going focus on food waste in general. In the UK, we waste 5 million Christmas puddings, 2 million turkeys and 74 million mince pies every year. To avoid waste, we can plan our shopping, only buy what we will use and make the most of leftovers. Shopping locally and eating food in season also helps to reduce our carbon footprint.

Use recyclable cards and wrapping

Look for cards and wrapping paper made from recycled or FSC (Forest stewardship council) certified paper. Avoid glitter, plastic ribbon and tape and foil backed wrapping paper. Choose cards that can be recycled so no foil or glitter. You could also try wrapping gifts in material – the traditional Japanese furoshiki technique.

March for Clean Water

by Those of you that follow the SYFWI on Facebook will have seen that I attended the recent 🌀 March for Clean Water in London on Sunday 3rd November. There was a large group of WI members led by National Chair Jeryl Stone and everyone wore blue to turn the march into a wave of blue flowing through London. Among the speakers at the rally in Parliament Square 8 were Chris Packham and NFWI CEO Melissa Green who reminded the crowds that the WI has been calling for action against water pollution since 1927! We raised the issue again in the 1960s, 1980s and again in 2023. As she said 'We know that our water is being polluted wantonly, knowingly, for profit and we can't understand why the government are not taking more action'. Let's hope our collective voices will make a difference. 57
