

4th Sunday of Easter 30 April 2023 (Year A)

"I Have come so that they may have life"

On the fourth Sunday of Easter we are presented with an image of Jesus as a Shepherd leader. But it is a pity that this great theme is associated for many people with a sentimental image of the Saviour. The passages of John's Gospel presents a courageous leader and protector who knew, loved and identified with those in his care. This image of shepherd Leader reaches back into the history of the people of Israel. In contrast to many tyrannical Rulers of the Middle East, God was identified by the prophets as the True Shepherd of His people. The role of 'shepherd' was also associated with the leaders God called forth to guide His people through dramatic times: Abraham - leading a nomadic people with their families and herds to safety from famine; Moses guarding pasturing sheep when called by God to lead the Hebrew people out of slavery; David- from shepherd son to shepherd king uniting tribes in a land of their own. In Jesus' time the life of a shepherd was by no means idyllic. Shepherding was a lowly state, identified like tax collectors, swine herds and sinners as menial occupations. Shepherds were known to trespass on the property of others in search of food or shelter but have little regard for the safety of the sheep. Tending sheep was done in desert places and hillsides away from regular living areas and at the mercy of the elements, wild beasts and raids by thieves and brigands. When danger was immanent, shepherds might opt for their own safety and bolt, leaving the flock at the mercy of predators. However a good shepherd knew his sheep, identifying with their vulnerabilities and sharing the dangers they faced. He would never abandon them. When darkness fell he would herd the flock into a semi- enclosed area that had but one entrance – an opening with no gate. He himself became 'the gate', sleeping in the open space so that no sheep could get out and no robber get in except by crossing over his body hence arousing him to protect the flock. A good shepherd put his life on the line to save the flock. In today's gospel, Jesus makes it clear that in His role as 'shepherd' who enters the sheepfold with proper authorization, He is the Gate to the Father's mercy and care for all people. 'I have come', He says, 'that they may have life and have it to the full'. Jesus' image of the good shepherd pointed to how leadership was to be exercised in the Christian community. Those who aspired to leadership were to be close to the people, share their lives, understand their hopes, fears and needs; lead with firmness but compassion, removing any threats of danger and drawing them into 'life in Christ Jesus'. On this Vocation Sunday we pray that Young people will be inspired to respond to the call to leadership in our Church and we pray for all who, whether in the home, parish, local community and broader church, have responded to the call and challenge to be shepherds towards others. This call extends beyond the formal leadership of the Church.

May each of us at Sacred Heart, continue to strive to fulfil our commitment to 'embedding a culture of respect, safety and protection -in all its aspects- of all especially

children, youth and vulnerable persons in our community. Such is the spirit of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, who came that all may have Life and have it to the full'.

The merit, in the sight of God, is in bearing punishment patiently when you are punished after doing your duty.

This, in fact, is what you were called to do, because Christ suffered for you and left an example for you to follow the way he took. He had not done anything wrong, and there had been no perjury in his mouth. He was insulted and did not retaliate with insults; when he was tortured he made no threats but he put his trust in the righteous judge. He was bearing our faults in his own body on the cross, so that we might die to our faults and live for holiness; through his wounds you have been healed. You had gone astray like sheep but now you have come back to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

John 10:1-10

Jesus said:

'I tell you most solemnly, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate, but gets in some other way is a thief and a brigand. The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the flock; the gatekeeper lets him in, the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out. When he has brought out his flock, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know his voice. They never follow a stranger but run away from him: they do not recognise the voice of strangers.'

Jesus told them this parable but they failed to understand what he meant by telling it to them.

So Jesus spoke to them again: 'I tell you most solemnly, I am the gate of the sheepfold. All others who have come are thieves and brigands; but the sheep took no notice of them. I am the gate. Anyone who enters through me will be safe: he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full.' The Gospel of the Lord. All: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ. PROFESSION OF FAITH THE NICENE CREED.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.

I confess one Baptism for the

forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
