We are having a Memorial Day Ceremony at Clinton Grove at 11 am please join us if able to.

History of Memorial Day Memorial Day, as Decoration Day gradually came to be known, originally honored only those lost while fighting in the Civil War. But during World War I the United States found itself embroiled in another major conflict, and the holiday evolved to commemorate American military personnel who died in all wars, including World War II, The Vietnam War, The Korean War and the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan.

For decades, Memorial Day continued to be observed on May 30, the date General Logan had selected for the first Decoration Day. But in 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which established Memorial Day as the last Monday in May in order to create a three-day weekend for federal

employees. The change went into effect in 1971. The same law also declared Memorial Day a federal holiday.

Memorial Day Traditions and Rituals

Cities and towns across the United States host Memorial Day parades each year, often incorporating military personnel and members of veterans' organizations. Some of the largest parades take place in Chicago, New York and Washington, D.C.

Americans also observe Memorial Day by visiting cemeteries and memorials. Some people wear a red poppy in remembrance of those fallen in war—a tradition that began with a World War I poem. On a less somber note, many people take weekend trips or throw parties and barbecues on the holiday, perhaps because Memorial Day weekend—the long weekend comprising the Saturday and Sunday before Memorial Day and Memorial Day itself—unofficially marks the beginning of summer.

JUNIOR VICE'S CORNER

Memorial Day draws near, which I have long regarded as a most sacred holiday for every U.S. veteran; we diligently spearhead the duties of keeping alive the memories of our dearly departed brothers and sisters-in-arms. We remember foremost those who died in combat during a war or global conflict, then also those who finished their years of service faithfully before living out their remaining years as civilians before passing away. Additionally, let us not forget those who died of agonizing, unseen wounds that cause premature death from suicide or addiction problems. These are the veterans with severe mental health cases that gave up hope and saw no other way out.

Most of you are no doubt familiar with the concept of 22 per day, which was the number of veterans committing suicide for which there are multiple movements and charities to combat the trend. To be accurate, this number is currently down to about 17 per day according to the VA, but is sadly still too high to believe the issue is resolved, and after 20 years of war in the Middle East this is not likely to go away anytime soon. There is much more work to be done.

I believe VSO's should be the vanguard in this effort as we are the best people to help those in serious need. Who can better listen to and relate to the stories needing to be told? Who can better help give direction on finding the proper treatments and navigating the VA? Fellow veterans are the optimal option for helping our

wounded warriors as we are the ones who know firsthand what is needed and how to get it.

In our quest to find fellow Marines who will bolster our ranks and help carry on the traditions of the Marine Corps League, let us focus not only on what the newer generation wants but first and foremost on what they need. Getting them help should aid in our recruiting efforts due to a sense of gratitude, but, at the very least, should reduce the number of monthly suicides and other untimely veteran deaths.

Composition of the Color Guard, "c. A Joint Armed Forces Color Guard will consist of eight members; three Army, two Marine, one Navy, one Air Force, and one Coast Guard. The national color bearer and commander of a joint [full] color guard will be a Soldier. The respective service colors are aligned to the left of the national colors."

Order of Precedence of Flags. "2.11.7.20. In Joint Service Color Teams, the Army carries the United States Flag and commands the color team as the senior Service. The rifle guard nearest the United States Flag is Army and the rifle guard farthest from the United States Flag will be a Marine."
