But as much as I love Spring...and I DO love Spring...I would argue that, at least in the life of a church, the equation might look more like "Fall = New Life"!

By now, you're probably thinking, "Come again there, Pastor? How is FALL about new life?" Good question! And outside, there isn't a whole lot of new life this time of year. The grass is turning. The crops are about ready to be brought in. The leaves are falling. The world is pulling into hibernation mode in anticipation of Winter. That's outside. But INSIDE...well...that's another story altogether!

Historically, Fall is when the church kind of comes back to life. Many churches almost completely shut down in the summer. Youth groups, Sunday School, even worship services go on hiatus for the Summer. Then, when Fall comes, they all come back to life. There is a big push for "back to church". I get that. I have actively participated in that approach. I GET it. I have DONE it. But I don't LIKE it!

I have historically been against shutting very many things down for the summer. I mean, there are some ministries (Wednesday Night Fellowship, Choir, Bell Choir) that perhaps need a little time off so that folks can take a little breather, regroup and prepare for the comeback! But God doesn't take a vacation from us, so why would we take one from Him?

With that in mind, this past summer has been one of the best of my 23 years in the ministry. Yes, some ministries took some time off. But for the most part, there was very little "let down" around here this Summer. Instead, we kept right on pushing, focusing on connecting more people to Jesus Christ. And that fact makes this Fall even sweeter!

Even though we didn't really let down over the Summer, we are neck-deep in the "new life" of Fall right now! Wednesday Night Fellowship is back. The Choir is back. The Bell Choir is back. And suddenly, in the midst of a world outside the doors of the church that is beginning to shut down for the Winter, we are experiencing Spring inside the building!

Not only does faith not have to be dull and boring- it SHOULDN'T be! WE serve a living God. We have been saved by His grace and made new through His salvation. We have the best story ever to share. THE BEST! We should want to share that story with a world that so desperately needs to hear it. Christianity isn't some dull, boring, ancient ritual that we muddle through every Sunday. It is a way of life that leads to NEW life, vitality and a joy that the world cannot replicate. Celebrate the new life of Fall! Celebrate the new life found in Him!

CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

Bishop Gregory Palmer, the former Bishop of our Illinois Great Rivers Conference of the United Methodist Church, in an e-letter dated December 20, 2008, said this about the decline of our denomination, "...the invitation to discipleship is at the core of our identity and mission as The United Methodist Church. We as an annual conference...have struggled to be invitational...with the gospel of Jesus Christ. In 2007, 60 percent of our congregations received ZERO persons by professions of faith. We are simply not bringing new people into the life of the church in a way that outpaces our decline. As Bishop of the Illinois Area, I want to encourage you that, as United Methodists, we have a glorious heritage of proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ and offering invitation to the transforming relationship with the Savior."

6 out of every 10 United Methodist Churches in our conference are losing ground. This makes AUMC all the more exciting of a place in which to do ministry! New members are joining. Baptisms are happening. If THAT doesn't get you excited...then your wood's all wet!

ONLINE GIVING

More and more of you are now making your weekly/monthly/yearly offering to your church online! If you go to the home page of the church website (<u>www.myaledoumc.com</u>) and choose "giving" from the Navigation Bar near the top, it will take you to a page that will provide the opportunity for you to give electronically. You can either do a one-time gift or a recurring monthly gift.

"Pastor, why would that be good for the church?" Thanks for asking! It's SO easy to forget your checkbook at home one week. It's also so easy to forget to give your offering when you are out of town.
