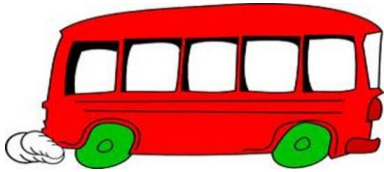
CATHOLIC EDUCATION WEEK 2019 begins on Sunday, May 5. The Catholic schools in
