Sixth Grade



Stand-up for Life

This past fall, the Diocese of Allentown sponsored the "Stand Up for Life" Essay and Multimedia Contest with over 600 students submitting essays and multimedia presentations. On January 17, 2016, Dr. Philip Fromuth, secretary of the Secretariat for Catholic Education, welcomed the 21 student finalists being honored to an awards ceremony, along with their families and educators.

"This afternoon we reach out both as a church and a people of faith to acknowledge the dignity of life for all," said Fromuth. He told the students they are responding to Pope Francis' call to move away from a "throw away culture," are are living out their duty as Catholics and citizens to help those in need, and to protect the lives of the most vulnerable.

Four HGA students who participated in the Junior Division Multimedia Contest were among the 21 honorees. "U.S. Birthrate Drops for the Sixth Straight Year" was the Junior Division theme for students in seventh and eighth grade. The multimedia entry could be any combination of PowerPoint slides, video, animation, music and voice-over multimedia. It had to be 2-5 minutes long, self-running and require no interaction from the user.

- Evaluation, Revision, and Creation of our Founding Documents

What we are finalizing. . .

- The Profile of the School: This section of the report addresses aspects of the school such as the school's history, demographic trends, staff certification, local community resources, and economics in order to create an accurate profile of the school and its surrounding communities.
- Research and Reports Concerning the 12 Standards: Our entire faculty and staff worked very hard to thoroughly investigate various aspects of the school community. The completed surveys from our parents, students, and staff were a key component to their reports. In addition to the survey feedback, our 12 Standards Committees (composed of faculty and staff members) also analyzed data from a variety of sources.

What we are in the process of completing. . .

 Self-Assessment of the Indicators of Quality for Curriculum Instruction, and Assessment: After a review of our Middle States Surveys as well as faculty input and student performance data, we have chosen to more deeply evaluate the following curriculum areas: Religion, Mathematics, and Reading. Committees have been formed and are currently evaluating these areas that will lead to a designed improvement plan.
