

WHEN IS EASTER?

Have you ever wondered WHY Easter isn't on the same Sunday every year? I mean, Christmas is on December 25th...period. But Easter slips around the calendar from year to year, forcing us to find it. Why?

Easter is observed on the first Sunday after the first full moon of spring (called the Pascal Full Moon) following the spring equinox. And the Spring equinox marks the moment the Sun crosses the celestial equator – the imaginary line in the sky above the Earth's equator – from south to north. THAT day- the Spring Equinox- always occurs on March 21, according to a decree by the early Christian Church at the Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D. and the Gregorian calendar introduced by Pope Gregory in 1582. Therefore, Easter can fall on ANY Sunday between March 22 and April 25. That's also why Easter and the church holidays leading up to that day (Ash Wednesday, Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday) are referred to as "moveable feasts."

My birthday is April 18th. (And NO, that is NOT a veiled "advertisement"!) Since that date falls in the "window" of potential Easter dates, that means my birthday COULD be on Easter. And, in my lifetime, is HAS been- 1965 and 1976! In 1965, I was 4 years old (YOU do the math!), so I don't remember it. In 1976, I was 15, so I DO remember it. NEITHER time did it make much difference to me. During that period in my life, Easter was ALL about candy, gifts and days off from school and NOTHING about Jesus Christ.

But Easter means SO much to me now. It is true that, without Christmas, there would be no Jesus. But it is also true that, with Easter, there would be no Christ. Easter is when God made the ultimate sacrifice for us. Not simply to satisfy Old Testament prophecy- although it did. NOT simply to satisfy an evil earthly king. But the sacrifice was made for...us. 2,000+ years later...for us. That is HARD to wrap your head around!

Easter is an awesome time of year. It's a time of rebirth. The grass is "greening" up. Trees are budding. Flowers are blooming. The earth is waking up after the winter slumber. And those images are NOT lost on me. Easter is a time for the "greening" up, the budding and the blooming of us, as well. Through the sacrifice Christ made, we are given new life. And that new life is eternal- if we accept Him fully into our lives. And that, my friend, is GOOD stuff! By the way, looking ahead, Easter won't fall on my birthday again until 2049- I'll be 88 years old!



Lent- the season of the church calendar leading up to Easter. Beginning the Sunday AFTER Ash Wednesday, it is a 7-week period of preparation. This Easter season, we will actually start...at Christmas and walk to the empty tomb. Along the way, we will always keep the image of "the nails" in front of us-reminding us that without Christmas there is no Jesus, but without Easter...there is no Christ! The weeks of the series look like this:

Sunday, March 10, 2019- One of Us- (Luke 2:1-7) Love came down at Christmas. (Isaiah 7:14, John 1:14) Sunday, March 17, 2019- Forgiveness (1John 1:9) He offers us the thing we most need. (Psalm 103:10-14, Luke 6:37) Sunday, March 24, 2019- The Invitation (John 15:1-4) In His presence is the best place to be. (Jeremiah 29:11, Romans 8:28) Sunday, April 7, 2019- Confirmation Sunday- Agape Love (John 3:16-17) He loves us unconditionally (Jeremiah 31:3, 1John 4:16) Sunday, April 14, 2019- Cantata/Palm Sunday- Palms to Passion (Matthew 27:15-22 "Hosanna" on Sunday turned to "Crucify Him" on Friday. (Isaiah 53:3, James 1:12) Sunday, April 21, 2019, Easter Sunday- Victory (Matthew 28:1-10) The nails lead to the ultimate victory- over death. (Psalm 16:9-11, 1Thessalonians 4:14)

WINTER SAFETY TIPS

(From AUMC Safety Team)

Wear shoes or boots that provide traction. Avoid shoes with smooth soles and high heels.

Assume that all wet, dark areas on pavements and sidewalks are slippery and icy.

If you must carry a load, try not to carry too much; leave your hands and arms free to balance yourself.

When walking on steps always use the hand railings and plant your feet firmly on each step.

Use special care when entering and exiting vehicles; use the vehicle for support.

Watch where you are stepping and GO S-L-O-W-L-Y taking short steps or shuffle for stability.

Ways to Stop the Spread of Cold and Flu

Avoid Contact:

If you are sick, stay home. A person is contagious a full day before symptoms show up and up to 7 days after becoming ill. The CDC recommends that a person who catches the flu or a flu-like infection stays home for at least 24 hours after their fever is gone.

Wash your Hands:

The flu is spread through droplets when an infected person coughs, sneezes, or even talks. Washing your hands frequently helps prevent the spread of cold and flu viruses. If hand-washing isn't an option, use hand-sanitizer as a back-up. It is best to try and keep your hands away from your face.

Cover your Mouth:

If you have to cough or sneeze, be sure to cover your nose or mouth with a tissue. Immediately wash your hands with warm water and soap.

Keep Surfaces Clean:

It is good practice to clean and disinfect shared surfaces, such as doorknobs, phones, and keyboards often to prevent the spread of infection.

KNIT, CROCHET, PRAY

Do you listen better when you are doing something with your hands? We have a new ministry that's just for you! The Knit, Crochet, Pray basket is in the back of the sanctuary and it holds scarves to knit or crochet. You are invited to take a scarf from the basket and knit or crochet a few rows during worship (knit stitch for the knit scarves, single crochet for the crocheted scarves). As you stitch, you are encouraged to pray for the person who will receive the scarf. After worship, return the scarf to the basket for the next person to stitch a few rows. Completed scarves will be given to people in need. Anyone who can knit or crochet is invited to Knit, Crochet and Pray. Don't know how, but want to learn? See Kathleen Bashem.


