

Having been born in Macon, 85 years ago, I have returned home, and I am very happy to be here. My parents were Charles and Nellie Marsh. I was born Nellie Charlene Marsh on September 12, 1931. My dad worked for the city light plant for more than 40 years. He rang the whistle, tested the water, and did several other jobs there. Mom was a school teacher.

When she married my dad she had to give up her teaching job and worked at Sharp's Mercantile Store (where Ben Franklin's is now). I had two sisters, Marjorie and Betty Sue, both deceased, and my brother Larry. My brother is a retired teacher and has been very active in the Florissant Civic Center. He has conducted an orchestra for many years. Some of us here at our assisted living center were able to hear and see a tape of his recent Christmas Concert in St. Louis.

I had a very happy childhood. I was a Girl Scout clear through High School. My church was a big part of my life. I was a member of our youth choir as well as the adult choir in the First Baptist Church here in Macon. We had many wonderful Sunday school teachers and leaders in Girl's Auxiliary studies.

I attended Central Grade School here in Macon and enjoyed it all. I played basketball all four years of high school and loved it. I was on the first team all four years because of my height. Our team went undefeated in '46-'47. I was co-captain a few of those years. I've always enjoyed basketball, playing and watching it. I have also participated in the Woman's Alumni Team once in Macon. Good sportsmanship is so important, and playing a sport provides opportunities to learn that trait.

Having always been the tallest girl in my class (5'10"), I was delighted to see a tall, good looking guy as soon as I got to high school, and ended up marrying him. His name was John Burkhardt. Unfortunately, he passed away at the age of 53. We had two children - Cindy Schott, a retired teacher who lives in




Rolla; and a son John Kent Burkhardt, who lives in Centralia. He works at the University Hospital in Columbia.



Cooking thru the Ages!

Texas Pecan Pie Pound Cake

2 cups butter

4 cups sugar

4 cups flour (cake or all purpose)

8 large eggs

1 (8 oz) package cream cheese

3 tps. vanilla flavoring

1 cup pecans, chopped

1 cup brown sugar

1 jar of caramel ice cream topping

Cream together (room temperature) cream cheese, butter, and eggs until smooth. Add eggs, one at a time followed by flour, one cup at a time. Add vanilla. Grease and flour bundt pan. Pour in batter. Sprinkle with pe-

cans and brown sugar. Lightly press into the batter. Bake at 300° for 1 hour and 15 minutes. Increase the temperature to 325° and bake for an additional 30 minutes. Test the cake for doneness. Cool for a few minutes before removing from pan, inverting onto plate. Then, turn the cake onto another plate so that the nuts are on top. Drizzle with jar of caramel ice cream

topping. Heat from the cake will make the caramel melt over the pecans. Can add a glaze as well (very pretty).



1 lb ground beef

1 package taco seasoning

1 (10oz) can diced tomatoes

and green chiles, drained 2/3 cup water 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese 1 (17.3-oz) package puff pastry, thawed

Preheat oven to 400°. Line two baking sheets with parchment paper. Set aside. In a large skillet, cook ground beef until no longer pink. Drain. Add taco seasoning, diced tomatoes and green chiles and water. Simmer for 5 minutes. Set aside.

Pastries: Unfold pastry sheets. Cut each sheet into 9 squares. Arrange taco meat down diagonal center of the pastry squares. Sprinkle with some of the shredded cheddar cheese. Fold two opposite corners of each

square over the filling and press edges to seal. Place on prepared baking sheet. Bake 15-18 minutes, until golden brown. Serve hot or at room temperature. Makes 18 puffs

Onion Roasted Potatoes

1 envelope Onion Soup Mix 2 lbs Potatoes cup into cubes 1/3 cup olive oil

Put all ingredients into plastic bag. Shake until potatoes are evenly coated. Empty into shallow baking dish. Bake at 450° for 40 minutes or until done. Stir occasionally.







Sugar Cooke Icicle Cookies

Make your favorite sugar cookie dough. Divide dough in half; shape each half into 5-inch log. Wrap each in plastic food wrap. Refrigerate 2 hours or until firm. Heat oven to 375°F. Cut logs into 1/4-inch slices. Roll each slice into 9-inch rope, tapering from center to ends. Fold



rope in half and twist, pinching end into a point. Place 2 inches apart onto ungreased cookie sheets. Repeat with remaining slices. Bake 8-10 minutes or until set. Poke hole in top of each cookie with toothpick or straw to hang icicles. Cool completely on wire rack placed over waxed paper. Make a powdered sugar glaze. Brush glaze over cooled cookies with pastry brush. Immediately sprinkle edible glitter on cookies. Let stand until set. Thread ribbon through hole in each cookie to hang.
