MTAC sponsors the Certificate of Merit music study program. CM provides a standard of curriculum that requires students to strive for focused musical excellence in performance, technique, ear training, sight reading/singing, and music theory.

- Students participate in an annual Evaluation between mid-February and April and receive a written musical performance assessment.
- Students complete a written theory exam which includes an ear training component.
- Upon successful completion of the Evaluation, students receive an official MTAC CM Certificate for their level.
- Senior medallions are awarded to eligible high school seniors.
- Students demonstrating exceptional skill at his/her Evaluation may be selected to perform at annual MTAC State Convention Recitals

Only MTAC teachers who have paid membership dues by July 31 are eligible to register students for CM. Students must be at least five years old by October 31 to participate. CM Syllabi are published by MTAC and may be purchased exclusively through the MTAC State Office. See <a href="https://www.mtac.org/Store">www.mtac.org/Store</a> for syllabi and other publications.

#### Community Outreach/Music Students' Service League

The Music Students' Service League (MSSL) was formed so students of MTAC members may have the opportunity to serve the community through music. MTAC awards students with community service credit for their time, efforts, and talents. These awards, in turn, may help students fulfill graduation requirements of schools and other service organizations. Students share their gift of music with the community by giving recitals in senior citizens' homes and by helping with other musical activities. MSSL is a student-run membership organization under the guidance of an MTAC teacher.

#### Piano Sonata/Sonatina Competition

May 18, 2017 at Newcomb Academy, 9 am – 3 pm\*

Entry deadline May 3; Entry fee \$30

For this Branch Competition, students perform two selections from memory. The first selection is the first or last movement of any sonata/sonatina or a complete single-movement sonata/sonatina (e.g., Scarlatti). The second selection must be chosen from a different musical period as defined by the 2012 CM Piano Syllabus (pp. 161-169). The student may play parts of a longer piece (e.g., selected variations from "theme and variations") or several short pieces from a suite (e.g., two pieces from Burgmüller's Op. 100). Time limits will be strictly enforced.

The competition is divided into three categories based on school grade:

Elementary (K-4) – 5 minute time limit Intermediate (5-7) – 7 minute time limit Senior (8-12) – 9 minute time limit

All students will receive certificates of participation and evaluations from three judges. Trophies will be awarded to the first, second, and third place winners in each category, and medals will be awarded to any honorable mentions, at the judges' discretion. All first place winners are invited to perform at the annual MTAC-LB Installation of Officers meeting on June 4.

If a student wins first place in a division, he or she may not play the following year in the same division, but may skip a year and compete again. However, the winner may compete the following year in a higher division. A division will be split when there are twenty or more entries.

## Wheeler, Harold P. Jr – Memorial Scholarship Award Dolly Ickler, Chair Entry Deadline April 1, 2017

The Harold Parker Wheeler, Jr. Memorial Fund was established in 1993 as a tribute to Harold Wheeler, a Past President of the MTAC Long Beach Branch. He was respected for his dedication to music and community service despite physical handicaps. Each spring a scholarship in his name is offered to a graduating high school senior who is a student of a Long Beach Branch member. The funds are provided by donations to the Wheeler Memorial Fund and the Wheeler Memorial Benefit Concert held each fall. The requirements are listed in the application form. Eligibility includes community service, good scholarship, and musicianship. The student must have used their musical gifts and/or other talents to enhance the lives of others in school and community. The recipient will be honored at the Installation of New Officers Meeting on June 4, 2017.
