SPEED BUMPS

We all would like to find ways to slow the traffic on South Temelec and one possible solution is Speed Bumps. The county has finally approved the policy that regulates Speed Bump installation but there are costs and a fair amount of regulatory hurdles to get them

installed. For South Temelec Circle two significant hurdles are: signoff by the Emergency Service Agency and the Transit Agency and there must be approval from 2/3rds of the residences in the target area. The cost for each Speed Bump is estimated to be \$35,000. If there is enough interest from residences on South Temelec Circle we could arrange to have a questionnaire sent to all residences to gauge support for the installation. Please let me, or one of the other Directors know if you support installing Speed Bumps. I have a copy of the County Policy and will send it to any interested resident. ~ Steve

TREASURERS REPORT Through the end of February 2021

It's still early in the year and we're doing okay so far, as our operating expenditures are under budget by about \$2697 for the year. Our operating cash position, less current liabilities, leaves us with a liquid cash position of about \$79,723, which should be sufficient to cover any surprises in the next couple of months plus

help cover some of the projects we LETTER FROM PAT CHACE have planned for this year. As for delinquent accounts, there are four homeowners who are in arrears for a total of about \$1928, and Strong Management is taking appropriate steps to follow up on these accounts.~ Ron Yamato

Hello neighbors. The rain seems to have helped the grass a bit, we are still working with Waldron to see what is the best course for healthy lawns. Waldron fertilized, aerated and reseeded them in February and will repeat that every four months.

The change from sprinklers to drip for the shrubs in front of the houses is progressing. We are up to 162 Saint James, having spent \$2000 and are authorized to go to \$5000.

IMPORTANT REMINDER TO **OBTAIN ACC APPROVAL**

If you're getting ready to do some exterior changes, repairs or painting to your house, don't forget that exterior projects must be approved by the Architectural Control Committee (ACC) BEFORE work begins. Request forms are available in the clubhouse, online at Chantarelle.org, from ACC committee members and from Strong Management. Completed forms must be submitted to the ACC at least 30 days before the start of the project to allow time for review and follow-up. When projects involve common-area fences shared by both the homeowner and the HOA. additional procedures mentioned in the March 2012 "Report on Common Area Fences" must be followed, including obtaining multiple bids. Adhering to ACC rules will ensure the continued coherence and beauty of the Chantarelle community, while at the same time maintaining the quality of life and desirability of residing here.

TOM'S RECIPE MEYER LEMON CRINKLE COOKIES

Prep Time: 20 minutes Cook Time: 15 minutes

Yield: 20 cookies Source: tutti-dolci.com



Ingredients

- 1 3/4 cups flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1/4 tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp cornstarch
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 cup sugar
- 3 Tbsp Meyer lemon zest
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, softened
- 1 large egg
- 1 Tbsp fresh Meyer lemon juice
- 1/2 tsp vanilla extract

For Rolling

1/2 cup sugar1/2 cup powdered sugar

Directions

Whisk together flour, baking powder, baking soda, cornstarch, and salt in a medium bowl. Place sugar and Meyer lemon zest in a food processor and pulse for one minute. Beat butter and Meyer lemon-sugar in a large mixer bowl at medium speed until creamy; beat in egg, lemon juice, and vanilla until combined. Reduce speed to low and gradually add flour mixture; beat just until incorporated. Cover dough and chill in the refrigerator for 3 to 4 hours or overnight.

Preheat oven to 350°F (if cookie dough has chilled overnight, let stand at room temperature for 30 minutes before baking). Line two baking sheets with parchment paper.

Place granulated sugar and powdered sugar in separate shallow bowls. Use a cookie scoop coated with nonstick spray to scoop 1 1/2-inch balls of dough. Drop the balls of dough in granulated sugar and roll to coat, then coat generously in powdered sugar. Place two inches apart on prepared baking sheets.

Bake, rotating pans halfway through, for 14 to 15 minutes, until edges are set and tops are matte (not shiny). Cool for 10 minutes on baking sheets, then transfer to a wire rack to cool completely. Store in an airtight container at room temperature.

Make Ahead Crinkle Cookies

Make the dough in advance, roll into balls and freeze on a baking sheet for 1 hour, then transfer to an airtight container in the freezer for up to 2 months. Just before baking, roll the cookie dough in granulated sugar, coat in powered sugar, and bake as directed, adding 1-2 minutes to baking time.

Freeze Crinkle Cookies

To freeze baked cookies, allow them to cool completely on a wire rack. Freeze flat on a baking sheet for 1 hour, then transfer to an airtight container in the freezer for up to 2 months.
