Effective November 3, 2022, the annual and the renewal fees will be \$16 for the following individual licensees:

- Colorado/FINRA Sales Representative
- Mortgage Sales Representative
- SEC Investment Adviser Representative
- State-Registered Investment Adviser Representative

Effective November 3, 2022, the annual and the renewal fees will be \$59 for the following entities:

- Colorado/FINRA Broker-Dealer
- Mortgage Broker-Dealer
- SEC Investment Adviser Notice Filed
- State-Registered Investment Adviser
