Author of 'Buried Beneath Cleveland: Lost Cemeteries of Cuyahoga County'

The dead do not always rest in peace. Occasionally, they wind up in the backyard. As towns grew in Cuyahoga county during the late 1800's, many of its cemeteries were relocated to make room for urban sprawl. but not all of these graves made the journey,

Author William G. Krejci tracks down more than fifty displaced cemeteries thought the Greater Cleveland area. Discover the Revolutionary War veterans, famous scientists and illustrious dignitaries found beneath gas stations and grocery stores in this eerie history of Cuyahoga County's forgotten dead. The program being presented will share may of those incredible stories, but will also focus on those closer to Strongsville, including the long forgotten Strongsville Baptist Church Burying Ground.
