The sermons discuss in depth what it means to be a Unitarian Universalist as individuals, in our communities and in the world at large. Jim McMurray will read the sermons by Rev. Greeley and Gail Marsh Saxer will read sermons by Rev. Nemser.

Following the readings, the congregation will explore its own reactions, thoughts and responses to the sermons.

The Rev. Rudolph William Nemser, a social activist, poet, liturgist, and teacher, was minister of the Princeton UU Society. He was a president of the Joseph Priestley District and of the Murray Grove Association. He initiated the annual John Murray Distinguished Lectures presented at General Assemblies and helped promote their publication.

The Rev. W. Bradford Greeley was minister of the Main Line Unitarian Church in Devon, PA. He and Rev. Nemser were friends and worked together in the creation of this set of readings which were shared by both their churches.
