

Feather Lake Wildlife Sanctuary

Opens Beginning October 4th

Feather Lake, the El Paso area's only designated wildlife sanctuary, opens to the public this year on Saturday, October4, with new, expanded hours. It will be open 8:00am to noon every Saturday and 2:00pm to dusk every Sunday until the end of April. Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop Drive in El Paso's lower valley, 0.4 miles west of Americas Avenue. Admission is free.

Feather Lake is a cooperative venture of the City of El Paso and the El Paso/Trans-Pecos Audubon Society. The basin is part of the City's storm-water control system; the Audubon Society leases the basin from the City and manages it as a wildlife and environmental education area. The sanctuary's wetlands and woodland fringe provide, within the City's limits, examples of highly productive wildlife habitats once much more common in the El Paso area.

Each winter, the lake attracts thousands of ducks and other water birds. Over the years, 178 different species have been found there. Bird numbers are just now building up at Feather Lake as fall migrants move into the area. Among the highlights are large numbers of Cattle Egret and Yellow-headed Blackbirds that arrive at the end of each day to roost for the night.

Feather Lake is also available by appointment during the week for tours by school classes, scout groups, civic groups and others. For information, contact 532-9645.

The El Paso and Hueco Tanks Christmas Bird Counts are scheduled for Saturday, December 27 and Saturday, January 3. We don't know which count will be on which day yet, but we do know we want you to join us. Please mark your calendars for some fun days afield. Fall Is For The Birds At Feather Lake by, John Sproul

In late August and early September, as migrants headed south, the mix of birds changed daily at our Feather Lake Wildlife Sanctuary. Included were 4 species new to the sanctuary -- Virginia's Warbler, Northern Waterthrush, Scott's Oriole and Lesser Goldfinch — bringing the species total for Feather Lake to 179. In early September, numbers of roosting Cattle Egrets climbed quickly, and, later in the month, Yellowheaded Blackbird numbers began to build.

Feather Lake opened to the public October 4 and will be open through the end of April. Hours are 8:00am to noon on Saturdays and 2:00pm to dusk on Sundays. Feather Lake is located at 9500 N. Loop in El Paso's lower valley. Admission is free.

Remember, keeping Feather Lake open to the public depends on volunteers. Like you! Can you spend a Saturday morning or Sunday afternoon this year staffing out sanctuary during visitor hours? Please contact Charles Simpson (598-2274) to volunteer. The work is easy, enjoyable and an important part of our education efforts.

Another great chance for a sunset visit comes Saturday, October 11, when our annual pot-luck dinner at Feather Lake takes place. Check out the details in "On the Trail" and please plan to join us.

A Wild Weekend!

Looking for a chance to get outdoors and celebrate our local environment? You've got lots of options the weekend of October 17-19. Three major events will be on tap in the El Paso area; the annual Interpretive Fair at Hueco Tanks State Historical Park, Día del Río and the Celebration of Our Mountains.

Hueco Tanks Interpretive Fair

On Friday, October 17, take in a slide show on birds of Hueco Tanks, beginning at 8:00pm in the Park amphitheater. On Saturday, the Buffalo Soldiers (a Texas Parks & Wildlife living-history group) arrive to set up camp, including an evening campfire. On Sunday, tours, speakers, demonstrations and exhibits will keep you going throughout the day. On both Saturday and Sunday, there will be a bird identification tour starting at 8:00am.

Dia del Rio

This event takes place Saturday, October 18th throughout the Rio Grande Basin, from Colorado to the Gulf of Mexico. The aim is to focus attention on the river and our need to take better care of it. In the El Paso/Juárez area, the day starts at the Chamizal National Memorial at 10:00am. A participatory arts celebration will include river banners, mural making workshops, sculpture, storytelling, a forum on "The Role of the Arts in Community Spirit and Environmental Awareness" and more. At 1:00pm, there will be a lively procession across the Cordova Bridge to Juárez, where festive, artistic, ceremonial and educational activities will continue throughout the day.

Volunteer activities are an important part of Día del Río. Earlier in the week, students from St. Clement's School will be helping at our Feather Lake Wildlife Sanctuary as a Día del Río undertaking.

Celebration of Our Mountains

The mountains of our region are the focus of this event, which features field trips throughout the October 18-19 weekend. Some will emphasize archeology; some geology, some biology, and some all three. Destinations include the Sierra Tarahumara, the Samalayuca region, the Jornada Experimental Range north of Las Cruces, Alamo Canyon near Ft. Hancock, and multiple sites in the Franklin Mountains. 

SEEN ANY BANDED BURROWING OWLS?

The Canadian Wildlife Service has been banding Burrowing Owls in Saskatchewan. Each bird wears a U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service metal band plus some combination of color bands. Observers are asked to note the colors and exact sequence of all bands. The colors used in recent years are red, yellow, green, black and white. It is important to note which leg carries particular color(s) (and it may be three colors) and, where used together, whether the color band is above or below the metal band. Should you encounter one of these birds, please report your observation, including as much information as possible, to;



AUDUBON ADVENTURES

Thirty El Paso area teachers already receive Audubon Adventures in their classroom!

Thirty El Paso area teachers in grades 3 through 6 have been enrolled in the 1997-1998 Audubon Adventures program. Audubon Adventures is a curriculum enhancement program that teaches children science, environmental topics and respect for nature. The classroom materials are written and developed by professional educators and present basic scientifically accurate facts about birds, wildlife, and their habits and needs. The program developes student skills in multiple disciplines and supports the teaching standards reccommended by the

National Academy of Science and the National Research Council.

There is a cost of \$35.00 for each classroom kit and your Board of Directors has approved the funding for this eductional endeavor. 
