Dear Parishioners,

I am very blessed that the Lord has given me the gift of two amazing parishes. I would like to thank everyone for the support you have given me as a new priest leader as I finish up my second month here in Crestline and Bethlehem. In seminary my teachers drilled in my head to never make any changes in your first year as a pastor. We were told throughout seminary from teachers, spiritual directors and business gurus to stay the course and continue to do the same things practiced and set in place the prior year. Such phrases were repeated to us as, "OBSERVE ONLY! SIMPLY OBSERVE YOUR FIRST YEAR MEN! Get to know the parishes after a year and then make some moves. Don't even move a candle your first year there." Well.... seminary doesn't prepare you for everything and frankly nothing could have prepared us for the summer of 2020. Yes I have certainly neglected such advice from past formators. Not only have I moved a few candles but as you noticed I even moved an entire Mass to the Convocation Center in Crestline. LOL

In all of this you have been so supportive. Truly I have made quite a few risky changes I never thought I would make in my first year, let alone my first couple of months on the job. Indeed we moved our 10:30am Sunday Mass from the church to the Convocation Center and this was a huge risk on my part. In my opinion the move has been a good one so far. Each week more and more people attend and each week has welcomed people who have not received the Eucharist since the pandemic began around 6 months ago. Thank you for supporting me in this risk and for going to receive Jesus in this different location. I gotta admit the night before the first Convo Mass I thought to myself, "What have I done! Will anyone show up? Will the people still receive Jesus in a location outside of our beautiful church?" Yes I sometimes worry too much. I know the masks and social distancing rules are somewhat strict even for my personal views but I felt it necessary to bring our elderly back to our Eucharistic Lord. They have held our parish together through the years and they should not be deprived of Jesus in the Eucharist. I don't blame anyone for hating the advanced social distancing directives of that Mass, because I too hate having to be distanced and masked from the beautiful people of Crestline. It is truly weird to only know some of you by your eyes having never seen your mouths covered by masks, but maybe someday I will see your entire faces. (Hahaha) Thank you St. Joseph Crestline for supporting me in this risky... yet prudent move!

Not only have I been part of some risks at St. Joseph's but also over in Bethlehem we have a flare for taking chances. Similar to the move at Crestline I believe our risk paid off as well over at the Settlement. Many of you might be thinking, "What risk?" Well I don't know about you all but in my eyes the festival was risky business. Yet for you it was probably business as usual since you always come up big on that Sunday in July. Indeed the risk paid off and this year we made more money than last year's festival even though we only really had food and raffles. Like the night before our first Convocation Mass at St. Joseph I thought to myself on the Vigil of the festival, "What have we done!? We are having a festival in the midst of a pandemic! This is crazy!" But once again the risk paid off. But was it really a risk when we have the great Altar & Rosary Officers and the festival chairmen organizing the whole event? Was it really a risk when our Sacred Heart parishioners always show up along with our St Joseph twin parishioners giving support? What a proud papa I was of my twins that day... and every day of course. Yes, it took the entire parish to make it happen, but the officers and chairmen did a great job organizing the fest (without any notes or past experience to go by), and they literally worked their tails off that day. What a success!!!

I can't make any promises but I hope my Daredevil ways will cool down now that I'm finally starting to get settled in my first role as pastor. Maybe I should have waited until I finally got my 90 day review before taking you on such a rollercoaster ride? Oh well. After this summer of bold moves I hope that I can finally obey my instructor's advice and finally take the year to "OBSERVE ONLY" and trust the plan placed before me. But as you know this is the year 2020 and tomorrow is truly unpredictable. Thanks for supporting me in these risks and in these changes that are not easy for anyone.
