

The Word of God Alive: Discussing the Readings with your children

What are some rules that you need to follow at Home? Why do you think your parent or parents have these rules?

In Jesus' time, Pharisees and scribes were leaders in the Jewish synagogue, a place where the people gathered to pray. In today's Gospel, some Pharisees and scribes question Jesus because the disciples were eating without first completing the Jewish purification rituals. The Pharisees and scribes believe that Jesus' disciples cannot be considered holy or religious if they do not follow the Jewish traditions.

Jesus defends his friends. He explains to the Pharisees and scribes that it is not the food you put in your mouth that makes someone unholy. It is the words that come out of our mouths and our actions that show whether we live as children of God. Jesus is trying to help them understand that following the rules is just the first step. The rules should also guide our hearts, and the change of heart should show in our words and actions.

What are the Commandments? Can you name some? Why do you think God gives us the Commandments?

Just as our parents give us rules to follow out of love, God gives us the Ten Commandments because he loves us. When we follow the Ten Commandments, we behave or act in a way that shows our love for God and others. We grow in holiness. Our attitudes and actions change, and we follow God's laws with our heart. We become more loving, more generous, more like Christ.

Religious Education News

Religious Education classes for students will begin on Sunday, September 15th. Registration forms are located on the

bulletin board outside the Religious Education Office and on our website www.olvshippensburg.org. A reminder that the Diocese of Harrisburg requires a two year sacramental preparation for First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. Class time for grades kindergarten through 8th grade is from 9:30 AM to 10:45 AM on most Sunday mornings during the school year.

The preschool class meets on Sundays from 9:30 AM to 10:30 AM in the church basement (across from Mary's Kitchen). The children are taught Catholic prayers, traditions, and Bible stories-along with crafts and activities. (In a fun and nurturing setting!)
