<u>Making Disciples of Jesus who Make Disciples of Jesus</u> ----With Pastor Eric

I've had a small voice inside my head that I hope is the "Holy Spirit!" When I feel lost in my schedule, or if someone asks me about my purpose in ministry and I need focus, I hear this small voice say, "Disciples who make disciples." I believe that I have to pay more attention to this guidance especially as a pastor. Here is where I'm at today in my reflection. What does it mean to be a disciple of Jesus the Christ? Well, Christian disciples are followers of Jesus. I believe that disciples are made over time and require a community to mentor and coach, as well as the resources of God's Word and the ever present Holy Spirit to form and direct our inner and outer being. What does the Bible say about following Jesus?

"If anyone wants to be my disciples, then let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." (Matthew 16:24) I was impressed by Peter Marty's article on "Fear" in the Living Lutheran, April, 2016. He writes that "taking up our cross" is really about facing our fears. I like that idea since there seems to be a great deal to fear in our world. Disciples of Jesus can face their fears but first they need to look outside of themselves. "Deny self" points outward to the power and presence of fellow human beings who are struggling like you and I, in order to find strength together to face our fears. Thus, God gathers a community which we call the church, or what Jesus refers to as the "two or three gathered together in his name." (Matthew 18:20)

Following Jesus implies the need for community. Our community of faith is forming by both God's Word which is speaking to us, and the Holy Spirit, who gathers, enlightens and sets us apart for growing and making other followers of Jesus. As a community, we practice the disciplines of growth and formation to include Sunday school, Confirmation, Small Groups, prayer in and outside of worship, participation in service projects, all for the purpose of knowing the shepherd and one another more intimately.

Having considered the practices of "making disciples" we will be sending out surveys this summer to help us target topics and interests that will serve to grow the community and encourage faithful living as followers of Jesus. In the fall season, we will have scheduled "round tables" in which we will invite guests to inform and teach us about topics that impact our lives. As we graduate into another summer of sunshine and warmth, let us take time to consider our community of faith with thanksgiving and its essential role in helping "make disciples who make disciples". Daring to Dream

Every day Taw Kaw Htoo pursues her dreams as a farmer, a child care provider and an English student. After fleeing violence and persecution in her native Burma, Taw Kaw Htoo lived in refugee camps in Thailand before being resettled to the U.S. She may have lost her home, but not her hope. With LSI's support, this strong, courageous woman is daring to dream.

Her day begins at dawn at LSI's Global Greens Farm where she farms a small plot, growing produce to sell to her community.

"I like farming because I grew vegetables back in my home country," she said.

After tending her crops, she moves on to her second business of the day: caring for children. LSI's child care business development program helps former refugees become state-licensed child care providers. Along with providing a small income, the program increases the availability of culturally appropriate child care for the refugee community, enabling more parents to enter the workforce.

"I didn't have any professional training on how to install a car seat or do CPR," said Taw Kaw Htoo. "LSI has helped with that. It's great that I am able to care for the children in my community."

Caring for children helps her pursue her third dream: learning English.

"My language is really important to me," she said. "I try to teach children my language every day, and they help me learn English. I really want to speak English. That's my biggest dream.
