

JESUS IS **RISEN!**


When Jesus' disciples saw that the stone was rolled away from his tomb, they knew he had risen. Make a moveable tomb to celebrate Easter.

What you need:

- 4 pieces of paper (brown, blue, black, yellow)
- Scissors
- Pencil
- · Glue stick
- Brad fastener
- Marker

What you do:

- Fold the brown paper in half, short side to short side. Cut along the fold. On one half, draw and cut out a large half-circle (the tomb). On the other, draw and cut out a palmsized circle (the stone).
- 2. Glue the brown tomb onto the blue paper.
- Cut a black circle (the inside of the tomb) the same size as the brown stone and glue it onto the brown tomb.
- Place the brown stone over the black half-circle; this is the entrance. Push the brad through one edge so the stone can move from side to side.
- Cut out a cross from the yellow paper and glue it by the tomb.
- Write "Jesus is risen!" atop the blue paper.

Bishop's Letter on Prayer Initiative

On April 2-8, the Virginia Conference will participate in a week of intentional prayer for the mission of The United Methodist Church and for the work of the Commission on a Way Forward which began meeting in January. This week of Praying Our Way Forward is an initiative of the Council of Bishops as a part of their larger commitment to lead the church in every part of the world in times of worship, study, discernment, confession and prayer for God's guidance.



Each annual conference in The United Methodist Church will participate in this prayer ministry which was launched on January 1 in the North Carolina Conference and will conclude in the West Angola Episcopal area in June 2018. Churches in each of the 16 districts of the Virginia Conference will be invited to participate in focused times of prayer by their district superintendents. In addition to participating in each conference's designated week of prayer, individuals are invited to join the initiative beyond the week of April 2-8 by praying daily and fasting weekly for the church, mission and future.

Two of our Own Honored by Local Civic League

On Monday, March 13th the River Forest Shores/Wayside Manor/Easton Place Civic League honored Lindell and Maria Davidson with the Lifetime Achievement Award.

Both Lindell and Maria have served for many years in the civic league as past president (several times), editor of the local newsletter and civic league historians.

Lindell and Maria were instrumental in advocating for an ambulance to be available from Fire Station 4 on Poplar Hall Drive. Prior to this any ambulance had to come from Station 10 on Virginia Beach Blvd. After a neighbor suffered a heart attack and had to wait an inordinate time for an ambulance the Davidson's convinced the Fire Chief to do a service study and they then proceeded to City Council. They were successful and as a result the neighbor has had faster medical service.

Many vast improvements has been accomplished as a result of Lindell and Maria's hard work. A side walk study was completed as requested by the city and many changes resulted from that study. They also helped with the acquisition of Military Gardens Park, getting handicapped ramps built, trees planted and worked to educate residents on light rail.

Aldersgate is grateful to have these two as members of our congregation where they have sang in the choir and served on various committees. Congratulations Lindell and Maria.
