Buildings will be completed in numerical order and a building will be completed approximately every two weeks.

Roof replacement Buildings for 2019 are: 59, 63, 85, 86 & 93.

Proposal for The Roof Company for roof replacement to be voted on. They have

1/3 cup crumbled feta cheese

4 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
2 tablespoons plain yogurt (sour cream may be substituted)
1 tablespoon freshly squeezed lemon juice
1 tablespoon red wine vinegar
1 small garlic clove, minced
1/4 teaspoon cumin

Bring Birds and Butterflies into View

Want to see birds and butterflies without using a birdfeeder? Consider adding a few native plants to attract them to your courtyard. You won't have to mess with birdseed, and the plants will add a splash of color to your area.

The National Audubon Society's native plants database at www.audubon.org has lots of information on plants that will attract birds as well as butterflies. Just enter your Zipcode and search the type of bird you'd like to visit your yard. Here are a few plants that will attract butterflies and hummingbirds and well as other birds:

Butterfly Milkweed (orange milkweed) grows in clumps up to three feet tall; its clusters of bright orange to yellow-orange flowers attract butterflies, hummingbirds, wrens and finches.

Marsh Blazing Star grows up to four feet tall with a tall spike of rose-purple or white flower heads. Wood warblers, waxwings and orioles like this plant, as well as hummingbirds and

butterflies.

Beebalm also grows up to four feet tall. Its clusters of lavender, pink or white flowers attract hummingbirds, butterflies, bees, chickadees, titmice and waxwings.

Make Your Own Weed Killer

I posted this last year, and this recipe is worth repeating. Avoid buying expensive weed killers, and try this "Weed-Be-Gone" recipe from www.naturalnews.com:

1 gallon vinegar2 cups Epsom salt¼ cup Dawn dish soap

Just mix and spray in the morning, after the dew has evaporated. Go back after dinner and the weeds are all gone!

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
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
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
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
