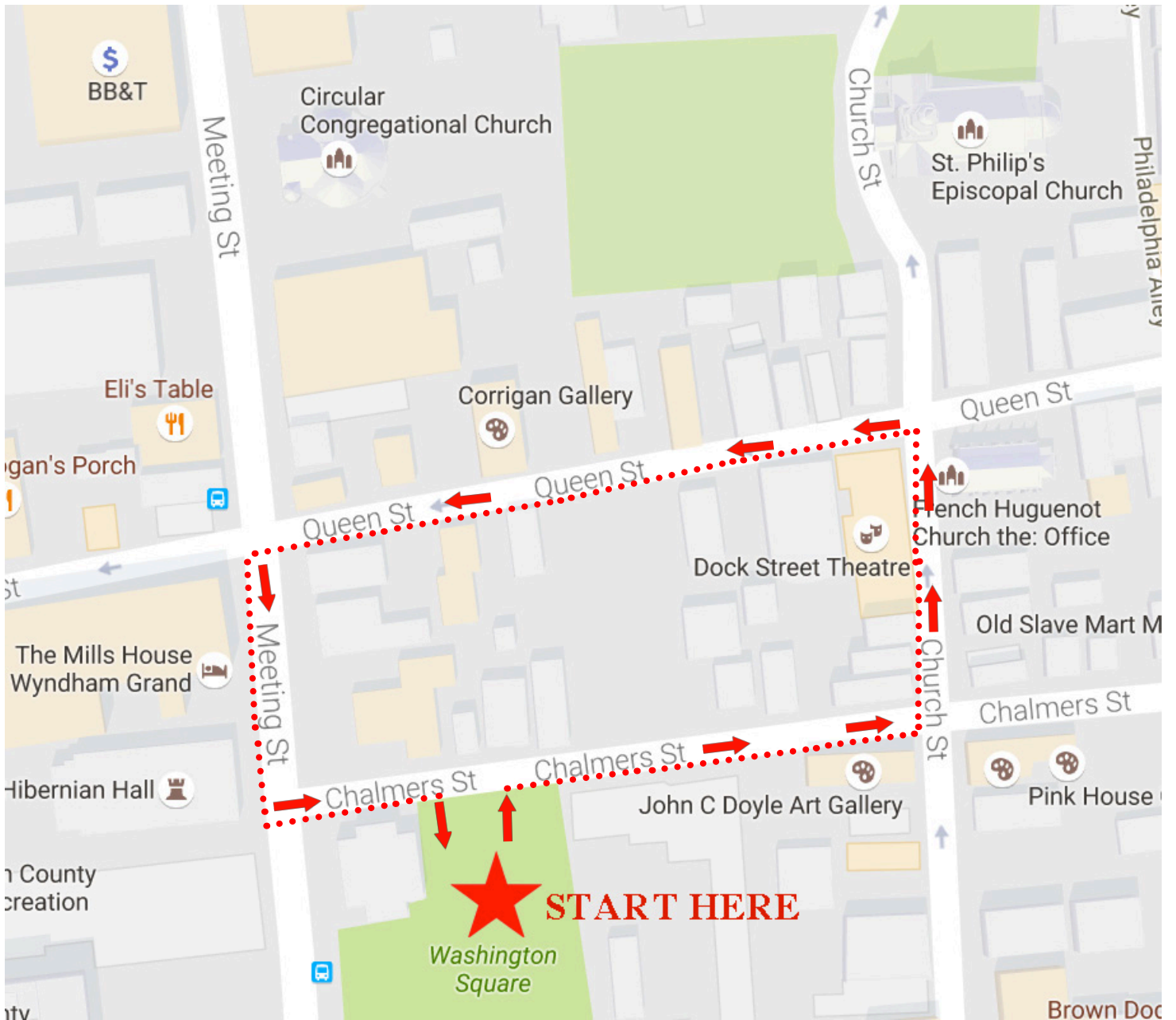
THIS COURSE MIGHT BE FOR YOU IF.....

- If you love taking pictures on your iphone, or point and shoot camera but need a little help figuring out how to take your photos to the next level.
- If you are looking for a fun activity where you get some fresh air, exercise, and a look around some of Charleston's historical hidden gems.
- If you need a gift for someone who seems to have everything but is interested in photography.
- If you want something fun to do in the evening with your partner, friend, or family.
- If you just can't seem to figure out how all those people on instagram get awesome iphone photos.
- If you might be interested in photography, but want to dip your toe in before committing to buying a big expensive camera or signing up for in-depth classes.
- If your kids say that you seriously need to figure out how to take a better selfie....then YEP! this class might be for you!

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW BEFORE SIGNING UP:

1. **Please know how to use your iphone or camera** prior to signing up for this class. This is an iphone *photography* class, not an iphone class. We WON'T be covering 'how to use your camera feature' or "what settings you should shoot in" in this class. What we WILL cover, is how to get *better* photos than what you have been *currently* taking.
2. **This is NOT a class to learn how to use your DSLR camera.** If you are interested in learning about manual camera settings for a DSLR camera this is not the class for you. This class is designed for people with very basic point-and-shoot cameras or an iphone. I do offer a "Photography Basics 101" workshop where I will cover camera mechanics such as aperture, shutter speed, and ISO. Email me about it! info@melissamileyphotography.com
3. **Please read the 'topics covered' description** and be prepared to learn about these specific topics. Although I love answering questions, I will be doing my best to stay on topic and follow this outline so that everyone is able to learn what they signed up for.
4. **DO ASK QUESTIONS!** No question is dumb or silly. If you are wondering something, chances are someone else is wondering too.
5. **Wear walking shoes and something comfortable.** We will be outside and walking approx .5 mile.
6. **Bring your camera or iphone.** This goes without saying. ;)
7. **Please be prompt.** Workshop will begin walking exactly at time listed- don't get left behind!.
8. **HAVE FUN!!!!** This is NOT a classroom setting....it's a stroll down some of Charleston's most beautiful and historic streets. So take it all in and don't get too serious!

WALKING OUTLINE AND TOPICS COVERED:

START AT WASHINGTON SQUARE PARK- THE ARCH, BUILT IN 1889

Lighting- how to handle backlighting, how to find 'good' lighting, best time of day to shoot, working with the light, tap to expose on iphone

CHALMERS COBBLE STONE STREET- "LABOR LANE" AS EARLY AS 1790

Lines- how they can enhance or distract your photos, what are leading lines, how to look for and utilize leading lines, how to be aware of foreground and background, using lines to 'frame' your subject.

THE DOCK STREET THEATRE- BUILT IN 1809

Composition- Rule of thirds, centering your photos, how to crop, how to compose a shot, what is negative space and how to use it like a pro.

ST. PHILLIP'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH- BUILT IN 1836

Angles- how to get both the background and the subject in the photo, how to look best in photos, trying different angles for a unique shot, and alas....the art of the notorious 'selfie'
