




Chevron Log Cabin
96" x 96"



Materials

- * 4 ¹/₂ yard Cream
- * ³/₄ yard Yellow
- * 1 ¹/₄ yard 1st Blue
- * 1 ³/₄ yard 2nd Blue
- * 2 ⁵/₈ yard 3rd Blue
- * ⁷/₈ yard binding
- * 9 yards backing (42/45" wide)


Step 1: Cut Block Pieces as follows:



- A: 36 3rd Blue, 36 Cream (2.5" x 14.5")
- B: 36 2nd Blue, 36 Cream (2.5" x 12.5")
- C: 36 3rd Blue (2.5" x 16.5")
- D: 36 2nd Blue, 36 Cream (2.5" x 10.5")
- E: 36 1st Blue, 36 Cream (2.5" x 8.5")

- F: 36 1st Blue, 36 Cream (2.5" x 6.5")
- G: 36 Cream (2.5" x 4.5")
- H: 36 Yellow (4.5" square)


Step 2: With right sides together, using 1/4" seam allowances, sew strip G to the side of square H. Repeat for all 36 blocks Press seams toward outside strip.




Step 3: Using the same technique from Step 2, sew cream strip F to the bottom of the unit created in Step 2.

Repeat for all 36 blocks.


Press toward outside strip





Step 4: Using the same techniques from step 3 & 4, sew 1st Blue strip F to right side of block from Step 3. Be careful to place light & dark strips on correct side of block from step 3.



Step 5: Using the same techniques from prior steps, sew 1st Blue strip E to top of block from Step 4. Be careful to place light & dark strips on correct side of block from step 3.



Step 6: Using the same techniques from prior steps, continue around the square adding each strip as shown in the diagram.



Block should measure 16.5"

Step 7: Lay out your blocks on a design wall, bed or table to get the placement of your quilt just as you desire. You will see that Log Cabin blocks give many different designs just by turning the block. Mark placement of rows & positions in rows to insure proper placement as you transfer each row to the sewing machine. (R1, B2 {row 1, block2})

Step 8: With right sides together, using 1/4" seam allowances, assemble each row. Press seams toward darker fabric.

Step 9: With right sides together, using 1/4" seam allowances, sew assembled rows from Step 7 into completed top.

Step 10: Quilt as desired and bind.

You may use this pattern to make quilts for any purpose, including resale.

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
