### Gaming News

The U.K. There are media reports that a senior government minister in the United Kingdom says he is pondering whether or not to introduce legislation that would completely ban the use of credit cards in gambling. According to a report in the Guardian newspaper, Minister Jeremy Wright says he might hold meetings with a range of retail banks and bookmakers in order to discuss the matter. He says he has discovered that up to 20% of wagers placed with some sports betting locations were paid with credit cards.

Massachusetts. Court records in Massachusetts show that regulators are completing what became a yearlong investigation of the former Chief Officer for Wynn Resorts Limited, Steve Wynn. The officials are now awaiting the results of a similar investigation in Nevada. Despite assertions that he was innocent, Wynn eventually resigned his position with Las Vegas-based Wynn Resorts Limited. The Massachusetts action resulted from charges dealing with possible irregularities in plans for a never-built casino that would have been called the Wynn Boston Harbor Resort.

**Macau**. At least one international brokerage firm, Sanford Bernstein, says that income from the more than 30 casinos in Macau has

risen only slightly. Meanwhile, financial researchers say that ongoing weakness in the Chinese economy may lead to smaller volumes of cash being wagered at casinos in Macau. The last real uptick in business in Macau came back in 2015.

New Jersey. The Hard Rock Hotel and Casino in Atlantic City used the winter holidays as the basis for a promotion that featured a Christmastime sleigh. The promotion handed out over \$400,000 in prizes to eligible inhouse players. The holiday-time promotion featured drawings every fifteen minutes. The Hard Rock in Atlantic City is the former Trump Taj Mahal. It is located on the historic Atlantic City Boardwalk.

### **Pro Cyclist Helps Host Singo Bingo in**

Former professional cyclist Levi Leipheimer-a Tour de France podium winner, three-time champion of the AmgenTour in California, and advocate for marginalized youth-served as host of a special Bingo event sponsored by Coffey Strong, an organization formed after fire destroyed the Coffey Park community in Santa Rosa, California. Admission covered 24 games of Bingo (and a free dauber!), there were prizes and drawings, and beer and wine were for sale in addition to a taco/fajita bar. The event was one of many the community has sponsored with the goal of bringing the community of Coffey Park closer together after thousands of residents either lost their homes or suffered other losses as a result of a massive 2017 fire.

### Illinois Governor-**Elect Calls Bingo**

Prior to being sworn in as the 43rd governor of the Illinois, J. B. Pritzker traveled throughout the state for a pre-inauguration Day of Service, during which he participated in thirteen events that highlighted and encouraged volunteerism. Among his stops was Downer Place of Lutheran Social Services of Illinois, an apartment complex for senior citizens in Aurora, the second largest city in the state. Several members of Boys II Men, an Aurora-based mentoring organization for at-risk youth, served meals to the 65 residents who attended the event, which included remarks from the governor-elect as well as games of Bingo, for which Pritzker served as the caller.

# Massachusetts

Quincy, Massachusetts, seniors got the chance to socialize with friends, play Bingo, and listen to classic songs from the '50s and '60s during Singo Bingo—an event sponsored by the Quincy Council on Aging at the Quincy Kennedy Center. Singo Bingo replaces the numbers and letters of a traditional Bingo card with song titles. Players checked off boxes on their cards as the DJ played songs. Five in a row got Bingo. About 50 people attended the event that at times was as much a singalong as it was a Bingo game. Organizers plan to repeat Singo Bingo in the future.

### **Bingo Hall Shooting**

Police have reported that a man opened fire inside a crowded VFW Post Bingo in Evansville, Indiana, while Bingo was in session. Several hundred people were reportedly inside preparing for the next Bingo game when they heard a loud "bang," a witness said. Evansville Police Sgt. Mark Saltzman said one person was shot with a revolver in the left side of his chest. Saltzman says the shooter and the victim knew each other and had an ongoing personal dispute. Three people reportedly tackled the gunman and took the gun from his hands. The man was restrained until police arrived and took him into custody. The victim was taken to the hospital and treated for non-life-threatening injuries, and eventually released.



### A Rift over Splitting


Hi Guy,

and got \$50, which again I split with my cousin.

# The VA Is All Ears

Between the fall of 2017 and September 2018, 1.6 million of us were surveyed about our trust in Department of Veterans Affairs health care after we'd had an outpatient appointment for anything from physical therapy and primary care to cardiology and mental health. A VA press release says that our trust level in VA health care rose 2.4 percent during that period. The trust number now is at 88 percent, with a VA target goal of 90 percent by September 2019.

There's another number, however, buried in the actual survey results, that might be even more important. Respondents were asked to reply on a scale of 1-5 (Strongly Disagree to Strongly Agree) to the following statement: "I trust VA to fulfill our country's commitment to Veterans." The current tally for that is only 67 percent. Per the survey's goal statement, the VA is hoping to raise that number to 90 percent in one year.

Your best bet: If you receive a non-medical VA benefit or service and you get one of those surveys, respond. Fill it out. Be honest. A typical VA survey might get only a 20 percent response rate. If there's space to leave comments, do that.

If you're a veteran, caregiver, dependent or service provider (for example, a funeral home), and if you have an email address on record with the VA, you'll likely get an email invitation to participate within the quarter. If you're a veteran and you receive a health-care service, you'll likely get your email invitation to fill out the survey within two weeks.

Right now, they're listening. Don't let them set policy or rules (or budget) based on the opinion of only 20 percent of those surveyed. Make sure your voice is heard.



# Insuring a Good Hand

A friend of mine was watching me play blackjack in a casino. I was playing heads-up against the dealer in a double-deck game. He didn't say much to me while I was playing other than to give me an "atta boy" when I beat the dealer, or offer condolences when the dealer pulled a miracle draw to beat me.

After about forty-five minutes of playing, we broke for lunch. My friend queried me about some of the insurance bets that I made. "How come you sometimes insured your 20s and other times you didn't, and why did you insure your 7? I always thought you're supposed to insure your good hands and not your bad hands?" I proceeded to explain.

When you make the insurance bet, you are betting on the dealer's hand, not your hand. Specifically, you are betting that the dealer has a ten-value card in the hole for a blackjack. Insurance is a bad bet, I told him, but it's an even worse bet when you are holding a pair of 10s rather than a weak hand that contains no tens. I asked him, "Can you see why?"

He still looked confused, so I continued. If your hand contains two 10s, you've taken out of play two of the very cards that you are betting that the dealer has, making the odds worse compared to your holding a hand that contained no 10s.

"OK," he said, "Now I understand why it's worse to insure a 20 rather than a 7, but how come you sometimes insured your 20?"

I went on to explain that the reason the insurance bet, per se, is a bad bet for non-counters is because you're getting paid 2-1 on a bet that has greater than 2-1 odds against winning. But, if you were tracking the cards as they were played, which I was, insurance becomes a profitable play when the number of 10s in the remaining decks is greater than half the number of non-10s. Card-counting systems will alert you when this situation occurs, which is why the insurance bet can be profitable for card counters regardless of what hand they happen to be holding.

"Oh," he said, "So it's not whether you have a good hand like 20 that determines whether you make the insurance bet, but rather if the remaining cards are loaded with 10s. I guess I should stop insuring my good hands until I learn card counting." I smiled and said, "Now you've got it!"

# **Lottery Error Corrected**

The Washington, D.C. Lottery is paying out thousands of dollars to people with losing tickets after reporting the wrong winning numbers due to "human error.' Once the mistake was discovered, lottery officials announced the correct set of winning numbers and decided to pay out both the actual winning numbers as well as the numbers that were announced by mistake. According to the D.C. Lottery, 773 losing tickets were designated as winners because of the error. Total value of winnings for those tickets was nearly \$128,000. People with tickets from the drawing have been given until June 10, 2019 to cash them in at the D.C. Lottery Prize Center. New software has been installed to the lottery draw system to ensure the error cannot reoccur.

# **Shopping Spree Includes \$40 Million Lotto Prize**

A Canadian woman has become almost \$40 million richer, all because she decided to brave the winter weather for a shopping excursion. Michelle De Roma of Surrey, British Columbia, purchased the winning ticket to a Lotto Max draw during a shopping trip to an outlet mall. De Roma plays the lottery weekly and her winning numbers were randomly generated through a quick pick. She plans to use her winnings to buy a new home for herself and her family, travel, and invest in real estate.

# Ticket Claimed Just Days Before Expiration

Eighty-five-year-old Bob Hissom of Plymouth, Michigan, bought a winning lottery ticket Jan. 1, 2018 but didn't cash it in until it was about to expire. The winning saga began last year when he bought Lotto tickets like he does every week at a local market, including a Lucky for Life easy pick with a payout of \$25,000 a year for life. Hissom keeps all his old tickets in a tin box, including the Jan. 1 ticket he thought was a loser. Months later he saw a story on the news about an unclaimed winning ticket, and out of curiosity decided to check his tin of old ones. That's when he found the winner, just days before expiration. Due to his advanced age, Hissom opted for a lump sum payment of \$390,000 before taxes.

### Ground Broken on "Garage Mahal"

Construction can now start on a planned 1.25-million square foot "mega-resort" in the "Old Town" section of Las Vegas. The facility will boast 777 rooms and a 44-story tower. Lured by an ad on a Website, people in and around Las Vegas pre-paid either \$10 for a "one-pound crab dinner" or \$50 for a unbelievable, unlimited crab and gourmet buffet that featured champagne. When they arrived with their tickets at the address listed they found a

high-rise office building and NO restaurant or buffet. The incident could serve as a warning about come-ons and gimmicks in any tourist city that ARE too good to be true.

### **World Series of Darts**

A press release indicates that the **Professional Darts Corporation World Series of Darts North** American championship and the US Darts Masters finals are returning to Las Vegas for the third year in a row. The competitions, to be held in July, will be at the Mandalay Bay Convention Center. After qualifications, eight players will vie for the North American title and a place in the 2019-2020 World Darts Championship on July 4. The same eight players will compete in the US Darts Masters along with eight top PDC stars in the main World Series of Darts event on July 4 and 5. Some U.S. bars feature dartboards, but the sport is huge in Europe.

### Pro Makes an Amazing Call at The Final Table

Poker can be monotonous, at least as far as hands are concerned. Straights, flushes and full houses will get the heart beating faster, but what's truly exciting these days is when a player makes an unbelievable call.

That's exactly what happened when poker pro David Peters, who has more than \$30 million in lifetime earnings, made a mindboggling call in a \$5,000-buyin, eight-handed no-limit hold 'em event at the Seminole Rock 'N' Roll Poker Open in Orlando, Florida.

At the final table, with eight players remaining and blinds at 5,000-10,000 plus an ante of 10,000, Will Givens raised under the gun, and Peters called from the big blind with Kd Qh.

Two picture cards (also known as "paint cards") are certainly strong enough to call and take a flop with, so the preflop action was pretty standard.

When the flop came down Ad 9d 3c, Peters check-called a bet of 30,000. While he didn't make a pair, Peters still had the nut no-pair hand plus a backdoor

diamond draw. Given this, he opted to call and see another card.

The Ks turn paired Peters, but he still had to be cautious with an ace on board. He checked, and Givens bet 50,000. Whether or not he actually had an ace, Givens was betting as if he did. Not to be deterred, Peters called.

"I felt that there were a lot of small pairs, a lot of low suited connectors - queen-jack, jack-ten suited type hands - that would keep barreling," Peters said, explaining his turn call.

When the Jd completed the board on the river, Peters checked for a third time and Givens moved all in.

Peters, who had the shorter stack with 228,000 behind, was put to the test. Could he really call with second pair against an under-the-gun raiser who bet every street?

He could, and he did.

Givens shook his head, showed a 5s 6s bluff, and said: "I think you're the only player that makes that call. What a beastly call."

Peters later explained his rationale for making such an incredible call:

"I was blocking the nut flush, and the ace, jack and nine are all out there, so there aren't too many combos of flushes. I don't think he'd bet that sizing on the flop with top set. I block queen-ten suited. I don't think he'd immediately go all in with two pair or a set or hands like that. I thought there were a lot of hands like he had that are trying to blow me off a nine. I have a lot of weakish ace-x type hands that are obligated to call the turn. So, I felt he was trying to blow me off a lot of those hands. So, I called. It worked out.'





I need help with a special Easter dinner this year. My husband's family will be here from out of town. Please give me some ideas. This will be their first time in our new home. Thank you. — Marie C. from Greensboro, NC

### Dear Marie,

I am going to share three of my favorite recipes with you. The carrot soup is superb. The salad is very tasty and a little unusual—if radicchio is not available, substitute with endive or bib lettuce. Adjust the amount of lettuce you use, if necessary. The lamb should make a very good impression with your family and guests. I would also include a green vegetable, a roasted white or sweet potato, and your favorite dessert. Good luck! — Annie

### SAVORY CARROT WITH **FENNEL SOUP**

1 bulbs fennel, sliced thin ½ tablespoon olive oil 2 pounds carrots, peeled and sliced

3 cups vegetable stock

3 cups water

1/4 teaspoon white pepper Salt to taste, optional

In a fry pan, sauté the fennel in olive oil until transparent. Combine fennel, carrots and vegetable stock in a large saucepot. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer until carrots are tender. Puree soup in a food processor or blender, working in batches. Return pureed soup to the large saucepot. Add the water. Simmer until heated throughout. Stir in pepper and salt to taste, if desired. Simmer additional 30 minutes. Serves 8.

### RADICCHIO SALAD CUPS

1 1/2 cups crumbled Gorgonzola cheese

2/3 cup chopped walnuts 1 medium apple, chopped 1/4 cup olive oil

2 teaspoons white wine vinegar 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard 1/8 teaspoon pepper

8-10 radicchio leaves

In a large bowl, combine the cheese, walnuts and chopped apple. In a small bowl, whisk the oil, vinegar, mustard and pepper. Divide the radicchio leaf (or substitute lettuce of your choice) into 10 cups or small bowls. Spoon 1/4 cup of the cheese, walnut and apples over the individual salad cups. Then drizzle the oil and vinegar mixture. Serves 10.

### **ROSEMARY ROASTED LAMB**

½ cup olive oil 3 garlic cloves minced

- 1 tablespoon kosher salt
- 1 tablespoon minced fresh rosemary

1 leg of lamb (7-9 pounds)

In a small bowl, combine the oil, garlic, salt and rosemary. Rub over the lamb. Cover and refrigerate overnight. Place the lamb, flat side up, on a rack in a shallow roasting pan. Bake uncovered at 425-degrees for 20 minutes. Insert a meat thermometer into the thickest part of the lamb roast. Reduce the heat to 350-degrees and bake for 2 to 2-1/4 hours longer, or until the meat reaches 145-degrees medium rare, 160-degreees medium, or 170-degrees well done. Baste occasionally with the pan juices. Let stand for 15 minutes before slicing. Serves 8 to 10
