### Biblical Illustration

Genesis 6:14-16. (Illustration Purposes!)

<sup>14</sup> Make yourself an ark of cypress<sup>[b]</sup> wood; make rooms in the ark, and cover it inside and out with pitch. <sup>15</sup> This is how you are to make it: the length of the ark three hundred cubits, its width fifty cubits, and its height thirty cubits. <sup>16</sup> Make a roof<sup>[c]</sup> for the ark, and finish it to a cubit above; and put the door of the ark in its side; make it with lower, second, and third decks.



#### Biblical Illustration

- Noah was asked to do something he had never done!
- Noah told by God to build the Ark
- He was strong in faith and chosen for the task but had to deal with...
  - Emotions
  - No example
  - Naysayers!
  - Threat of Failure

# Contemporary Application



- It's a Different World

- \* DESPITE ALL THE PLANNING THERE WAS NO CHAPTER IN THE MANUAL FOR WHAT 2020 HAD TO OFFER.
- What we were about to experience was counter to our culture as Christians.



- \* Along comes COVID-19 and everything we thought we knew about church CHANGED! No longer do it the way we had!
- We had to adapt on the fly and we found ourselves scrambling.
- None of the plans addressed this.
- No blueprint or template for what we needed to do.



- Body of Christ
- Relationship and community
- Completely dismantled what we do
- We can't get together
- How Long?



- COVID caused us to have to wear masks, social distance and avoid crowds.
- This was ok when we thought it was temporary
- \* How do we do *Church* like this??????



- Church as we knew it was over. -
  - There was nothing normal about this.
  - \*Rethink church!



# Lessons Learned from the Pulpit!

- Shock
- Pastor going through same pandemic
- Quickly find a way to continue...
- How to reach everybody... multiple platforms
- From Preacher to Producer



# Lessons Learned from the Pulpit!

- Used to Call and Response
- ❖ Format for service no longer the same
- \* How to pastor those you can't see or touch.
  - Staying connected



# Lessons Learned from the Pulpit!

- Class Leader system congregational care important
- Take time to hear the people meet needs
- Not just service
  - Business
  - Finances
  - Maintenance
  - Outreach



#### Lessons Learned from the Pew!

- Shock
- ❖ Need to be spiritually fed used to environment
- Adjust to means provided phone, social media, e-platforms



#### Lessons Learned from the Pew!

- Not enough connection to sanctuary (need to be in place)
- Doesn't feel like church (sacred place)
- Traditional Views of Church
- Multiple options (one click away)



# Takeaways

- Learned that the church is more than the building!
- \* Even when we return to church some of what we do now will continue.
- There was room for improvement.
  - \* What we do and how we do it.



# **Takeaways**

- Develop and All Hazards Plan
  - ❖ If it could go wrong how do we react?

- Develop reentry plans
  - How do we do everything we do safely in-light of the new danger?
  - How do you communicate that plan with members?
  - Prepare for lower numbers upon return.
