


SAMUEL F. BROWN

IN MEMORY OF THE LIFE AND
LEGACY OF SAMUEL F. BROWN



It is with a heavy heart that I inform you of the loss of our colleague Sam Brown. Sam was tragically killed in a motor vehicle incident over the weekend. Our thoughts and prayers go out to his family and friends and to everyone who worked with Sam here at EPA.

Sam, a native of Washington, DC, had worked at EPA for 27 years, most recently in the Office of Water (OW) and the Office of Chemical Safety and Pollution Prevention (OCSP). In OW, Sam served as the interim Advisor for Civil Rights, Diversity and Inclusion and in OCSP he served as a mathematical statistician for 21 years and a program analyst for the past 7 years.

Sam was active in a number of diversity initiatives, including serving as the former President of the African American Male Forum and a member of the William D. Barber Chapter of Blacks in Government at EPA. He was passionate about volunteering and public service, as well as addressing employee development and recruitment. He was truly dedicated to making EPA a better workplace for all.

A graduate of DC's Ballou High School, Sam was a mathematics major at Hampton University, Class of 1989, and completed his MBA at the University of Maryland in 2011. He also completed the USA Graduate School Executive Potential Program.

Residing in Clinton, Maryland, Sam was a referee for a local community basketball league and played kickball for the Goombay Trainwrecks in Southeast DC. He was a self-described nature adventure junkie who enjoyed scuba diving, hiking, skydiving, white water rafting and anything else that afforded him the opportunity to experience adventure while enjoying nature.

Sam is survived by his two children, Travis and Aejah Brown, and his significant other Kim Gibson. And he was so looking forward to becoming a grandfather, as his daughter-in-law Kiara Brown is expected to deliver their new baby next week.
