# Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

14<sup>th</sup> Sunday Ordinary Time Year A

Matthew 11:25-30

"God, you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned, but you have revealed them to the childlike" (Matt 11:25) Jesus begins a prayer of praise to the Father with these words telling us that God especially blesses children with purity of intent and purity of outlook (maybe what we call 'rose-colored glasses'). What is obvious to children and obvious to the humble, is hidden from the haughty elites or supposed 'enlightened' (brights) ones of the world! People often use the phrase "out of the mouths of babes" (actually, Psalm 8:3) to refer to a child's special revelatory insight reflected in what they say or see. It takes a child to help us! Children have a purer, less biased & less pre-judged outlook on life. The rest of us have unfortunately developed a more cynical or disillusioned outlook over time due to life's discouraging experiences. Perhaps time does jade us, if we do not purposely seek to overcome such prejudices. I bet we have all been challenged by a child's words of wisdom that they blurted out to us. Because they do not view life through such selfish lenses like ours, they are less quick to think of others in antagonistic terms, like 'Us vs Them' or 'You owe me-I'll sue you'. Also, they do not know political labels or vested interests, yet. I imagine we have heard kids tell us such things as, "We need to take this leftover food downtown to the people living under the bridge" or "Why do countries spend so much on bombs that just kill lots of people?" Often, we respond that "It is complicated, honey". But is that true? Or is that just our quick response to justify clinging on to our 'pre-jaded' worldview? I hear Jesus in the gospel today side with those simpler, more innocent suggestions likely to come from the mouth of a child. I think this is what Jesus meant when He said, "Amen, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 18:3).

I imagine we have all encountered some brilliant people, (those that have forgotten more from their minds, than I will ever learn in mine), who are experts in their fields and have managed to maintain an innocent, simpler, and humble attitude toward life. I am thinking of the stereotype we often call the 'absent minded professor' who is so focused on some theoretical problem or research project that they 'can't see the forest for the trees'. I heard about the professor (some say it was the writer William Faulkner) who trusted so much the inherent goodness of human nature that he never mailed a letter himself. He just stamped the letter and tossed it out his office window, trusting that good natured souls would pick it up from sidewalk and drop it into the nearest mail box. He claimed that all of his letters were always received by his addressees! Jesus teaches in our gospel reading today, to keep our hearts simple and pure (not let the world deceptively complexify or corrupt our outlooks). KIS – Keep It Simple! That seems to be Jesus' Way, which is why I'm not surprised that He simplified the ten commandments down to two! 1)Love God and 2) Love Neighbor as Self (Matt 22:37-39). Also, I see His desire that we keep life simple and straightforward, when He sent out His apostles, telling them not to drag along a lot of baggage to hoard. No, He sent them out without nothing at all so they wouldn't complicate their lives. He wanted them to keep it simple, and to trust in in Him to provide (Matt 10:9-10).

Yet, best of all, Jesus understands that though He tells us not to 'complicate' our lives with unhealthy encroachments and entanglements, likely, we will still wind up ourselves into fits and fears. So, He adds, this most comforting line for us, "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matt 11:28). In response, we may say back to Jesus, "Yes, please whisper those words into the ears of our hearts!" What a comfort to hear Jesus say "Come rest with me!" To rest in God, means we receive His unconditional welcome and acceptance of us. Whatever our worry, whatever our anxiety, or whatever our feeling of unworthiness, He calls us to come to Him. He genuinely wants to be with us, no matter what is going on within us. Jesus says, "Come, be with me-Rest with me." The songwriter Alanis Morrisette some years ago composed a song, "That I would be good." It expressed her longing for a non-judgmental companion who accepted her without making her be what she was not, or without making her do for him what she could not. Some of her lines express the human longing for this 'rest' that Jesus is talking about in our gospel. She sings, "That I would be good even if I did nothing......That I would be good even if I got the thumbs down..... That I would be good if I lost my hair and my youth....That I would be loved even when I was fuming...."

Well, Jesus as our shepherd friend, He alone can provide such unconditionally affirming and uplifting acceptance, that lets our hearts rest in Him. Maybe we have exhausted ourselves, trying to fix everything and still failing, or have exhausted ourselves chasing every worldly solution to our anxiety, & still come up stressed. Then Jesus says to us, "Come to me... I will give you rest!"
