The Reverend's Ruminations - June 2021

Summer greetings to you and yours! It's hard to believe that the last time I shared my "ruminations" in the April newsletter I had just found out I would be attending the Air Force Basic Chaplain Course at Maxwell Air Force Base in Montgomery, Alabama. The time seems to have flown by, and here I am back in Minnesota after successfully graduating and being declared "worldwide qualified" by the USAF Chaplain Corps College. As the highest-ranking student in the class, I was appointed as the class leader, which meant that I was in charge of distributing information to my classmates, making sure that each

of them was present before class started, and even inspecting dress uniforms prior to graduation. None of that was new to me after years of enlisted and officer service in the Army, so it was a good ministry I could offer to both the faculty and my fellow students. There were several others with some prior service in either the Army or the Navy, and a mix of ages that even included one six months older than me! I wish I could say I now know the Air Force chaplaincy inside and out, but there will still be things to learn as I continue my service.

The casual picture to the right (taken at the airport after graduation) is me with the Air Force Chief of Chaplains, Major General Steven Schaick who happens to be ordained in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) just as I am. He was the featured speaker at our graduation, and spoke passionately about the future of the chaplaincy from his perspective leading the corps for the past several years.



Speaking of graduation, I'm certainly not the only one. Graduation season is upon (or even past) us after a second strange, COVID-influenced year for students, teachers, and parents alike. This year's seniors did get to have some of the "normal" experiences that the class of 2020 missed, but it was challenging. Ellen and I cannot believe that we'll be "empty nesters" in the fall; it seems just yesterday that both our children were snapping those first-day-of-school photos with backpacks nearly as big as they were! Where has the time gone? We wish all our graduates well as we pray for their success and safety.

One of the points I made during our VERY busy Pentecost/Confirmation/Communion/Graduate/Teacher Recognition Sunday is that no matter our physical age, the journey of our faith is ongoing. Our new class of confirmands are not "graduating from" anything, but rather "into" adult membership and additional church involvement. This is actually true for each church member. The journey of faith is an everwinding road, and none of us are fully mature in our faith until the day we meet God face-to-face—so we must find ways to feed our Christian curiosity and bolster our faith. Sunday School classes will be taking a break for the summer months, but I encourage everyone to take advantage of the church's ongoing subscription to RightNow Media as a free way to encounter new and exciting paths to support your faith journey. This online streaming service offers thousands of great Bible studies, Christian movies, faith conferences, and children's programs—and even includes an archive our First Congregational UCC worship services. If you encounter a study that you'd like to share or have us offer as a class in the fall, please let me know!

As we march headlong into summer, we would do well to contemplate these words from God, as told through the prophet Isaiah:

"For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return there until they have watered the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth; it shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and succeed in the thing for which I sent it." (55:10-11, NRSV)

May your summer be filled with warmth, family, and a chance to rejuvenate your soul.

The Council met in Heritage Hall. The meeting was called to order and led in prayer by Moderator, Marilyn Forstrom.

Members Present: Larry Thompson, Marilyn Forstrom, Abigail Roiger (via Zoom), Dave Adams, Cathy Celander, Sue Kruse, Jane Kotewa, Catherine Johnson (via phone), Wendy Ziemer, Christina Hainy. Ex-officio members: Pastor Germain and Dara Bliesmer, Ass't Treasurer.

Members Absent: Robbin Celander, Kay Campe

Minutes of the April 21 meeting were approved as printed with a minor change. Motion M/S/C (Larry/Abigail)

Treasurers Report: \$42,010 has been paid so far for Capital fund improvements. Catherine will be reopening the line of credit in late May. Motion was M/S/C (Dave/Wendy) to receive the Treasurer's report.

Finance Report: A \$30,000 gift was received from the Brodt's. We have tabled how to invest/code this gift until June's meeting. Short term disability insurance for Pastor Germain passed by council email.

Pastor's Report: Not presented at this meeting as Pastor Germain was out of town.

BOARD REPORTS:

Christian Education: Wendy reported that plans are made for Sunday, May 23rd. Also, there are 8 youth going to faith-based camps this summer. Motion was M/S/C (Catherine/Jane) to approve up to \$1000 for camps over what was already budgeted. Catherine is planning VBS (June 21-23) and will be calling to ask members for help at VBS.

Hospitality: Cathy reported that over 90 people attended April's Community meal. They are planning on the Pie Social and pork chops on a stick for IHD.

Missions: Meals on Wheels was provided by 16 members of the church and 4 others from the community. June's Blessing Box Offering will be for Relay for Life.

Facilities: Larry reported on projects. Krause Construction will be finishing up a few stones and doing sealing work. Motion was M/S/P (Larry/Catherine) to schedule Sherburn Nursery to work on the approach to the storage shed in the late summer/early fall. Cost is about \$2,290. Motion was M/S/C (Larry/Abigail) to fix some of the gutters that need replacing in the late summer/early fall for \$1000 max.

Diaconate: Sue reported that ladies will be continuing to call members on the members list. Any special concerns that are received will be acted on right away. Also, a reoccurring notice will be in the bulletins and newsletters.

Worship: Dave reported that they will be preparing/serving the Free Community Meal on May 26. They are looking into a joint Sunday service in the park with St. John's and another one outside for the congregation.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Capital Campaign Research Committee: Marilyn will be calling members to join the committee. Please, consider being a part of the committee.

OLD BUSINESS: A motion M/S/C (Wendy/Larry) to update COVID policy per state guidelines. Also, we will be posting about IHD on church website and on Facebook.

NEW BUSINESS: Motion was M/S/C (Abigail/Sue) to allow the use of the church on June 24, 25 or 26 afternoon for COPAL (Communities Organizing Latinx Power and Action) to provide COVID vaccines. COPAL is a nonprofit that is working with MN Dept. of Health to reach the Latino Community.

Marilyn closed with a prayer and the meeting was adjourned.



Bill was born to George & Bertha Cowing on the family farm, rural Granada, and went to Huntley High School graduating in 1955. He was cocaptain of the Huntley Football Team and also the Huntley Basketball Team. Pat & Bill met at a Granada vs Huntley ball game held in the Huntley gym.

They were married the following year in November 1956 in the Chapel of First Congregational Church in Fairmont, Minnesota by the Rev. E. E. Manes (after deer-hunting season!!)

They will be celebrating 65 years this year!!! (Congratulations!!)

They belonged to the Granada Congregational Church where they were very active in the church. They were part of the remodeling of the church when the addition was put on it. Bill served on the church council and ushered. Pat sang in the choir, was a member of the Mother's Club, and sang in the "Granny's Gals". She served on the church council as church secretary two different times. She and Joyce Rice planned the Worship Dedication service for the newly remodeled church. When the Granada church closed, they joined First Congregational UCC of Fairmont.

They have two children--Larry and Sherry. Larry and Allison have 4 children: Tyler, Trever, Paige, and Ciara and one grandchild Fletcher. Sherry and Pat have two children: Amanda "Mandy" and Christopher "Chris". Mandy is married to Austin Willey and has two stepchildren, Madison and Tyler. HyVee and Fareway Receipts Report Report as of 16 May 2021

During the last five weeks, only \$13,617.64 (9.08%) worth of Hy-Vee slips were turned in. After 33 weeks, Hy-Vee is at \$117,437.08 (78.29%) to-ward the 13th \$150,000 goal.

During the same five weeks, only 2,308.43 (1.54%) worth of Fareway slips were received. After 15 weeks, Fareway is at 26,786.18 (17.86%) toward our 4th 150,000 goal.

Thanks for bring into the Church, or mailing them to me. Even the very small amounts help. This program started the first of March 2011, so any slips from then until now can be used. During these five weeks, there were a number of with only \$0.18 or less for gas. They help us reach the goal. Keep them coming. Any Fairmont Fareway and Hy-Vee food store register slip can be used. Even slips from Hy-Vee Gas, Coffee Shop, Food Service, and Pharmacy help us toward the goal.


