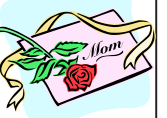

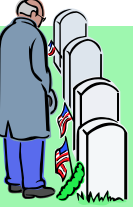

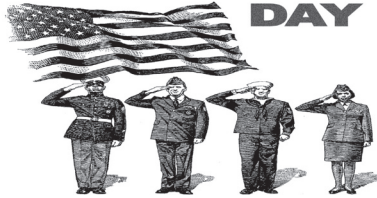

MEMORIAL DAY

Memorial Day, originally called Decoration Day, is a day of remembrance for those who have died in service of the United States of America. Over two dozen cities and towns claim to be the birthplace of Memorial Day. While Waterloo N.Y. was officially declared the birthplace of Memorial Day by President Lyndon Johnson in May 1966, it's difficult to prove conclusively the origins of the day.

Regardless of the exact date or location of its origins, one thing is clear – Memorial Day was born out of the Civil War and a desire to honor our dead. It was officially proclaimed on 5 May 1868 by General John Logan, national commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, in his General Order No. 11. "The 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of strewing with flowers, or otherwise decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land," he proclaimed. The date of Decoration Day, as he called it, was chosen because it wasn't the anniversary of any particular battle.

On the first Decoration Day, General James Garfield made a speech at Arlington National Cemetery, and 5,000 participants decorated the graves of the 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers buried there.

The first state to officially recognize the holiday was New York in 1873. By 1890 it was recognized by all of the northern states. The South refused

to acknowledge the day, honoring their dead on separate days until after World War I (when the holiday changed from honoring just those who died fighting in the Civil War to honoring Americans who died fighting in any war).

It is now observed in almost every state on the last Monday in May with Congressional passage of the National Holiday Act of 1971 (P.L. 90 – 363). This helped ensure a three day weekend for Federal holidays, though several southern states have an additional separate day for honoring the Confederate war dead: January 19th in Texas; April 26th in Alabama, Florida, Georgia, and Mississippi; May 10th in South Carolina; and June 3rd (Jefferson Davis' birthday) in Louisiana and Tennessee. *Source:*

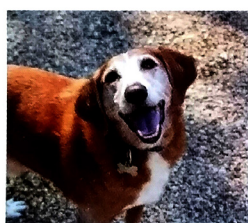

Dear Houghs Neck Residents,

As I am writing this month's bulletin, the House of Representatives is in the middle of debating the Fiscal Year 2017 State Budget. There are 1,307 budget amendments being debated. The House Committee on Ways and Means recommended the state budget to be at \$39.483 billion. This is approximately \$76 million lower than the Governor's recommendation. For the second consecutive year, we are not utilizing any money from the State's Stabilization Fund (Rainy Day Fund) to balance the budget. The House, Senate and Governor agree that the projected revenue increase for Fiscal Year 2017 is 4.3% or \$1.109 billion. The State Budget revenue includes \$26.86 billion in income tax and another \$10.806 billion is a combination of federal programs and reimbursements. The remainder is a combination of fees and penalties, capital gains tax, tax settlements and transfer from other agencies, such as the State Lottery.

The largest spending item of the State Budget continues to be Medicaid/Medicare, known as MassHealth, at \$15.4 billion. The state has been trying to limit MassHealth's growth to 5% by improving case management, holding healthcare providers' rates flat and improving program integrity on long term care support services. The second largest part of the State Budget, at \$5.629 billion, is Local Aid to cities and towns, which is a combination of unrestricted direct assistance and Chapter 70 education

funding. We were able to increase unrestricted direct assistance by \$42.1 million and Chapter education funding by \$105.8 million. Quincy would be receiving \$26,763,766 in Chapter 70 funds and \$18,359,642 in unrestricted direct assistance. The Norfolk County Regional School District would receive \$1,185,854. Fifty-three percent of the State Budget is consumed by these two programs and reduces the amount of flexibility in the state budget to fund other programs.

Substance abuse treatment and prevention continues to be a priority. Since fiscal year 2012, the Legislature increased funding by 65% and continues to expand these programs. It funds a \$28.3 million increase in the Bureau of Substance Abuse Services, which would add 46 transitional support services beds to a total of 388 and provides new supportive case management services for 500 additional families. Thirteen million dollars in new funding has been dedicated to 45 substance abuse treatment beds at Taunton State Hospital. An additional \$3 million has been allocated toward a pilot for medication assisted therapy in emergency rooms, \$3 million toward community based policing, \$1.5 million for a District Attorney drug diversion program, and \$1 million for the Attorney General opioid abuse program.

The House Ways and Means state budget recommendation also addresses many other priorities. Here are a few major items in

summary. The Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority (MBTA) would be funded at \$1.027 billion and we will reevaluate if there is a need for more funding during the course of the fiscal year. The School Building Assistance (SBA) program, which reimburses municipalities for school construction and improvement projects, would be allocated \$867.1 million. Quincy has greatly benefited from this program, receiving between 60% or greater reimbursement for the construction of Quincy High School and Central Middle School and the financing of a new Sterling Middle School. The Department of Children and Families' challenging caseworker to case ratio has been widely reported on by local newspapers. The agency's budget would be increased by \$23 million allowing them to hire an additional 281 caseworkers. An additional \$10 million could be added to the Massachusetts Rental Voucher Program (MRVP) which would provide 375 new vouchers to help low income individuals with paying rent and bring the MRVP program up to \$100 million. State funded public housing authorities would receive \$65.5 million. The Councils on Aging received its first increase in many years by increasing the formula by \$10 per senior citizen in a community. The trial court system, which has faced both budget cuts and no increase in funding in the past, would receive an additional \$8.3 million. Providing proper funding to hundreds upon hundreds of programs through the state budget is challenging when over half the budget is committed to two programs.

Working with State Representatives Ronald Mariano, Bruce Ayers and

Daniel Hunt, we are making sure that Quincy's interests are represented during the debate and working to bring more state funding to Quincy. The State Senate will debate its version of the State Budget in late May. We will coordinate with Senator John Keenan on keeping Quincy's state funding priorities in place.

Lastly, I have had a change in legislative aides. Amanda Jenkins has left to pursue an exciting career opportunity and I wish her the best. Maeve Kidney is my new legislative aide. She is a very intelligent and capable professional should you contact my office.

As we approach Memorial Day, I would like to thank our veterans and their families for their sacrifices. The Memorial Day parade is on May 30th and will start at the Quincy Credit Union and end at Wollaston Cemetery. The start time is 11:00 am if you have time to come.

The City of Quincy DPW has placed message boards along Sea Street alerting motorists that work will be done the week of May 2. The City of Quincy and its engineering teams have completed a comprehensive assessment of the sanitary system in Adams Shore and Houghs Neck. This assessment has identified four areas where groundwater and sea water are flowing into the City's sewer, collectively known as Infiltration/Inflow (I/I). The DPW has contracted to fix these issues and remove these flows from our City sewers. This water flows directly to the MWRA and City ratepayers pay the MWRA to treat it. Fixing these problem areas is the City's best option to control MWRA costs and sewer rates. The Adams Shore and Houghs Neck I/I project, the fourth project in the past six years, is targeted to remove identified I/I flow and save ratepayers money. These leaks will be fixed using a minimally intrusive construction method called cured in place pipe (CIPP) lining. This type of sewer rehabilitation requires substantially less construction related inconvenience than standard sewer excavation and construction. Work crews access the sewer from existing manholes to insert a flexible liner inside the old or leaky sewer pipes. Hot water or steam inflates and cures the liner, which hardens in place to form a rigid, smooth surface that seals cracks to keep non-sewage out and restore the pipe to near-new condition. The City received a grant for 45% of the costs and a 0% interest loan from the MWRA for the remainder. These costs will be recovered in savings in less than two years.

The Quincy Police Department and I have received complaints from residents being solicited at their door by representatives of SFE Energy. They have been aggressive in their approach, asking to see copies of resident's utility bills. While QPD has reviewed their credentials and they have been approved for solicitation, I've expressed concern and ask that due to their unethical behavior that their credentials be revoked. I have also contacted the company directly. At this time, Quincy Police requests anyone uncomfortable with the solicitors to please contact their non-emergency line 617-479-1212 so they can document the complaints. They also advise if you're not interested in the service, do not show your other utility bills as in the past they have had residents found the salesman made the switch without authorization to do so.

The engineer has completed the draft site plan for the Houghs

Neck Maritime Center. I will host a neighborhood meeting on Thursday, May 19 at 7pm at the Houghs Neck Congregational Church Lower Hall to present the plan to the neighborhood. With twenty-seven miles of coastline, the Public Landing and boat ramp is the only facility with free public access in Quincy. The boat ramp, building, and the Public Landing itself are in disrepair. While there's been talk for years about opportunity for expansion, we are now putting the pieces together to make the improvements for a first class boating facility with continued free public access. The next step is to file for permitting for the improvements. In preparation for this boating season, the Quincy Police Marine Unit will be installing the floats behind the Maritime Center in the next week and plan to install the Public Landing float in early June.

Cleaner, Greener Quincy is Saturday, May 7 from 9am to noon. Mayor Koch will host a cookout at Pageant Field for all participants starting at noon. Houghs Neck always has strong participation with many residents and organizations coordinating sites. Atherton Hough School and Veteran's Monument, Brill Field, Edgewater Beach, HN Community Center, Houghs Neck Garden Club-Leo Kelly Park, Veteran's Memorial at Brill Field and Wall Street Traffic Island, Macy Park and Perry/Parkhurst Beach. Cleaner, Greener is a day where residents work together to beautify their neighborhoods. 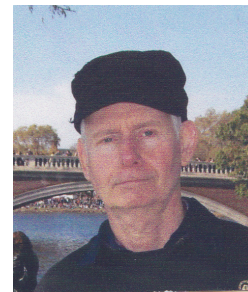

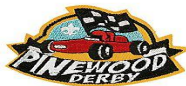
