Gobble, gobble! Calling all turkeys, oops, I mean turkey lovers, on November 22 for our annual feast of gluttony. Personally, I prefer hamburgers, but I do love cranberry sauce, sweet potatoes, and all other goodies that decorate our tables on that day. After our children grew into adults with busy lives and our parents and other relatives passed away, Robert and I started celebrating Thanksgiving away from home. That doesn't mean though that we forget to be thankful for our blessings such as family, including cousins Marle, John, Mary; friends Sandy, the Galls, the Popes, and my number one fans Chris and Carolyn; or my wonderful publisher, Tara Snowden; Dick Bajai, who introduced me to Bingo Bugle; and the staff and other players at bingo games nationwide. It just means in our case, we make reservations for dinner instead of cooking a huge meal and all it involves.

Among favorite Thanksgiving getaways for us is Caesars Casino

in Windsor, Canada. It is across from Detroit and a four-hour drive from our home. You do have to have a passport or similar ID at the border, but that is the only inconvenience. Money exchange isn't an issue since there are numerous machines available in the casino to do just that. An added bonus is that from American to Canadian money, you get more bang for your buck. Lately it's been \$126 Canadian for each \$100 American. Translation, more money to invest in gambling. Also, Canada does not tax gambling winnings.

Inside the casino complex is a 5,000-seat entertainment center that regularly hosts top notch entertainment. In 1994, before this site became a reality there was a temporary casino nearby. Lines wrapped around the building and visitors had to wait outside in the weather until other visitors left the building and space was freed up. Once inside, gamblers lined up behind each machine waiting for a chance to play. Meaning, those lined up were waiting for other gamblers to lose their money and give up a coveted machine. That tended to make one stay longer on any one machine because to give up your seat meant a long wait for a different machine. Thinking about it, I realize that was really dumb and not something I would do today. Those who wait behind



slots are called lurkers and it's rude to send bad vibes to another gambler so you can have the seat. The permanent casino opened in 1998 and in 2006, it became one of the first smoke-free commercial casinos in North America.

While in Windsor, Robert and I often play bingo at Classic IV Bingo. Located close to the casino, the facility is comfortable with good food and a friendly staff. Payouts are decent, not that I ever win, but you've already read enough of my whining about that. My losing streak is never ending. Classic IV is open seven days a week with games every two hours from 10:00 a.m. to midnight.

Until next month, may Lady Luck blow you kisses as you dance out the door with dollars. Win big.

Gaming News

NEW JERSEY. Reports from Atlantic City, New Jersey, indicate that one of the world's largest online betting companies is launching a huge "mobile sports" operation in that state. The company, Stars Group, has moved quickly since the change in rules. There are published reports that there is now a mobile "app," (application) that can be accessed on most devices. Another company, 888 Sport, has begun to test its on mobile protocol in New Jersey.

MASSACHUSETTS. Initial numbers from a new MGM casino in Massachusetts show that early attendance and spending is ahead of published projections.

The casino, the MGM Springfield, cost nearly a billion dollars to construct. According to published reports and MGM officials, the multi-venue complex is averaging around 50,000 daily visitors on weekends and about 25,000 daily visitors during the work week. It opened in late August.

INDIANA. New numbers show that the five casinos in northwest Indiana saw a 3.5 percent up-tick in year-over-year revenues in the most-recent reporting month. There are indications that one reason for the good numbers was an extra weekend day. The casinos took in a total of approximately \$78 million in revenues, compared to a little over \$75 million during the same month last year.

KENTUCKY. It took less than a year to finish. Now the Blue Grass State's newest, state-of-the art

racing and entertainment facility has opened. The ribbon cutting was held at Churchill Downs for the venue, which cost about \$65 million. The facility features 900 racing machines, which allow gamblers to bet on previously run races. The new facility means more than 200 new jobs for the area. Derby City Gaming will be a year-round facility.

JAPAN. The talks went on for a long time, but now international media are reporting that Japan has begun to officially allow casinos to open their doors in that country. There was much public opposition to the rule changes, but the national government passed legislation that will OK the first three casinos there. Several American companies say they are interested in applying for licenses.

Bingo at 100 And Beyond

When a Bingo player reaches 100 years of age, the Knights of Columbus Council #5803 in Simi Valley, California, awards them with free Bingo games for the rest of his or her life. This proved quite profitable for 107-year-old Hilda Corson, a regular at the games who has been enjoying free Bingo there for seven years now and landed a \$500 jackpot the day before her 107th birthday. Corson holds the KofC record for the most free Bingo games played after reaching the 100-year mark.

Jewelry Designers Feature Bingo

Earlier this year, Beth and Murat Bugdaycay, founders of the fine jewelry brand Foundrae, hosted a cocktail party to celebrate the opening of their New York flagship store in Tribeca. The store features the Bugdaycays’ jewelry collection of modern heirlooms, as well as a lending library where visitors can lounge in-store with a book or borrow one to take home. Guests included January Jones, Dianna Agron, Molly Ringwald and Pamela Love, who sipped cocktails while celebrity stylist and television personality Robert Verdi hosted Foundrae-themed Bingo games. Prizes for winners included custom silk scarves and leather wallets decorated with symbols from the brand. The husband-wife duo created Foundrae in 2015, with Beth previously holding the title of CEO at Rebecca Taylor womenswear brand for more than 20 years.

Bingo Winner Nabs Quarter Million

A lucky Pennsylvania woman won \$250,000 playing “Super Coverall Bingo” at Seneca Gaming and Entertainment in Salamanca, New York. Her win is Western New York’s largest Bingo payout in history and was just one ball away from winning \$1 million. Tara Schatz won the Bingo jackpot by hitting on the 48th ball. Seneca

Gaming and Entertainment also paid out \$2,000 on ten regular games. Super Coverall Bingo allows players the chance to win a \$1 million grand prize for achieving a coverall in 47 balls or less, along with countless smaller jackpots up to \$250,000.

Newspaper Features Bingo Contest

This fall, the Journal Review, based in Crawfordsville, Indiana, launched what it proclaimed to be “the largest single game of Bingo Montgomery County has ever seen.” Using Bingo cards inserted in newspapers or available from local retail outlets, readers searched the paper for two daily Bingo balls that appeared in select ads. If the ball’s number matched one on the card, players would cut the ball out as well as mark it on their cards. The first five players to get a coverall were entered in a \$500 drawing. Less patient players could elect to go for a \$100 prize by completing the letter “F” on their Bingo cards. The first ten entrants to do so were also entered in a drawing. The game concluded just before Halloween.

University Holds Student Bingo Event

The Association of Campus Events (ACE) of Kutztown University of Pennsylvania welcomed students back to campus with its first event of the season—a lively game of grocery Bingo. Games were held beneath a large white tent on the school’s quad, popularly known as the DMZ. There was a large player turnout as students enjoyed complimentary sandwiches and snacks and competed in a string of Bingo games. Regular Bingo rules applied, but instead of cash prizes, students competed for coveted dorm room staples like boxed cereal, bags of potato chips and pretzels, candy and more. For the grand prizes, players could win a T-shirt or blanket from the college store.

As I said before, there are many situations where a sick person has no choice but to be out in about in public for errands, appointments, work, etc. But it sure would be nice if they would show some manners and keep away from optional social settings until they are well.
Those stats again:
• A cough or sneeze can spread germs up to 200 feet
• A sneeze may contain up to 200 million virus particles
• Germs can stay alive in the air for up to 45 minutes or more

I remain curious to know if a Bingo hall can ask a sick person to leave. This obviously would not be within the parameters of gaming regulations, but would fall instead within the category of "house rules."

The Long Reach of the VAOIG

When thieves steal from the Department of Veterans Affairs, often it's not just the VA Office of the Inspector General that goes after them. Depending on the crime, it can include the OIG for other government departments and law enforcement from one end of the country to the other. The VAOIG has friends.
A thief in Florida was hauled back up the coast to New England to face charges that he collected over \$2 million in bribes over the course of five years while working for an electrical company that contracted for government jobs. Not only did he alter and falsify the bid documents, the scammer also involved his children by having the bribery funds diverted through them.
A Tennessee scammer was

convicted of theft of public money, making false statements, wire fraud, mail fraud and financial conflict of interest. His crime was particularly bad because while working as a VA field examiner, he schemed to steal over half a million dollars from a disabled vet by convincing the veteran to make out a will with the scammer as sole beneficiary. The thief was forced to resign from the position but went on to another examiner position where he conveniently forgot to reveal his previous resignation for misconduct. All the time he'd lied about his own disabilities and had collected for 100 percent total and permanent disability. Multiple law enforcement agencies were involved.
A Boston woman collected the Social Security and VA benefits of her former father-in-law after he passed away. She had a joint account with him and had been his caregiver. She was indicted on only two counts of theft of public funds and pleaded guilty. Multiple law enforcement agencies were involved in this case as well.
When thieves think the VA Office of Inspector General doesn't have a very long reach, they're wrong.

All Work and No Play?

Dear Aunt Bingo:

It was good to see someone write to you about being a Bingo worker who also is a Bingo player and the grief he gets from some players who think he somehow cheats whenever he wins (July 2018 issue).

I have had similar experiences as the spouse of a Bingo worker, especially when I play Bingo where my husband volunteers. It is so crazy—getting dirty looks from certain people almost as soon as I walk in the door, like I'm a criminal. And Lord forbid, I should sit at a table with other family members or friends of volunteers. There always seems to be that handful of players who spend as much time glaring at us as they do

looking at their cards.

To be fair, it is just a very small number of players who act like this and it doesn't happen all the time. Most folks pay us little or no attention and just go about playing their Bingo. 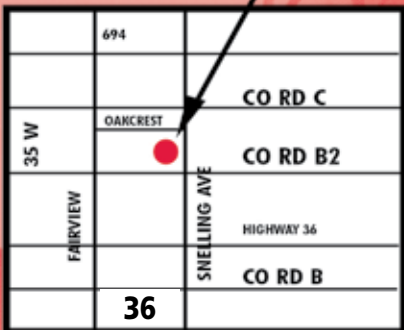

Slow-Cooker Sides

Dear Annie,

Can you suggest a side dish that goes with pork chops?— **Barbara Sue from Jacksonville, Georgia**

Dear Barbara,

Here's one of my favorite cabbage recipes. This recipe is prepared in a slow cooker. If your slow cooker is only 3.5 quarts, use a small head of cabbage. If the slow cooker is larger, use a larger head of cabbage. This should be enough for 4 people. — **Annie**

RED CABBAGE AND APPLES

1 head red cabbage, thinly sliced
2 apples, seeded and chopped
1 medium onion, chopped
1 tablespoon brown sugar
¼ teaspoon salt
1/8 teaspoon pepper

1/8 teaspoon ground mace
1/4 cup dry red wine
1/2 cup apple juice

Combine the cabbage, apples, onion, brown sugar, salt, pepper and mace in a slow cooker. Pour the wine and apple juice over all. Cover and cook on "Low" for 6 ½ to 7 hours. Makes about 6 cups.

I am invited to Thanksgiving dinner at my in-laws every year. Can you give me a recipe that's easy to make? — **Fred S. from Boise, Idaho**

Dear Fred,

This Cran-Apple Sauce is delicious and easy to prepare. You might need to double this recipe. Hopefully your slow cooker is a large one. Bon Appetit! — **Annie**

HOLIDAY CRAN-APPLE SAUCE

1 cup fresh cranberries
8 apples, peeled, cored and chopped
½ cup sugar
1 stick cinnamon, halved
crosswise
6 whole cloves
ground nutmeg
6 inch piece of cheesecloth

Combine the cranberries, apples and sugar in a slow cooker. Place the cinnamon stick and cloves in the center of the 6-inch square of cheesecloth. Pull up around the side and tie in a knot. Place in the pot. Cook and cover on “Low” for 4 to 5 hours or until the cranberries and apples are very soft. Remove the spice bag. Puree the hot fruit in a blender or food processor. Sprinkle with nutmeg. Makes about 3 ½ cups.

Lottery Changes Immigrant’s Life

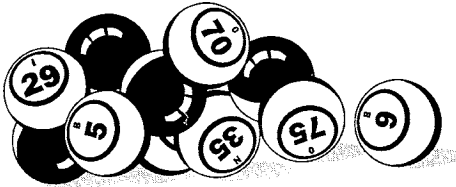
A Canadian man scored big on two separate lottery tickets he bought just five months apart. Melhig Melhig, 28, won \$2.7 million with two separate lottery ticket purchases at stores in Winnipeg, Manitoba. His first prize was \$1.2 million on a \$20 instant lottery ticket, which he used to move his wife and children from an apartment to a new home. Five months later, while shopping for a toy for his children, he used a \$20 bill he received as change to buy a \$20 Scratch ‘n’ Win ticket, which earned him another \$2 million. Melhig is considering using the win to launch a business. An African immigrant, Melhig says he will also use the money to go to school “to improve my English and communication. And I want to learn something useful, like carpentry.”

Dad’s Lifetime Lotto Gift

Anissa Dellaripa, 22, of South Windsor, Connecticut, has claimed a lottery prize that will give her \$2,000 per month for the rest of her life. Dellaripa was given a \$1 scratch-off ticket as a small token of congratulations following graduation from college. “My Dad often buys me scratch tickets for fun,” Dellaripa says. “I went to my room, scratched the ticket, and couldn’t believe it when I saw the Win for Life prize. I thought he gave me a fake ticket as a joke, but I really won!” Dellaripa had the option of taking the prize as a \$400,000 lump sum but decided to take \$2,000 per month for the rest of her life. “It’s a lot of money for me because I’m so young,” she says. “It’s a gift my father can leave me with for the rest of my life.”

Second Chance for Colorado Man

A Colorado Springs, Colorado, man has won the lottery for the third time in a year. Officials said the man, identified as Paul G., won a total of \$1 million from three scratch tickets. The majority of winnings came from second-chance drawings. (In Colorado, players may submit non-winning scratch tickets through the lottery website and app for a second chance at winning cash and other prizes.) The Colorado Lottery said Paul G. won \$250,000 on a Thrilling Crossword scratch ticket then won \$500,000 on a second chance drawing for the Idyllic Dollars/Brilliant Bucks drawing. Two weeks after that, he won \$250,000 on the Royal Crossword game.

Video Poker Players

I've written a lot about the 9/6 jacks-or-better video poker game, touting it as one of the best video poker games to play because it returns 99.5% with expert play. (For those that don't know, the 9 refers to the payout for a full house per coin played, and the 6 is the payout for the flush per coin played.) A recent trip to the casinos with friends alerted me to mistakes players might be making when looking for the 9/6 game.

As we were walking through the casino, my friend shouted, "Here's a 9/6 machine." He was all set to sit down and play this 9/6 game when I came over and looked at the video poker screen. This is what was on it: (I'm only

showing the first column of the pay schedule.)

Royal Flush	250
Straight Flush	50
Four Aces	160
Four 2-4	80
Four 5-K	50
Full House	9
Flush	6
Straight	5
Three of a Kind	3
Two Pair	1
Jacks or Better	1

Yes, the full house and flush paid 9 and 6 respectively, but this was not a jacks-or-better game. The game my friend was about to play was Double Bonus Poker. A 9/6 Double Bonus game has an expected return of only 97.8% (as opposed to the 99.5% return for a 9/6 jacks-or-better game). A better paying Double Bonus game returns 10 and 7 for the full house and flush, with an expected return of 100.17%. What my friend was about to do was to play an inferior game even though it paid 9 coins for the full house and 6 for the flush.

It's been my experience that most video poker players don't know the difference between one video poker game and another. You shouldn't just sit down and play a video poker game because it pays more for aces, or pays more for four aces with a kicker, and so on. There are different video poker games, such as Jacks-or-Better, Bonus Poker, Double Bonus, Double Bonus Poker, Triple

Bonus, Bonus Poker Deluxe, etc. It is important that you know what the best pay schedule is for each game, and what the return of the game is if you play it accurately.

For example, if you had a choice of playing a Bonus Poker or Double Double Bonus Poker game, which one would you play? The only way to know which is better is to look at the pay schedule for each game and know what the expected return is for each game. Trust me, you will find different pay schedules for Bonus Poker in a casino. Some are good; others are horrible. Ditto for Double Double Bonus Poker.

Here's another example my friend came across in the same casino. I had told him if he wanted to play Bonus Poker, look for an 8/5 payout for the full house and flush. He found the following two 8/5 Bonus Poker games in the same casino:

Notice that both Bonus Poker games are 8/5. They pay the same for winning hands except for four-of-a-kinds. The 8/5 game in column #2 pays 30 coins for

a four-of-kind, whereas the 8/5 game in column #3 pays 80 coins for four aces, 40 coins for four 2-4, and 25 coins for four 5-K. The expected return (ER) for the 8/5 Bonus game in column #2 is 98.5% whereas the ER for 8/5 game in column #3 is 99.2%. If you are a smart player, you should play the game in column #3 (which my friend did and he ended up hitting four aces for a nice profit).

If the game in column #2 paid 35 coins (instead of 30 coins) for all four-of-a-kinds, the ER would be 99.7%, an excellent game. However, in this casino, they shorted the payouts to 30 coins, which lowered the ER to 98.5%. (Note: Even though this game was labeled Bonus Poker on the video poker machine, technically it's a jacks-or-better game because it pays the same for all four-of-a-kinds.)

The point I'm making is that if you want to play video poker, you should know what the best pay schedule is for each game and then find those higher paying games in the casino when you play. That's how you become a winning video poker player.

(Note: The ER's quoted in the article assume the maximum of five coins played. You should never play less than max coins when you play video poker; otherwise, the ER will be lower.)

Poker Talk



Slow-playing Can Be Risky

By Jonathan Little

You’re taking a big risk when you slow-play a strong poker hand. Sure, you might keep opponents around long enough to extract a bit more money from them, but sometimes you’re also giving them a chance to improve. I was recently told about a hand in which the slow-play strategy proved costly.

In a \$1-\$2 cash game, a player with an effective stack of \$200 raised to \$7 from early position, and our Hero called on the button with 3h 3d.

I like Hero’s call with a small pair. If he flops a set, he’ll have the best hand essentially every time, and when he misses, he can easily fold to a bet. It’s also nice that the initial raiser is in early position, meaning that he probably has a strong hand, so Hero will probably be paid off handsomely if he makes a set.

The big blind called as well, and three players saw a flop of Ks Qs 3c, which gave Hero bottom set.

The big blind checked, and the initial raiser bet \$10 into a pot of \$22. Hero decided to just call.

Hero told me that he wanted to trap the bettor as well as the player in the big blind. While calling certainly increases the chance of trapping someone, it also allows both opponents to

cheaply see the turn, which is not ideal when there are many draws available.

In this spot, it’s somewhat likely that one of Hero’s opponents has some sort of draw that would be priced out by a raise. And if one of the opponents happens to have a strong made hand such as A-K or K-Q, Hero would be best off getting his money in the pot immediately, before the turn brings a scary card that forces the opponent to play cautiously.

The big blind called as well. The turn was the 9d.

Both opponents checked to Hero, who bet \$40 into a pot of \$52. The big blind check-raised all in for \$143 more. The initial raiser folded.

At this point, Hero is almost certainly up against either a premium made hand or a draw. While I do not think Hero can fold (because he beats K-Q, K-9, Q-9 and the draws), he certainly can’t love this situation, because he could easily be up against a straight. But even if he is, Hero has 10 outs to improve to a full house.

Hero thought for a while before calling. His opponent was holding Jc 10h for a straight, and Hero lost when the river did not pair the board. The initial raiser claimed he folded A-K.

On the flop, if Hero had simply raised (as he should do with his best made hands and draws in almost all situations), he would have played a big pot as a huge favorite against A-K. Instead, he allowed the big blind to see a cheap turn card with his marginal draw, resulting in Hero losing his entire stack.

Block 16, on the second level, is named after the red-light district a block off Fremont Street in early Las Vegas.

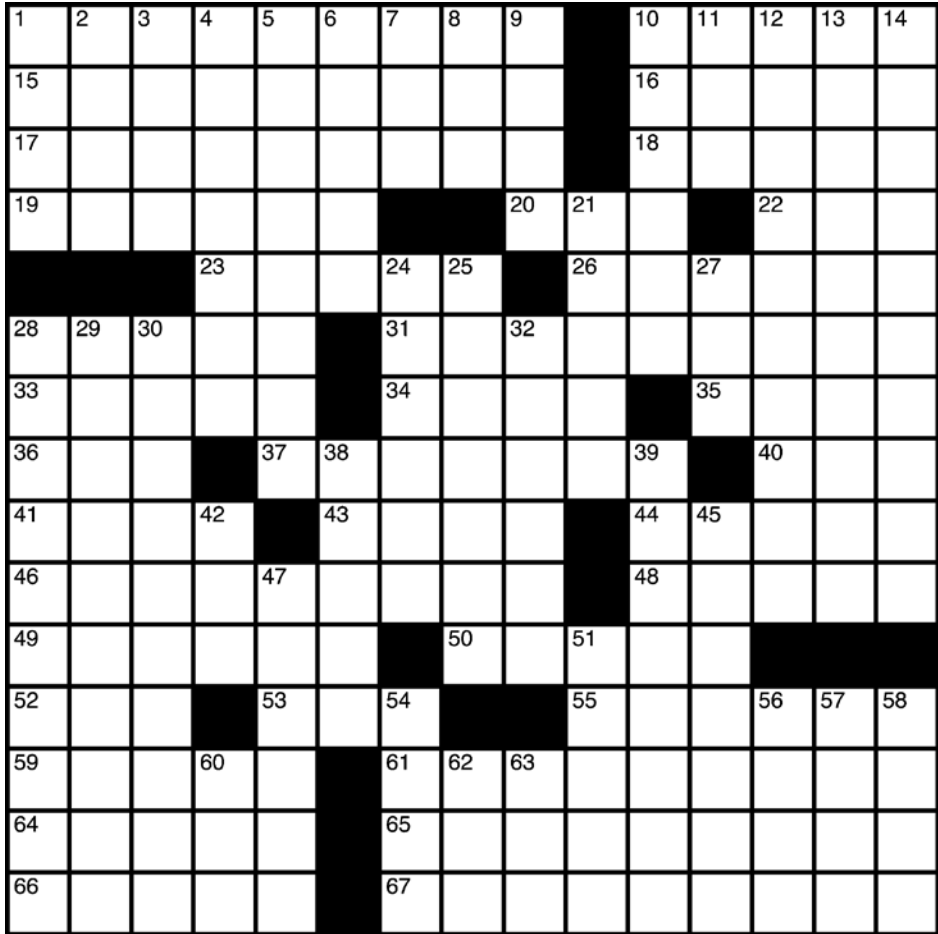

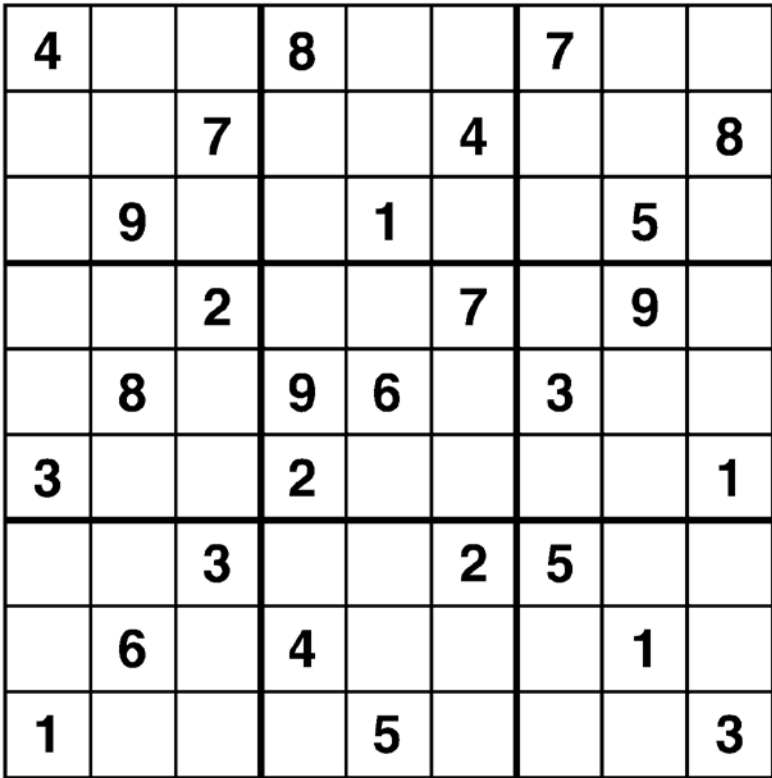
