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Stanley Cloud (Saul) is a former Washington Bureau Chief of *Time* Magazine and is the author (with his wife, Lynne Olson) of two non-fiction books, *The Murrow Boys* and *A Question of Honor*. He is also the author of a novel, *The Manhattan Well*, about Alexander Hamilton and Aaron Burr, and two plays, both of which have been presented by the Cosmos Theatre.

Ned Conquest Jonathan) did his graduate and post-graduate work at Princeton. He has written stories, plays and poems. His plays Gawain and the Widows Might were presented by the Cosmos Theatre. He has appeared in Lincoln and God, The Agony of David, Vandergrift, and Paul..

Dick DeCorps (Alich, Ensemble) sings with the New Dominion Chorale (Treasurer) and is choir director at St. John Church, McLean. This is his first role in one of Tony Gallo's plays. He is a retired Coast Guard airplane pilot

Norma Evenson (First Witch, ensemble) appeared in many of Tony Gallo's plays, *Lincoln and God* and *The Agony of David*. She has participated in several Cosmos Club theater group productions, and is the author of a historical drama titled, *A Work in Progress*, as well as an ensemble of short play titled *Murder She Re-Wrote*. She is Professor Emeritus at the University of California, Berkeley, and a Fellow of the American Society of Architectural Historians.

Tarpley Long (Michal, Ensemble) studied for an MFA at the University of Alabama. She is a graduate of Studio Theatre Acting Conservatory in Washington, D.C. Her most recent roles include *Far Away* and modern Russian plays at Studio Theatre. Military Academy faculty member. Ed received his Ph.D. in theoretical mathematics from The Ohio State University and is also the author of an award-winning novel, *Shadows On A Mirror*.

James McDaniel (David) has appeared in numerous community theaters in the Washington DC area and in Tidewater Virginia for over thirty years. He lives with his wife, Sherman, and two cats, Tux and Sergeant. He works during the day as an instructional systems designer at DAU

Bruce Smith (Samuel) "has appeared in Gilbert and Sullivan musicals, including *H.M.S. Pinafore* and *The Mikado*, as well as *The Man Who Came to Dinner*, *Our Town*, and experimental plays in New York City. He is the author of a short story, has written a movie script, and is also currently writing a biography of Lincoln Gordon, American statesman. He has appeared in six Tony Gallo plays

George Spencer (General Abner) is an attorney who has considerable experience in the performing arts, having appeared in numerous plays and sung with many groups, including the Paul Hill Chorale, the Washington Men's Camerata and the Washington Savoyards. His most recent appearance was in *Lincoln and God*, performed at the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church. George resides in McLean, Virginia and maintains offices with an intellectual property law firm in Arlington.

Beatrix Whitehall (Sound Design and Narrator) is new to the Seventh Street Playhouse, but has been involved with theater for over 30 years in innumerable productions, as actress, stage manager, technician, designer, and, recently, director. She is a founding member of the Greenbelt Arts Center and is currently on the Board of Thunderous Productions. Trix is a graduate of Harvard Law School, works as a public defender in Maryland, and performs Celtic music with the Homespun Ceilidh Band.

Harvey Zuckman(**Ensemble**) is a retired law professor who developed a penchant for writing short historical plays mostly set in his hometown of Minneapolis. All of the plays in what he calls his "Minneapolis Trilogy" have been performed by the Cosmos Club's drama group. He is pleased to be making his acting debut in Tony Gallo"s "Saul".

This premiere staged reading of *The Tragedy of King Saul* is the third in playwright **Anthony E. Gallo's** ('93) trilogy examining the lives of the first three kings of Israel. *The Agony of David* and *The Last Days of King Solomon* were staged at the Club in 2008 and 2006 respectively. Samuel 1 and 2, Chronicles, and Josephus are the basic sources of historical memory for all three plays.

Following 200 years of rule by judges or seers, the people of Israel demanded a king. God, speaking through Judge Samuel, warned against a kingship but eventually allowed the people to have their way. Saul was Israel's first king. The plays deals with Saul's tragic kingship. He attempts to maintain his power, but comes into conflict with God, the prophets, the powerful Judge Samuel, children Jonathan and Michal, and above all the young man who will eventually replace him: the multi-talented soldier, poet, musician, politician, and religious David. The ingredients of this play make for great drama: murder, betrayal, compassion and love, want of power, depression, father/son relationships, wars, and jealousy.

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Mr. Gallo is a playwright. screenwriter, librettist, and essayist whose fourteen copyrighted, published, and produced dramas include – in addition to the above trilogy – *Margherita*, *Eugenio*, *Better than the Best, Vandergrift!*, *Lincoln and*

God, Charleston Revisited, The Botticelli Cruise, Paul, The Springfield Boys, motion picture Charleston Revisited, and folk operas Lincoln and God and David. His portfolio consists of over seventy works. His plays have been staged 110 times in thirty venues in Washington, Maryland, Virginia, New York, Pennsylvania, and Massachusetts. He is also artistic director of the Seventh Street Playhouse and Eastern Market Studios. Margherita (premiered at the Cosmos Club in 2002) is under contract to Browne-Nederlander Productions in New York City.
