“I was hungry, and you gave me food”

Some of my absolute favorite ministry experiences have taken place on YouthWorks mission trips. I’ve been on fifteen of them, organizing trips to eight different communities, from New Orleans to Toronto. That’s one reason why I was so happy when Kathleen Bashem said she was interested in leading a group from our church on a YouthWorks mission trip. That will happen next July when we take a van full of excited youths to Indianapolis.

One of the things I like about YouthWorks is that there is always an excellent staff who arranges for us to serve with a variety of service partners. I’m already looking forward to next summer; it will be my third trip to Indianapolis. I wonder if we’ll go to Gleaners Food Bank of Indiana. Gleaners occupies a huge warehouse which provides food security to residents in 21 counties in central and southeastern Indiana. Gleaners doesn’t provide food directly to residents in need; rather, Gleaners provides food to local pantries and other ministries dedicated to feeding local residents.

I wonder if we’ll go to Westminster Neighborhood Services, which is one of those local food pantries benefitting from Gleaners. I remember one young man who, early in our mission trip, served at Gleaners, filling boxes with food to be shipped to local food pantries. The next day, he served at Westminster where he unloaded a delivery truck, and guess what: he unloaded the very same boxes he had filled the previous day at Gleaners. He then helped distribute the food to residents in need. He was thrilled because he got to see the ministry from beginning to end.

Most of my favorite ministries during these trips have been related to food. One of my favorites was Just One More in Milwaukee, which “recycled” food that was near expiration or which was left over from buffets and catering jobs. Again, like Gleaners, it was distributed to over 60 different agencies who feed the disadvantaged. Just One More “rescues” over 1.2 million pounds of food every year. And the people they hire have themselves been rescued from the streets.

A couple of weeks ago, I mentioned the Scott Mission in my sermon. That’s a ministry in Toronto which, at the time, fed 250 homeless men and women in two shifts every lunch hour. Some were down on their luck for the first time in their lives. Some were homeless because of mental illness. Others had been homeless so long that they didn’t know any other way of life. But they all had one thing in common: they were hungry.

Connecting with the Word

As a United Methodist Church, our worship is shaped by the Word of God. To that end, we often follow the Revised Common Lectionary which suggests four scripture lessons for each week. Here are the scriptures which are suggested for each Sunday this month. Please read them as part of your devotions in order to prepare your hearts for worship, whether in-person, on the radio, or on Facebook.

Sunday, November 1, All Saints Sunday

We will remember loved ones and church members who have entered the Church Triumphant over the past twelve months. If you lost a loved one since last All Saints Sunday, please give the name of your loved one to Pastor Dave so he might remember them during our communion liturgy. A bell will also toll in their memory. Pictures of Aledo UMC members who have died in the past year will also be included during the Great Thanksgiving. Scriptures will include Psalm 34; I John 3:1-3; and Matthew 5:1-12. Pastor Dave will be preaching a sermon entitled, "We've Got a Lot of Living to Do" from Revelation 7:9-17.

Sunday, November 8, Veterans' Sunday

We will be recognizing our Veterans during all three services on November 8. Pastor Dave will be preaching a sermon entitled, "The Sanctification of America." Scriptures include Exodus 19:3-8, Psalm 78; 1 Peter 2:4-10; and Matthew 25:1-13.

Sunday, November 15

Over the course of a month, the Revised Common Lectionary has suggested New Testament readings from 1 Thessalonians. Pastor Dave hasn't always included them because he has planned to give an overview of the book in a sermon entitled, "What's Missing from This Church?" In addition to 1 Thessalonians, scriptures include Judges 4:1-7; Psalm 76; and Matthew 25:14-30

Sunday, November 22

This is the last Sunday in the Christian calendar and it's known as Christ the King Sunday., Pastor Dave will be preaching, "How Do I Love Thee?" from Matthew 25:31-46. Other scriptures include Ezekiel 34:11-24; Psalm 100; and Ephesians 1:15-23.

Sunday, November 29, First Sunday in Advent

The First Sunday in Advent marks the beginning of the Christian New Year. Pastor Dave will be preaching "My First Apocalypse" from Mark 13:24-37. Other scriptures include Isaiah 64:1-9; Psalm 80; and 1 Corinthians 1:3-9.

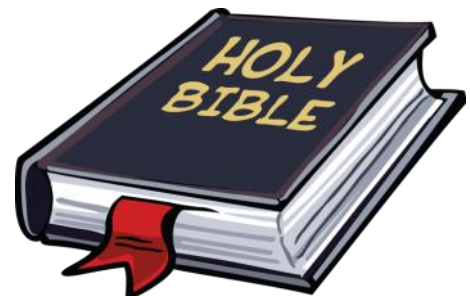
Guest Speaker
