PARISH NURSE NEWS

It's Your Day, Mother Earth!

Spring is a wonderful time to celebrate...new beginnings, fresh starts, and rejuvenation of what is old or used.

On April 22, Earth Day is celebrated with worldwide events, demonstrating support for environmental protection. Earth Day is the largest secular observance in the world, celebrated by more than a billion people every year, as a day of action that changes human behavior and provokes policy changes regarding the environment.

Now you may be wondering why the parish nurse is going all ecological on you. Earth Day is a reminder to all of us to care for our earth, for if our earth is ill, we too become ill.

Air pollution affects our lungs. Long term exposure to air pollution can cause cancer and damage the immune, neurological, reproductive and respiratory systems of the body. In extreme cases, it can even cause death.

Soil and water pollution poison our food sources, thus poisoning our bodies. Soil pollution occurs when soil contains chemicals that are toxic or otherwise dangerous for humans and other living things. Soil pollution may cause irreversible developmental damage in children, which in turn may lead to neurological problems. Humans of any age may also suffer kidney or liver damage, and cancer of the liver and leukemia.


One of the greatest dangers to human health is water pollution. After all, people can't survive without drinking water, and if their freshwater resources are polluted, they can become ill from drinking them. Different types of pollutants affect human health in different ways. Some of the most common illnesses caused by water pollution include Typhoid, Cholera, Dysentery, Polio, Hepatitis, Malaria, diarrhea, and even death.

Some water pollutants don't directly cause illness, but they do damage human health (and the health of other organisms) over the long term. These pollutants, called *chemical pollutants*, include manmade organic compounds that humans use to make pesticides, prescription drugs, plastics, and other products.

Noise and technology pollution stresses our minds. It's almost impossible to find complete peace and quiet. Even if you live deep in the countryside away from aircraft routes, traffic and building work, your home is probably filled with the buzz of computers and other modern appliances. The effect of environmen-

Watertown Food Pantry News

We really appreciate the many cash donations and the food we find in the cart. The Mission Commission has also been very generous in helping fund and support the food pantry and we thank the older kids for their ongoing 'Birthday Bag' project, now supported by direct donations from you kind folks. A simple thing like a birthday cake makes the day for someone who may not be able to afford much extra.

During the month of February we helped 80 families which were composed of 161 adults and 132 children. We still have several homeless people we help and many others are reporting significant cuts to their food stamps. We continue to add new families daily and currently have almost 380 names in our database as the need continues to grow. Everyone we serve is thankful for the help and usually say so. We have heard "God bless you" many, many times and want you to know that you are a part of this ministry whether you donate time, food, money, or prayers. It's always interesting at the food pantry. **Please consider** a donation or **volunteering** for an afternoon shift. Our open hours are Tuesdays and Fridays from 1-4 pm. We particularly need help on Friday afternoons and both shifts include stocking shelves, inventorying donations, etc., as well as helping our 'clients' pick out the food they need.

Our ongoing needs aside from monetary donations are: **toilet paper**, macaroni and cheese, corn bread/muffin mix, any canned **fruit** or vegetables, canned tuna/ham/chicken, boxed dinner mixes, instant mashed potatoes, **cereal** – almost anything to make a meal. (We are currently loaded with green beans but can use any other vegetable). All food items must be within their "fresh date" per Churches United regulations. We use some of the cash donations to buy fresh milk and eggs.

Again, thank you all for your support and prayers and please feel free to ask any of us questions you may have.
